AN ACT concerning medical scholarships and loans; concerning medically underserved areas; amending K.S.A. 65-2811a, 74-3247, 743269, 76 376, 76-379, 76-383 76-385 and 76-384 and K.S.A. 2000
Supp. 74-3266 and, 74-32,132, 76-375 and 76-381 and repealing the
existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 76-373, 76-374, 76-376, 76-377
and 76-377a.

17 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

18 Section 1. K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 76-375 is hereby amended to read as 19 follows: 76-375. (a) On or before December 31 in each year, the chan-20 cellor of the university of Kansas, or the designee of the chancellor sec-21 retary of health and environment, shall prepare a list of the areas of this 22 state which the chancellor, or designee of the chancellor, secretary de-23 termines to be critically medically underserved areas by specialty and the 24 areas of this state which the chancellor, or designee of the chancellor, 25 secretary determines to be medically underserved areas by specialty. In 26 preparing such a list the chancellor, or designee of the chancellor, shall 27 consult with the medical scholarship advisory committee. All state med-28 ical care facilities or institutions, all medical centers operated in the state 29 of Kansas by the veterans administration of the United States, and all full-30 time faculty positions at the university of Kansas school of medicine in 31 family medicine or family practice are qualified for service in both service 32 commitment area I and service commitment area II without being de-33 termined medically underserved areas. In preparing such a list, the portion of time of persons engaged in the practice of medicine and surgery 34 35 at any institution under the jurisdiction and control of the secretary of social and rehabilitation services shall not be included in determining 36 37 whether an area is critically medically underserved or medically underserved. Every such list shall note that all state medical care facilities or 38 39 institutions qualify for such service commitments, in addition to listing 40 those areas determined to be critically medically underserved or medi-41 cally underserved. Critically medically underserved areas by specialty and 42 medically underserved areas by specialty Medically underserved areas

43 established prior to the effective date of this act by the secretary of health

1 and environment chancellor of the university of Kansas, or the designee 2 of the chancellor, shall continue in effect for the purposes of this act until 3 changed by the chancellor of the university of Kansas, or the designee of 4 the chancellor secretary of health and environment. The chancellor of the 5 university of Kansas, or the designee of the chancellorsecretary of health 6 and environment, upon a finding of exceptional circumstances, may mod-7 ify areas or portions of areas determined to be critically medically un-8 derserved or medically underserved by specialty. 9 (b) (1) A service commitment area shall be designated as a service 10 commitment area I or a service commitment area II. Service commitment 11 area I shall be any area determined by the chancellor of the university of 12 Kansas, or the designee of the chancellor, secretary of health and envi-13 ronment under subsection (a) to be, for purposes of all agreements en-14 tered into under K.S.A. 76 374 and amendments thereto, a medically 15 underserved area or a critically medically underserved area. Service com-16 mitment area II shall be, for purposes of all agreements entered into 17 under K.S.A. 76 374 and amendments thereto, the state of Kansas. 18 (2) The service commitment area I or II for persons first awarded 19 scholarships after December 31, 1985, shall be an incorporated city of 20 this state as specified in subsection (d)(2) of K.S.A. 76 374 and amend-21 ments thereto of less than 12,000 population based upon the most current 22 legal census excluding any such incorporated cities located in Wyandotte, 23 Johnson, Sedgwick or Shawnee counties, all state medical care facilities 24 or institutions, all medical centers operated in the state of Kansas by the 25 veterans administration of the United States, and the full time faculty 26 positions at the university of Kansas school of medicine in general internal 27 medicine, general pediatrics, family medicine or family practice, except 28 that, at the time any person commences satisfying a service commitment 29 under this subsection as a full time faculty member, the number of per-30 sons satisfying service commitments or service obligations, pursuant to 31 agreements under K.S.A. 76 374 and amendments thereto or the medical 32 student loan act, as full time faculty members pursuant to this subsection 33 shall not exceed the number equal to 25% of the total number of full-34 time faculty members of the university of Kansas school of medicine in 35 general internal medicine, general pediatrics, family medicine or family 36 practice. 37 (c) In selecting a service commitment area I or II, whichever is ap-38 plicable, prior to the commencement of the full time practice of medicine 39 and surgery pursuant to all agreements entered into under K.S.A. 76 374 40

and amendments thereto requiring service for a period of time in a service
 commitment area I or II, whichever is applicable, the person so selecting

