AN ACT concerning law enforcement; relating to automated license plate recognition systems; requiring each law enforcement agency that utilizes such systems to adopt and maintain a detailed, written policy relating to the use and operation of such systems; prescribing restrictions and requirements relating to the collection, storage and sharing of captured license plate data; criminal penalties for unlawful acts relating to such data.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) (1) Law enforcement agencies may collect captured license plate data as provided in this section. Such data shall be stored immediately upon collection and accessed only for a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

- (2) Captured license plate data shall not be sold, shared, disclosed or otherwise distributed for a commercial purpose. This provision shall not prohibit the use of automated license plate recognition systems by an individual or private legal entity for lawful purposes.
- (3) Law enforcement agencies may exchange or share captured license plate data with other law enforcement agencies for a legitimate law enforcement purpose.
- (b) (1) Nothing in this section shall be construed to preclude a law enforcement agency from contracting with a person to store and securely maintain captured license plate data on behalf of such law enforcement agency.
- (2) Such person shall be subject to the policies of the law enforcement agency as defined in this section.
- (3) Such storage shall be compliant with accepted data security standards as used by the law enforcement agency.
- (c) Each law enforcement agency that utilizes an automated license plate recognition system shall adopt and maintain a detailed, written policy relating to the use and operation of such system. Such policy shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- (1) A specified retention period of captured license plate data not to exceed 60 months after being originally collected unless such data is:
- (A) Relevant and material to an ongoing criminal investigation and subject to a preservation request by a law enforcement agency; or

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(B) the subject of a warrant, subpoena or court order;

- (2) defined requirements for law enforcement agency employees to gain access or query captured license plate data gathered by an automated license plate recognition system;
- (3) the designation of an automated license plate recognition system administrator to be the point of contact on behalf of the law enforcement agency;
- (4) an audit process to ensure that information obtained through the use of an automated license plate recognition system is used only for legitimate law enforcement purposes; and
- (5) procedures regarding the proper training of automated license plate recognition system operators and all law enforcement agency staff who have access to captured license plate data.
- (d) Any searches performed or alerts established by a law enforcement agency related to an automated license plate recognition system shall contain a legitimate, specified and documented law enforcement purpose.
- (e) (1) It is unlawful for any person to knowingly use, obtain or attempt to obtain captured license plate data of a law enforcement agency under false pretenses or for any purpose other than for a legitimate law enforcement purpose.
 - (2) Violation of this subsection is a class C nonperson misdemeanor.
- (f) Captured license plate data shall be confidential and shall not be subject to the provisions of the Kansas open records act, K.S.A. 45-215 et seq., and amendments thereto. The provisions of this subsection shall expire on July 1, 2026, unless the legislature reviews and reenacts this provision pursuant to K.S.A. 45-229, and amendments thereto, prior to July 1, 2026.
 - (g) As used in this section:
- (1) "Automated license plate recognition system" means one or more high-speed cameras combined with computer algorithms used to convert images of license plates into computer readable data;
- (2) "captured license plate data" means the global positioning device coordinates, date and time, photograph, license plate number and any other data captured by or derived from an automated license plate recognition system;
- (3) "commercial purpose" means the use of a record or records, or information derived from records, in any form for sale, resale or solicitation or advertisement for sales or services;
- (4) "law enforcement agency" means a public agency that employs a law enforcement officer as defined in K.S.A. 74-5602, and amendments thereto;
 - (5) "legitimate law enforcement purpose" means the investigation or

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detection of any criminal offense or any search or alert related to an

- endangered or missing person initiated by a law enforcement agency; and
 (6) "person" means an individual, corporation, company, partnership,
 firm, association, joint venture or any other unincorporated association or group.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
