	AN ACT concerning agriculture; relating to agricultural contracts; con- fidentiality provisions.
	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
	Section 1. As used in this act:
5	(a) "Active contractor" means a person who owns a commodity that
'	is produced by a contract producer at the contract producer's contract
	operation according to a production contract;
	(b) "agricultural contract" means a production contract;
	(c) "animal feeding operation" means a lot, corral, building or other area in which livestock is confined and fed. An animal feeding operation
	does not include a livestock market;
	(d) "commodity" means livestock, raw milk or a crop;
	(e) "confinement feeding operation" means an animal feeding oper-
	ation in which livestock is confined to areas which are totally roofed;
	(f) "contract crop field" means farmland located in this state where
	a crop is produced according to a production contract by a contract pro-
	ducer who owns or leases the farmland;
	(g) "contract livestock facility" means an animal feeding operation
	located in this state in which livestock or raw milk is produced according
	to a production contract by a contract producer who holds a legal interest
	in the animal feeding operation. Contract livestock facility includes a con-
	finement feeding operation, an open feedlot, or an area which is used for the raising of crops or other vegetation and upon which livestock is fed
	for slaughter or is allowed to graze or feed;
	(h) "contract operation" means a contract livestock facility or a con-
	tract crop field;
	(i) "contract producer" means a producer who holds a legal interest
	in a contract operation and who produces a commodity under a produc-
	tion contract;
	(j) "contractor" means a person who is an active contractor or a pas-
	sive contractor;
	(k) "crop" means a plant used for food, animal feed, fiber, oil, phar-

maceuticals, nutriceuticals or seed, including but not limited to, alfalfa, 1 barley, buckwheat, corn, flax, forage, millet, oats, popcorn, rye, sorghum, 2 soybeans, sunflowers, tobacco, wheat and grasses used for forage or silage; 3

"farmland" means agricultural land that is suitable for use in 4 **()** 5 farming;

"livestock" means beef cattle, dairy cattle, poultry, sheep or 6 (m) 7 swine:

"open feedlot" means an unroofed or partially roofed animal feed-8 (n) 9 ing operation in which no crop, vegetation or forage growth or residue 10 cover is maintained during the period that livestock is confined in the 11 operation;

"passive contractor" means a person who furnishes management 12 (0) services to a contract producer and who does not own a commodity that 13 is produced by the contract producer at the contract producer's contract 14 15 operation according to a production contract;

"processor" means a person engaged in the business of manufac-16 (p) 17 turing goods from commodities, including slaughtering or processing livestock, processing raw milk or processing crops; 18

"produce" means to do any of the following: 19 (q)

20 (1) Provide feed or services relating to the care and feeding of live-21 stock. If the livestock is dairy cattle, then produce includes milking the dairy cattle and storing raw milk; 22

23 (2) provide for planting, raising, harvesting and storing a crop. Produce includes preparing the soil for planting and nurturing the crop by 24 25 the application of fertilizers or soil conditioners or pesticides;

26 "producer" means a person who produces a commodity, including (r) 27 but not limited to, a contract producer. Producer does not include a com-28 mercial fertilizer or pesticide applicator, a feed supplier or a veterinarian, 29 when acting in such capacity;

30 (s) "production contract" means an oral or written agreement that provides for the production of a commodity or the provision of manage-31 32 ment services relating to the production of a commodity by a contract producer. A production contract is executed when it is signed or orally 33 agreed to by each party to the contract or by a person authorized to act 34 35 on the party's behalf; and

"secretary" means the secretary of the Kansas department of 36 (t) 37 agriculture.

Sec. 2. (a) On and after the effective date of this act, a contractor or 38 processor shall not enforce a provision in an agricultural contract if the 39 40 provision provides that information contained in the agricultural contract is confidential. 41

42 (b) A provision which is part of an agricultural contract is void if the 43 provision states that information contained in th agricultural contract is

1	confidential. The confidentiality provision is void whether the confiden-
2	tiality provision is expressed or implied; oral or written; required or con-
3	ditional; or contained in the agricultural contract, another agricultural
4	contract, or in a related document, policy or agreement. This section does
5	not affect other provisions of an agricultural contract or a related docu-
6	ment, policy or agreement which can be given effect without the voided
7	provision. This section does not require a party to an agricultural contract
8	to divulge information in the agricultural contract to another person.
9	Sec. 3. Any provision of an agricultural contract which waives a pro-
10	ducer right or an obligation of a contractor or processor established by
11	this act is void and unenforceable. This section does not affect other
12	provisions of an agricultural contract, including an agricultural contract
13	or related document, policy or agreement which can be given effect with-
14	out the voided provision.
15	Sec. 4. Any condition, stipulation or provision requiring the appli-
16	cation of the law of another state in lieu of this act is void and
17	unenforceable.
18	Sec. 5. The secretary may promulgate rules and regulations to im-
19	plement the provisions of this act.
20	Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
21	publication in the statute book.