42 shall select such area from among those areas appearing on the list of

43 areas prepared by the chancellor of the university of Kansas, or the des-

1 ignee of the chancellor, secretary of health and environment under this 2 section. The service commitment area selected shall have appeared on 3 any such list not more than 36 months prior to the commencement of 4 such full time practice of medicine and surgery by the person selecting 5 such service commitment area. Upon the selection of such service com-6 mitment area, the person so selecting shall inform the university of Kansas 7 school of medicine of the area selected. 8 -(d) A person serving in a service commitment area I or II, whichever 9 is applicable, pursuant to any an agreement under this act may serve all 10 or part of any commitment in the service commitment area initially se-11 lected by such person. If such person moves from one service commit-12 ment area I or II to another service commitment area I or II, as appli-13 cable, such person shall notify the university of Kansas school of medicine 14 appropriate entity as provided by law of such person's change of service 15 commitment area. Service in any such service commitment area I or II, 16 as applicable, selected from the appropriate lists of service commitment 17 areas, shall be deemed to be continuous for the purpose of satisfying any 18 agreement entered into under this act. Any service commitment area I 19 or II, as applicable, selected after the initially selected service commit-20 ment area I or II shall have appeared on a service commitment area I list 21 or on a service commitment area II list, as applicable, which shall have 22 been prepared not more than 12 months prior to the move by such person 23 from one service commitment area I or II to another service commitment 24 area I or II, as applicable. 25 - (e) (1) A person awarded a scholarship prior to January 1, 1986, may 26 satisfy the obligation to engage in the full time practice of medicine and 27 surgery in a service commitment area I even though such person is en-28 gaged in such practice in two or more locations within the state of Kansas, 29 at least one of which is not located in a service commitment area I, if the 30 person is engaged in the full time practice of medicine and surgery in 31 such locations pursuant to a practice affiliation agreement approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas, or the designee of the 32 33 chancellor. 34 (2) A person awarded a scholarship prior to January 1, 1986, may 35 satisfy the obligation to engage in the full time practice of medicine and 36 surgery in either service commitment area I or service commitment area 37 II by performing at least 100 hours per month of on site primary care as 38 defined in K.S.A. 76 374 and amendments thereto at a medical facility 39 operated by a local health department or nonprofit organization in this 40 state serving medically indigent persons. As used in this paragraph, "med-

