
**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for SB 434 by Senate Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 434 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 434 would require requests for records that contain captured license plate data or that pertain to the location of an automated license plate recognition system submitted to a state or local law enforcement agency or governmental agency be directed to the state or local law enforcement agency or governmental agency that owns, leases, or contracts for the automated license plate recognition system. The bill would define “automated license plate recognition system” and “captured license plate data.” The bill would also add an exception for mandatory disclosure of public records of a public agency that contain captured license plate data or that pertain to the location of an automated license plate recognition system.

Both the Kansas Highway Patrol and the Department of Revenue indicate that enactment of SB 434 would not have a fiscal effect on the operations of either agency. The Office of Judicial Administration states enactment of SB 434 would not have a fiscal effect on Judicial Branch operations. The League of Kansas Municipalities states enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect on cities.
