1	AN ACT concerning wildlife; relating to lifetime hunting, fishing and
2	furharvester licenses; providing Kansas air or army national guard
3	veterans a lifetime license; amending K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 32-930 and
4	repealing the existing section.
5	
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
7	Section 1. K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 32-930 is hereby amended to read as
8	follows: 32-930. (a) (1) Except as provided in subsection (e)(e), the
9	secretary or the secretary's designee is authorized to issue to any Kansas
10	resident a lifetime fishing, hunting or furharvester or combination hunting
11	and fishing license upon:
12	(A) Proper application made therefor to the secretary or the
13	secretary's designee; and
14	(B) payment of a license fee as follows:
15	(1) (i) A total payment made at the time of purchase in the amount
16	prescribed pursuant to K.S.A. 32-988, and amendments thereto; or
17	(2) (ii) payment may be made over a two-year period in eight quarter-
18	annual installments in the amount prescribed pursuant to K.S.A. 32-988,
19	and amendments thereto.
20	(2) (A) If payment under paragraph (1) is in installments, the license
21	shall not be issued until the final installment has been paid.
22	(B) A person making installment payments shall not be required to
23	obtain the appropriate annual license, and each installment payment shall
24	be deemed to be such an annual license for a period of one year following
25	the date of the last installment payment made.
26	(C) If an installment payment is not received within 30 days after it is $(C)$
27	due and owing, the secretary may consider the payments in default and
28	may retain any payments previously received.
29	(b) Except as provided in subsection (e), the secretary or the
30	secretary's designee shall issue, free of charge, a lifetime combination
31	fishing, hunting and furharvester license to any Kansas resident who
32	submits to the secretary satisfactory proof that such resident is a Kansas
33	air or army national guard veteran who served for at least 20 years and
34	was honorably discharged.
35	(c) (1) Any lifetime license issued to a Kansas resident shall not be
36	made invalid by reason of the holder thereof subsequently residing outside

1 the state of Kansas.

2 (2) Any nonresident holder of a Kansas lifetime hunting—or, 3 combination hunting and fishing license *or combination fishing, hunting* 4 *and furharvester license* shall be eligible under the same conditions as a 5 Kansas resident for a big game or wild turkey permit upon proper 6 application to the secretary.

7 (3) Any nonresident holder of a lifetime fishing license issued before 8 July 1, 1989, shall be eligible under the same conditions as a Kansas 9 resident for a big game or wild turkey permit upon proper application to 10 the secretary.

11 (b)(d) For the purposes of subsection subsections (a), (b) and (c), the 12 term "resident" shall have the meaning means the same as defined in 13 K.S.A. 32-701, and amendments thereto, except that a person shall have 14 maintained that person's place of permanent abode in this state for a period 15 of not less than one year immediately preceding the person's application 16 for a lifetime fishing, hunting or furharvester or combination hunting and 17 fishing license.

18 (e)(e) (1) Upon request of the secretary for children and families, the 19 secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism shall not issue a lifetime-fishing, 20 hunting or furharvester or combination hunting and fishing license to an 21 applicant *under this section* except as provided in this subsection. The 22 secretary for children and families may make such a request if, at the time 23 of the request, the applicant:

(A) Owed arrearages under a support order in a title IV-D case being
 administered by the secretary for children and families;

(B) had outstanding a warrant or subpoena, directed to the applicant,
in a title IV-D case being administered by the secretary for children and
families;

(C) owes arrearages under a support order, as reported to thesecretary for children and families by the court trustee; or

(D) has failed, after appropriate notice, to comply with a subpoena
 directed to the individual by the court trustee as reported to the secretary
 for children and families by the court trustee.

(2) Upon receiving a release from an authorized agent of the secretary
for children and families or the court trustee, the secretary of wildlife,
parks and tourism may issue the *applicable* lifetime fishing, hunting or
furharvester or combination hunting and fishing license. The applicant
shall have the burden of obtaining and delivering the release.

39 (3) The secretary for children and families shall issue a release upon40 request if, as appropriate:

41 (A) The arrearages are paid in full or a tribunal of competent 42 jurisdiction has determined that no arrearages are owed;

43 (B) an income withholding order has been served upon the applicant's

1 current employer or payor;

2 (C) an agreement has been completed or an order has been entered
3 setting minimum payments to defray the arrearages, together with receipt
4 of the first minimum payment;

5 (D) the applicant has complied with the warrant or subpoena or the 6 warrant or subpoena has been quashed or withdrawn; or

7 (E) the court trustee notifies the secretary for children and families 8 that the applicant has paid the arrearages in full or has complied with the 9 subpoena or the subpoena has been quashed or withdrawn.

10 (d)(f) (1) Upon request of the secretary for children and families, the secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism shall suspend-a, as provided in this 11 subsection, any lifetime fishing, hunting or furharvester or combination 12 hunting and fishing license issued to a licensee as provided in this 13 14 subsection under this section. The secretary for children and families may 15 make such a request if, at the time of the request, the applicant owed 16 arrearages under a support order or had outstanding a warrant or subpoena 17 as stated in subsection  $\frac{(e)}{(e)}(1)$ .

(2) Upon receiving a release from an authorized agent of the secretary
 for children and families or the court trustee, the secretary of wildlife,
 parks and tourism may reinstate the *applicable* lifetime fishing, hunting or
 furharvester or combination hunting and fishing
 have the burden of obtaining and delivering the release.

23 (3) The secretary for children and families shall issue a release upon 24 request if the requirements of subsection (e)(e)(3) are met.

25 (e)(g) Nothing in subsection (e)(e) or (d)(f) shall be construed to 26 require or permit the secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism to determine 27 any issue related to a child support order or related to the title IV-D case 28 including to resolve questions of mistaken identity or determine the 29 adequacy of any notice relating to subsection (e)(e) or (d)(f) that the 30 secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism provides to the applicant.

31 (f)(h) "Title IV-D" means part D of title IV of the federal social
32 security act, 42 U.S.C. § 651 et seq., as in effect on December 31, 2001,
33 relating to child support enforcement services.

(g)(i) The secretary, in accordance with K.S.A. 32-805, and amendments thereto, may adopt rules and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

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Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 32-930 is hereby repealed.