41 ically indigent" means a person: (A) Who is unable to secure health care

42 because of inability to pay for all or a part of the costs thereof due to

43 inadequate personal resources, being uninsured, being underinsured, be-

ing ineligible for governmental health benefits; or (B) who is eligible for 1 2 governmental benefits but is unable to obtain medical services. 3 (3) A person awarded a scholarship prior to January 1, 1986, may satisfy the obligation to engage in the full time practice of medicine and 4 5 surgery in either service commitment area I or II by engaging in such 6 full time practice of medicine and surgery, other than in a primary care 7 specialty, anywhere in the state of Kansas with the exception of the fol-8 lowing counties: Douglas, Johnson, Leavenworth, Sedgwick, Shawnee or 9 Wyandotte, except that the full time practice of medicine and surgery 10 within the six listed counties will qualify if the selected county is desig-11 nated as a service commitment area I or II in accordance with the pro-12 visions of this section, or whenever there are fewer than three persons 13 engaged in the full time practice of medicine and surgery in a designated 14 specialty in the selected county. Any person who satisfies the obligation 15 to engage in the full time practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with this subsection (e)(3) shall remain obligated to repay the amounts 16 17 received for living expenses as prescribed in subsection (a)(5) of K.S.A. 18 75 376 and amendments thereto. As used in this subsection (e)(3), "pri-19 mary care" means general pediatrics, general internal medicine or family 20 practice. 21 (f) A person awarded a scholarship in accordance with the provisions 22 of K.S.A. 76 373 through 76 377a and amendments thereto may satisfy 23 the obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery, under 24 an agreement entered into pursuant to K.S.A. 76 374 and amendments 25 thereto even though such person is engaged in practice in an area not 26 designated a medically underserved area by specialty, or a critically med-27 ically underserved area by specialty, through employment on a part time 28 basis by the state of Kansas which has been approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas, or the designee of the chancellor, for the 29 30 practice of medicine and surgery at any state medical care facility or 31 institution. 32 (g) In connection with the determination of critically medically un-33 derserved areas and medically underserved areas under this section, the 34 chancellor of the university of Kansas, or the designee of the chancellor, 35 shall assess annually the need in the state as a whole for medical services 36 provided by persons engaged in the practice of medicine and surgery and 37 shall report thereon annually to the legislature. Each report shall include any recommendations for needed legislation, including any recom-38 39 mended amendments to this act, which relate to the need for such med-

40 ical services in the various areas of this state.

41 (h) There is hereby established the medical scholarship advisory com-

42 mittee. Members of the medical scholarship advisory committee shall be

43 appointed by the chancellor of the university of Kansas as follows: (1)

One member shall be from the office of the chancellor of the university 1 2 of Kansas; (2) one member shall be a representative of the Kansas medical 3 society; (3) one member shall be a member of the Kansas legislature; (4) one member shall be a student at the university of Kansas school of med-4 5 icine; and (5) one member shall be a representative of the Kansas hospital 6 association. The medical scholarship advisory committee shall meet pe 7 riodically upon the call of the chancellor, or the designee of the chancel-8 lor, and shall make recommendations to the chancellor, or the designee 9 of the chancellor, in regard to the administration of the provisions of this 10 act.

(i) The chancellor of the university of Kansas may appoint a medical
 scholarship program coordinator for the purpose of planning and admin istering the provisions of this act. The coordinator shall be in the unclas sified service under the Kansas civil service act.

15 -(j) For all purposes under this section, service or employment after 16 June 30, 1988, on a part time basis (1) pursuant to a practice affiliation 17 agreement approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas, or the 18 chancellor's designee, or (2) at a state medical care facility or institution, 19 shall be on the basis of at least the equivalent of 1/2 time in order to satisfy 20 the obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery under 21 an agreement entered into pursuant to K.S.A. 76 374 and amendments 22 thereto.

23 (k) (c) As used in this section, "state medical care facility or institu-24 tion" includes, but is not limited to, the Kansas state school for the visually 25 handicapped, the Kansas state school for the deaf, any institution under 26 the secretary of social and rehabilitation services, as defined by subsection 27 (b) of K.S.A. 76 12a01 and amendments thereto, any institution under 28 the commissioner of juvenile justice, as defined by K.S.A. 38 1602, and 29 amendments thereto, the Kansas soldiers' home, the Kansas veterans' 30 home and any correctional institution under the secretary of corrections, 31 as defined by subsection (d) of K.S.A. 75 5202 and amendments thereto, 32 but shall not include any state educational institution under the state 33 board of regents, as defined by subsection (a) of K.S.A. 76 711 and 34 amendments thereto, except as specifically provided by statute. 35 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 76 376 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76 376. 36 (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in paragraphs (2) through (9) of this 37 subsection (a) or in K.S.A. 76 377 and amendments thereto, upon the 38 failure of any person to satisfy the obligation to engage in the full time 39 practice of medicine and surgery within the appropriate service commit-40 ment area of this state for the required period of time under any agree

41 ment entered into pursuant to K.S.A. 76 373 through 76 377a, and

42 amendments thereto, such person shall repay to the university of Kansas

43 school of medicine an amount equal to the total of (A) the amount of

1 money received by such person pursuant to such agreement, or the 2 amount of money determined under rules and regulations of the univer-3 sity of Kansas plus (B) annual interest at a rate of 10%, if the agreement 4 was entered into prior to January 1, 1982, 15%, if the agreement was entered into after December 31, 1981, from the date such money was 5 6 received.

