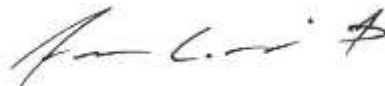
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 457 by Senate Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 457 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 457 would require a court to order a person charged with a felony to execute a waiver of extradition consenting to extradition to Kansas if such person is arrested in another state while on bond. The waiver would specify that such person waives all procedures incidental to extradition proceedings and would not be released prior to trial in any other state pending extradition to Kansas.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates that enactment of the bill would have a negligible fiscal effect that could be absorbed within existing resources. The Department of Corrections indicates enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 457 is not reflected in *The FY 2023 Governor's Budget Report*.
