Session of 2001 HOUSE BILL No. 2387 By Representatives Garner, Ballard, Barnes, Crow, Dillmore, Flaharty, Gilbert, Henderson, Kirk, Klein, Kuether, Loganbill, McClure, O'Brien, E. Peterson, Phelps, Reardon, Ruff, Storm, Thimesch, Toelkes, Wells, Welshimer and Winn 2-7AN ACT establishing the Kansas civil rights history project task force; providing for the duties thereof. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the Kansas civil rights history project task force. The task force shall be composed of the following members: (1)One member of the senate appointed by the president of the senate; (2) one member of the senate appointed by the minority leader of the senate; (3) one member of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; (4) one member of the house of representatives appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives; (5) two members appointed by the executive director of the state historical society who are employed by the state historical society; (6) two members appointed by the state board of regents who are professors at a state educational institution and who have a specific interest in state civil rights history; and three persons appointed by the governor. (7)The member of the task force appointed by the president of the (b) senate shall call and preside at the first meeting of the task force. At such meeting the members of the task force shall elect a chairperson and vicechairperson. The task force shall meet on the call of the chairperson. The task force shall meet at least quarterly and at other times necessary to perform its functions. All meetings shall be held in Topeka unless authorized to be held in a different place by the legislative coordinating council. If a vacancy occurs on the task force, the vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. (c) From moneys appropriated to the legislature, the Kansas civil rights history project task force shall employ an executive secretary who

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shall be in the unclassified service of the Kansas civil service act and 1 receive compensation as approved by the legislative coordinating council. 2 3 The executive secretary shall act as staff to the task force and shall serve as liaison with the state agencies and the office of the governor. 4

(d) All officers and employees of the state shall provide such infor-56 mation and assistance as may be deemed necessary by the task force. 7 Other staff assistance shall be provided by the office of the revisor of statutes, the legislative research department and such other legislative 8 9 offices and employees as may be directed by the legislative coordinating 10 council.

11 Legislators serving as members of the task force and those non-(e) 12 legislative members appointed pursuant to paragraphs (5), (6) and (7) of 13 subsection (a), shall receive compensation and travel expenses and sub-14 sistence expenses or allowances as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223, and 15amendments thereto, for each day of actual attendance at any meeting of 16 the task force or any subcommittee meeting approved by the task force. 17Such amounts paid to members shall be paid from appropriations to the 18 legislature pursuant to vouchers prepared by the director of legislative 19 administrative services and approved by the chairperson or vice-chair-20person of the legislative coordinating council.

21 (f) The task force shall discuss, identify and develop recommenda-22 tions for promoting the history of civil rights in Kansas, including, but not 23limited to:

24(1) Ways to enhance the teaching of state civil rights history in ele-25mentary, secondary and post-secondary education; 26

preserving historic sites relevant to state civil rights history; and (2)

27 promoting the role civil rights played in the history of Kansas (3)28statehood, including slavery, the underground railroad, women's suffrage, 29 the treatment of Native Americans, religious freedom and participation 30 in the civil war.

(g) The task force shall submit a final report which shall include a 31 32 master plan for promoting the role the state played in the advancement 33 of civil rights, including recommendations relating to the promotion of 34 tourism based on state civil rights history to the legislature and to the 35 governor on or before January 8, 2002.

36 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 37 publication in the Kansas Register.

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
