### **SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2474**

As Recommended by House Committee on Judiciary

### **Brief\***

HB 2474 would amend law governing name changes during a divorce to allow the court to change a spouse's name to a name other than the spouse's maiden name or former name and to give the court jurisdiction to make such a change at or after the time the decree of divorce becomes final.

[Note: Currently, statute allows the court to order the restoration of the spouse's maiden or former name.]

# **Background**

The bill was introduced by Representatives Highberger and Neelly.

# House Committee on Judiciary

In the House Committee hearing on January 18, 2022, a private citizen and a Douglas County District Court judge testified as **proponents**, stating the bill would save personal and judicial resources and provide a safety measure for victims of domestic violence. Representatives of the Kansas Bar Association and the Kansas Coalition Against Sexual and Domestic Violence provided written-only proponent testimony. No other testimony was provided.
