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AN ACT concerning dental hygienists; concerning the providing of cer-9 tain dental hygiene preventive services and reimbursement therefor. 10 11 12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 13 Section 1. (a) A dental hygienist may provide dental hygiene preventive services without the prior authorization or the presence of a dentist 14 15 and the dental hygienist's services may be reimbursed by medicaid or any other third-party payer or agency in the following circumstances: 16 Within the preceding three years the dental hygienist has either 17 (1) 18 (A) practiced clinical dental hygiene under the supervision of a dentist 19 for a minimum of 500 hours; or (B) been a full-time faculty member of 20 an accredited dental hygiene program for two semesters; and 21 (2) the preventive services are limited to (A) application of decay 22 preventive measures such as fluorides, fluoride varnish or pit and fissure; 23 (B) assessment of the patients' dental hygiene status; (C) assessment of 24 the patients' apparent need for further evaluation by a dentist to deter-25 mine the presence of caries or other dental abnormalities; (D) removal 26 of calculus, stains and accretions from surfaces of the teeth; and (E) ad-27 ditional services as the board may establish by rule and regulation; and The dental hygienist advises the patient that the services are pre-28 (3)

29 ventive in nature and do not constitute comprehensive dental diagnosis 30 and care and provides a copy of findings and report of treatment to the 31 dental supervisor, or if there is no dentist to the medical supervisor of 32 the facility; and

(4) The patient is treated by the dental hygienist at (A) a community,
rural, migrant or federally qualified health center; (B) a state, county or
local public health program or facility; (C) a state or federal correctional
institution; (D) a hospital, nursing home, skilled nursing facility or other
long-term care facility where the patient is confined; (E) a school based
health program; or (F) other category or facility as the Kansas dental
board may establish by rule and regulation.

40 (b) This section shall be part of and supplemental to the dental prac-41 tices act.