7 (2) Any person first awarded a scholarship after December 31, 1985, 8 who fails to apply for and enter an approved three year primary care 9 postgraduate residency training program shall be required to repay all 10 moneys received pursuant to an agreement entered into for any such 11 scholarship, plus accumulated interest at an annual rate of 15% within 90 12 days of graduation from the school of medicine, or termination or com-13 pletion of a residency training program which does not comply with the 14 provisions of this section, whichever occurs later.

15 (3) If a person fails to satisfy an obligation to engage in the full time 16 practice of medicine and surgery within a service commitment area I for 17 the required period of time under an agreement entered into pursuant 18 to K.S.A. 76 373 through 76 377a, and amendments thereto, but is en-19 gaged in the full time practice of medicine and surgery within this state 20 in a service commitment area II which would have applied to such person 21 had such person received a type II scholarship under an agreement en-22 tered into pursuant to K.S.A. 76 373 through 76 377a, and amendments 23 thereto, and if the chancellor of the university of Kansas, or the designee 24 of the chancellor, finds that exceptional circumstances caused the failure 25 of such person to engage in such practice in a service commitment area 26 I, such person shall not be required to repay the amount of money re-27 ceived by such person for up to 50% of tuition fees pursuant to such 28 agreement. 29 (4) If a person fails to satisfy an obligation to engage in the full time

30 practice of medicine and surgery in Kansas for the required period of 31 time under an agreement entered into pursuant to K.S.A. 76-373 through 32 76-377a, and amendments thereto, because such person is engaged in the 33 full time practice of medicine and surgery in a state other than Kansas 34 and if such person is subject to or currently making repayments under 35 this section and if such person subsequently commences the practice of 36 medicine and surgery in this state which complies with the agreements 37 entered into under such statutes, the balance of the repayment amount, 38 including interest thereon, from the time of such commencement of prac-39 tice until the obligation of such person is satisfied, or until the time such 40 person again becomes subject to repayments, shall be waived. All repay-41 ment amounts due prior to such commencement of practice in this state, 42 including interest thereon, shall continue to be payable as provided in

43 this section. If subsequent to such commencement of practice, the person

1 fails to satisfy such obligation, the person again shall be subject to repay-2 ments, including interest thereon, as otherwise provided in this section. 3 (5) Any person awarded a type I scholarship prior to January 1, 1986, 4 who is satisfying the obligation to engage in the full time practice of med-5 icine and surgery in a service commitment area I by complying with the 6 provisions of subsection (e)(3) of K.S.A. 76 375 and amendments thereto 7 and who except for the provisions of such section (c)(3) would not oth 8 erwise be eligible to satisfy such obligation in the area in which such 9 person is engaged in the full time practice of medicine and surgery shall 10 repay all moneys received by the person pursuant to the type I scholarship 11 for living expenses, including interest thereon as otherwise provided in 12 this section, in accordance with the repayment schedule established for 13 the purposes of this paragraph by the chancellor of the university of 14 Kansas. 15 (6) If, during the time a person is satisfying the service requirement 16 of an agreement entered into pursuant to K.S.A. 76 373 through 76 377a,

