Agency Estimate

The **agency** estimates revised FY 2022 expenditures of \$354,551, all from the Veterinary Examiners Fee Fund. This is an increase of \$18,580, or 5.5 percent, above the FY 2022 approved amount. This increase is primarily caused by the agency's five supplemental requests for bonuses for investigators and increased costs for attorney fees, rent, travel, and office supplies. The increase is also caused by increased expenditures for group health insurance for the new Executive Director and new Administrative Assistant.

Governor's Recommendation

The **Governor** recommends FY 2022 expenditures of \$339,745, all from the Veterinary Examiners Fee Fund. This is a decrease of \$14,806, or 4.2 percent, below the agency's FY 2022 revised estimate. This decrease is due to the Governor not recommending the agency's supplemental requests for bonuses for investigators and increased costs for attorney fees, rent, travel, and office supplies.

Senate Committee on Transparency and Ethics

The **Committee on Transparency and Ethics** concurs with the Governor's recommendation in FY 2022 with the following adjustments:

- 1. Add \$4,250, all from the Veterinary Examiners Fee Fund, for attorney fees in FY 2022. The agency transitioned from utilizing the Office of the Attorney General for legal services to a contracted attorney.
- 2. Add \$2,400, all from the Veterinary Examiners Fee Fund, for rent and utilities in FY 2022. The agency estimates an increase in rent of \$300. At its previous location, the agency did not pay utilities. To pay for utilities at its new location, the agency estimates \$2,100.
- Add \$2,606, all from the Veterinary Examiners Fee Fund, for other contractual services in FY 2022. Of this amount, \$1,700 is budgeted for increased travel expenditures for new Board members who must travel farther than previous Board members. The agency estimates increased expenditures for its contract with the Office of Information Technology Services and other communication costs, creating an increase of \$906.

Agency Estimate
