9 AN ACT concerning adoption; relating to independent legal advice;
10 amending K.S.A. 59-2114 and 59-2115 and repealing the existing
11 sections.

13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

14Section 1. K.S.A. 59-2114 is hereby amended to read as follows: 59-152114. (a) Consent shall be in writing and shall be acknowledged before a 16 judge of a court of record or before an officer authorized by law to take 17acknowledgments. If consent is acknowledged before a judge of a court 18 of record, it shall be the duty of the court to advise the consenting person 19 of the consequences of the consent. A consent is final when executed, 20 unless the consenting party, prior to final decree of adoption, alleges and 21proves by clear and convincing evidence that the consent was not freely 22 and voluntarily given. The burden of proving the consent was not freely 23and voluntarily given shall rest with the consenting party.

24 (b) Minority of a parent shall not invalidate a parent's consent or 25 relinquishment.

26 (b) (c) Consent in all cases shall have been executed not more than 27 six months prior to the date the petition for adoption is filed.

28Sec. 2. K.S.A. 59-2115 is hereby amended to read as follows: 59-29 2115. Minority of a parent shall not invalidate a parent's consent or relin-30 quishment, except that a minor (a) Any parent shall have the advice of 31 independent legal counsel as to the consequences of the consent or re-32 linquishment prior to its execution. An attorney shall not represent the 33 parent and the petitioner or child placing agency, unless such dual rep-34 resentation is disclosed to the parties to the adoption and written consent 35 to dual representation is obtained from all parties.

(b) The attorney providing independent legal advice to the *a* minor parent shall be present at the execution of the consent or relinquishment. Unless the minor parent is otherwise represented by independent legal counsel, the petitioner or child placing agency shall provide independent legal counsel to the minor parent at such petitioner's or child placing agency's sole expense.