17 and amendments thereto, such person desires to engage in less than the 18 full time practice of medicine and surgery within the appropriate service 19 commitment area of the state and remain in satisfaction of such service 20 requirement, such person may make application to the chancellor of the 21 university of Kansas or the designee of the chancellor for permission to 22 engage in less than such full time practice of medicine and surgery. Upon 23 a finding of exceptional circumstances made by the chancellor of the 24 university of Kansas, or the designee of the chancellor, such person may 25 be authorized to engage in less than the full time practice of medicine 26 and surgery within the appropriate service commitment area of the state 27 for the remaining required period of time under such agreement and for 28 an additional period of time which shall be equal to the length of the 29 originally required period of time multiplied by the decimal fraction 30 which is equal to the reduction of the full time practice of medicine and 31 surgery to be authorized hereunder, multiplied by two. In any such de-32 termination of the period required to be engaged in the less than full-33 time practice of medicine and surgery, the decimal fraction utilized shall 34 not exceed .5 and any person granted permission to engage in less than 35 the full time practice of medicine and surgery in accordance with the 36 provisions of this paragraph (6) shall be required to engage in at least the 37 half time practice of medicine and surgery. 38 (7) Any person first awarded a scholarship after December 31, 1985,

39 who enters but fails to complete an approved three year primary care

40 postgraduate residency training program, or who enters and completes

41 an approved three year primary care postgraduate residency training pro-

42 gram but fails to satisfy the obligation to engage in the full time practice

43 of medicine and surgery within the appropriate service commitment area

of this state for the required period of time shall be required to repay all
 money received pursuant to an agreement entered into for any such schol arship, plus accumulated interest at an annual rate of 15% within 90 days
 of failure to complete an approved residency or 90 days of failure to
 commence qualifying practice, whichever occurs first. This provision shall
 apply only to agreements entered into from and after the effective date
 of this act.

8 - (8) Any person who was satisfying such person's obligation to engage 9 in the full time practice of medicine and surgery within the appropriate 10 service commitment area of the state for the required period of time 11 under any agreement entered into pursuant to K.S.A. 76 373 through 76-12 376 and amendments thereto, by practicing in the specialty of emergency 13 medicine at Memorial Hospital in Topeka, Kansas, may satisfy the re-14 mainder of such person's obligation to engage in the full time practice of 15 medicine and surgery by practicing in a critically medically underserved area in the specialty of emergency medicine. 16

17 (9) Any person who was first awarded a type I scholarship prior to 18 January 1, 1986, who has completed an approved three year primary care 19 postgraduate residency training program in pediatrics, who is employed 20 as a clinical assistant professor in the department of pediatrics and as 21 director of the sexual abuse program at the university of Kansas medical 22 center on at least a 55% full time equivalent basis and who provides on-23 call services 24 hours per day for sexual abuse evaluations and consulta-24 tions and administrative decisions, may satisfy the remainder of such per-25 son's obligation to engage in the full time practice of medicine and 26 surgery in a service commitment area I by continuing to provide such 27 services in such capacities on at least a 55% full-time equivalent basis with 28 the university of Kansas medical center, and such person shall be credited 29 for such service against the annual obligation of such person under agree 30 ments entered into pursuant to K.S.A. 76 373 through 76 377a, and 31 amendments thereto, at the percentage rate of the full time equivalent 32 employment of such person as determined by the chancellor of the uni-33 versity of Kansas for each year such person qualifies under this subsection. 34 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, if the person first 35 entered into an agreement under K.S.A. 76-374 and amendments thereto 36 prior to January 1, 1982, the person shall make 10 equal annual install-37 ment payments totaling the entire amount to be repaid under all such 38 agreements for which such obligations are not satisfied, including all 39 amounts of interest at the rate prescribed. 40 - (c) If the person first entered into an agreement under K.S.A. 76 374

41 and amendments thereto after December 31, 1981, the person shall repay

42 an amount totaling the entire amount to be repaid under all such agree-

43 ments for which such obligations are not satisfied, including all amounts

of interest at the rate prescribed. Except as otherwise provided in this section, such repayment shall be in installment payments and each such installment shall be not less than the amount equal to ½ of the total amount which would be required to be paid if repaid in five equal annual installments.

6 (d) All installment payments under this section shall commence six 7 months after the date of the action or circumstance that causes the failure 8 of the person to satisfy the obligations of such agreements, as determined 9 by the university of Kansas school of medicine based upon the circum-10 stances of each individual case. In all cases where the person first entered 11 into an agreement under K.S.A. 76 374 and amendments thereto after 12 December 31, 1981, if an installment payment becomes 91 days overdue, 13 the entire amount outstanding shall become immediately due and paya-

14 ble, including all amounts of interest at the rate prescribed. 15 -(e) The total repayment obligation imposed under all agreements entered into under K.S.A. 76-374 and amendments thereto may be satisfied 16 17 at any time by any person who first entered into an agreement under such 18 statute prior to January 1, 1982, and at any time prior to graduation from 19 the university of Kansas school of medicine by any persons who first 20 entered into an agreement under such statute after December 31, 1981, 21 by making a single lump sum payment equal to the total of (1) the entire 22 amount to be repaid under all such agreements upon failure to satisfy the 23 obligations under such agreements to practice in Kansas, plus (2) all 24 amounts of interest thereon at the rate prescribed to the date of payment. 25 (f) There is hereby created in the state treasury the medical schol-26 arship and loan repayment fund. The university of Kansas school of med-27 icine shall remit all moneys received under this section to the state trea-28 surer at least monthly. Upon receipt of each such remittance the state 29 treasurer shall deposit the entire amount thereof in the state treasury, 30 and such amount shall be credited to the medical scholarship and loan 31 repayment fund. All expenditures from the medical scholarship and loan 32 repayment fund shall be for scholarships awarded under K.S.A. 76 373 33 through 76 377a and amendments thereto, for medical student loans un-34 der the medical student loan act, for payment of the salary of the medical 35 scholarship program coordinator and for the expenses of administration 36 of K.S.A. 76 373 through 76 377a and amendments thereto and the med-37 ical student loan act and shall be made in accordance with appropriation 38 acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant 39 to vouchers approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas or by 40 a person designated by the chancellor. On the effective date of this act, 41 the director of accounts and reports shall transfer all moneys in the med-42 ical scholarship and loan repayment fund to the medical scholarship and 43 loan repayment fund. On the effective date of this act, all liabilities of the

1 medical scholarship and loan repayment fund are hereby imposed on the 2 medical scholarship and loan repayment fund and the medical scholarship 3 and loan repayment fund is hereby abolished. Whenever the medical scholarship and loan repayment fund, or words of like effect, is referred 4 to or designated by any statute, contract or other document, such refer-5 ence or designation shall be deemed to apply to the medical scholarship 6 7 and loan repayment fund.

8 Sec. 3. 2. K.S.A. 76-379 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-9 379. Any person awarded a scholarship in accordance with the provisions 10 of K.S.A. 76-373 through 76-377a and amendments thereto may satisfy 11 any obligation to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery under 12 any agreement entered into pursuant to K.S.A. 76 374 and amendments 13 thereto by engaging in the full time practice of medicine and surgery in 14 a service commitment area, as defined by subsection (c) of K.S.A. 76 381, 15 in lieu of an appropriate service commitment as otherwise required under 16 K.S.A. 76 373 through 76 377a and amendments thereto, but in accord-17 ance with and subject to the other conditions and requirements pre-18 scribed under those statutes, except that any such person, who also enters 19 into a medical student loan agreement under the medical student loan 20 act and who has not commenced the required primary care postgraduate 21 residency training program on the effective date of this act, may satisfy 22 the requirement to enter and complete an approved three-year primary 23 care residency training program under any such agreement by entering 24 and completing an approved postgraduate residency training program as 25 defined by subsection (b) of K.S.A. 76-381. The provisions of this section 26 shall apply only to residency training and the practice of medicine and 27 surgery commenced on or after the effective date of this act.

Sec. 4. 3. K.S.A. 76-383 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-28 29 383. A medical student loan agreement entered into by the university of 30 Kansas school of medicine and an undergraduate student enrolled in or 31 admitted to the university of Kansas school of medicine in a course of 32 instruction leading to the degree of doctor of medicine for the purpose 33 of receiving a medical student loan under this act shall require that the person receiving the loan: 34

35 (a) Complete the required course of instruction and receive the de-36 gree of doctor of medicine and apply for, enter and complete an approved 37 postgraduate residency training program;

apply for and obtain a license to practice medicine and surgery in 38 (b) 39 Kansas;

40 engage in the full-time practice of medicine and surgery for a (c) 41 period of 12 months within a service commitment area, except as other-42 wise provided in subsection (c) of K.S.A. 76-384 for service as a full-time

43 faculty member of the university of Kansas school of medicine in family

1 medicine or family practice;

2 (d) commence such full-time practice of medicine and surgery within 3 nine months after completion of an approved postgraduate residency 4 training program and licensure in a service commitment area and con-5 tinue such full-time practice in such service commitment area for a con-6 secutive period of months equal to the total number of months required 7 under the agreement;

8 (e) agree that the service commitment for each agreement entered
9 into under this act is in addition to the service commitment contained in
10 any other agreement which has been or may be entered into under this
11 act for the purpose of obtaining a medical student loan or under K.S.A.
12 76 373 through 76 377a and amendments thereto other agreements for
13 the purpose of obtaining scholarship aid;

2 (5) Any person who enters but fails to complete an approved postgraduate residency training program, or who enters and com-3 pletes an approved postgraduate residency training program but 4 fails to satisfy the obligation to engage in the full-time practice of 5 medicine and surgery within a service commitment area of this 6 state for the required period of time shall be required to repay all 7 money received pursuant to an agreement entered into under this 8 9 act a medical student loan, plus accumulated interest at an annual 10 rate of 15% and shall commence such repayment in accordance with subsection (b) within 90 days of failure to complete an ap-11 proved postgraduate residency training program or 90 days of fail-12 ure to commence qualifying practice, whichever occurs first. 13

14 **(b)** For any repayment requirement under this section, the 15 person shall repay an amount totaling the entire amount to be 16 repaid under all such agreements for which such obligations are 17 not satisfied, including all amounts of interest at the rate pre-18 scribed. The repayment shall be made in not more than 10 equal 19 annual installment payments.

20 (c) All installment payments under this section shall commence 21 six months after the date of the action or circumstance that causes the failure of the person to satisfy the obligations of such agree-22 23 ments, as determined by the university of Kansas school of medi-24 cine based upon the circumstances of each individual case. In all 25 cases, if an installment payment becomes 91 days overdue, the 26 entire amount outstanding shall become immediately due and pay-27 able, including all amounts of interest at the rate prescribed.

(d) The total repayment obligation imposed under all agree-28 ments entered into under this act may be satisfied by the person 29 30 who entered into the agreements at any time prior to graduation 31 from the university of Kansas school of medicine by making a sin-32 gle lump-sum payment equal to the total of (1) the entire amount to be repaid under all such agreements upon failure to satisfy the 33 obligations under such agreements to practice in Kansas, plus (2) 34 35 all amounts of interest thereon at the rate prescribed to the date 36 of payment.

(e) The university of Kansas school of medicine shall remit all
moneys received under this section to the state treasurer at least
monthly. Upon receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer
shall deposit the entire amount thereof in the state treasury, and
such amount shall be credited to the medical scholarship and loan
repayment fund.

43 (f) There is hereby created in the state treasury the medical loan re-

payment fund. All expenditures from the medical loan repayment fund shall be for medical student loans under the medical student loan act and for the expenses of administration of the medical student loan act and shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the chancellor of the university of Kansas or by a person designated by the chancellor. On the effective date of this act, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer all moneys in the medical scholarship and loan repayment fund to the medical loan repayment fund. On the effective date of this act, all liabilities of the medical scholarship and loan repayment fund are hereby imposed on the medical loan repayment fund and the medical scholarship and loan repayment fund is hereby abolished. Whenever the medical scholarship and loan repayment fund, or words of like effect, is referred to or designated by any statute, contract or other doc-ument, such reference or designation shall be deemed to apply to the medical loan repayment fund.
