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8 9 AN ACT establishing the school district technology information specialist 10 scholarship program. 11 12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 13 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the school 14district technology information specialist scholarship program. 15Sec. 2. As used in this act: 16 "Executive officer" means the chief executive officer of the state (a) 17board of regents appointed under K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-3203a, and 18 amendments thereto; 19 (b) "qualified student" means a person who: (1) Is a resident of the 20 state of Kansas; (2) has been accepted for admission to or is enrolled full 21 time in a course of instruction leading to a degree in technology, computer 22 science or information management systems; and (3) has qualified for the 23 award of a scholarship under the school district technology information 24specialist scholarship program on the basis of having demonstrated scho-25lastic ability, or who has previously so qualified and remains qualified for 26 renewal of the scholarship on the basis of remaining in good standing and 27 making satisfactory progress toward completion of the requirements of 28the course of instruction in which enrolled. 29 Sec. 3. (a) There is hereby established the school district technology 30 information specialist scholarship program. A scholarship may be awarded 31 under the program to any qualified student and may be renewed for each 32 such student who remains qualified for the scholarship. The number of 33 new scholarships awarded under the program in each year shall not ex-34 ceed 50. Determination of the students qualified for such scholarships 35 shall be made by the executive officer. Scholastic ability shall be deter-36 mined on the basis of any one or more of the following: (1) High ACT or 37 SAT score; (2) rank in high school graduation class; (3) cumulative high 38 school or college grade point average; or (4) any other indicator of scho-39 lastic ability which the state board of regents determines to be demon-40strative of potential for successful completion of a course of instruction 41 leading to a degree in technology, computer science or information man-42 agement systems.

43 (b) A scholarship awarded under the program shall provide for pay-

ment to a qualified student of (1) an amount not to exceed 70% of the 1 cost of attendance for an academic year at a state educational institution 2 3 or (2) an amount not to exceed 70% of the average amount of the cost of attendance for an academic year at the state educational institutions if 4 the institution of higher education at which the qualified student is en-56 rolled is not a state educational institution. A qualified student may be 7 awarded a scholarship for not more than four academic years of undergraduate study, except that a qualified student who is enrolled full time 8 9 in a course of instruction leading to a degree in technology, computer 10 science or information management systems for which graduate study is 11 required may be awarded a scholarship for the duration of the course of 12 instruction.

Sec. 4. (a) An applicant for designation as a qualified student and for
the award of a scholarship under the school district technology information specialist scholarship program shall provide to the executive officer,
on forms supplied by the executive officer, information required by the
executive officer.

(b) As a condition to awarding a scholarship under this act, the executive officer and the applicant shall enter into an agreement which shall
require the applicant to:

(1) Complete the required course of instruction leading to a degreein technology, computer science or information management systems;

23 commence employment by a school district in Kansas as a school (2)24district technology information specialist on a full-time basis in accord-25ance with the agreement and continue such employment on a full-time 26 basis for a period of not less than the length of the course of instruction 27 for which the scholarship was awarded or commence employment by a 28school district in Kansas as a school district technology information spe-29 cialist on a part-time basis in accordance with the agreement and continue 30 such employment on a part-time basis for a period of time that is equiv-31 alent to full time, as determined by the state board of regents, multiplied 32 by the length of the course of instruction for which the scholarship was 33 awarded;

(3) commence employment by a school district in Kansas as a school
district technology information specialist on a full-time or part-time basis
within six months after completion of the course of instruction for which
the scholarship was awarded and continue such employment for the period of time required by the agreement;

(4) maintain records and make reports to the executive officer as required by the executive officer to document the satisfaction of the obligations under this act and the agreement; and

42 (5) upon failure to satisfy an agreement to engage in employment by 43 a school district in Kansas as a school district technology information specialist for the required period of time under any such agreement,
 repay to the state amounts as provided in section 5, and amendments
 thereto.

(a) Except as provided in section 6, and amendments thereto, 4 Sec. 5. upon the failure of any person to satisfy the obligation under any agree-56 ment entered into pursuant to the school district technology information 7 specialist scholarship program, such person shall pay to the executive officer an amount equal to the total amount of money received by such 8 9 person pursuant to such agreement plus accrued interest at a rate which 10 is equivalent to the interest rate applicable to loans made under the fed-11 eral PLUS program at the time such person first entered into an agreement plus five percentage points. Amounts of payment under this section 12shall be adjusted proportionately for full years of the obligation that have 13 14 been satisfied. Installment payments of any such amounts may be made 15in accordance with the provisions of the agreement entered into by the 16 scholarship recipient or if no such provisions exist in such agreement, in 17accordance with rules and regulations of the state board of regents, except 18that such installment payments shall commence six months after the date 19 of the action or circumstances that cause the failure of the person to 20satisfy the obligations of such agreement, as determined by the executive 21 officer based upon the circumstances of each individual case. Amounts 22 paid under this section to the executive officer shall be deposited in the 23school district technology information specialist scholarship repayment 24fund in accordance with section 8, and amendments thereto.

(b) The state board of regents is authorized to turn any repayment account arising under the school district technology information specialist scholarship program over to a designated loan servicer or collection agency, the state not being involved other than to receive payments from the loan servicer or collection agency at the interest rate prescribed under this section.

31 Sec. 6. (a) Except as otherwise specified in the agreement, an obli-32 gation under any agreement entered into under the school district tech-33 nology information specialist scholarship program shall be postponed: (1)34 During any required period of active military service; (2) during any pe-35 riod of service as a part of volunteers in service to America (VISTA); (3) 36 during any period of service in the peace corps; (4) during any period of 37 service commitment to the United States public health service; (5) during 38 any period of religious missionary work conducted by an organization 39 exempt from tax under section 501(c)(3) of the federal internal revenue code as in effect on December 31, 2000; (6) during any period of time 40the person obligated is unable because of temporary medical disability to 4142 be employed as a school district technology information specialist; (7) during any period of time the person obligated is enrolled and actively 43

engaged on a full-time basis in a course of study leading to a degree in 1 2 the field of technology, computer science or information management 3 systems which is higher than that formerly attained; (8) during any period of time the person obligated is on job-protected leave under the federal 4 family and medical leave act of 1993; or (9) during any period of time the 56 state board of regents determines that the person obligated is unable 7 because of special circumstances to be employed as a school district technology information specialist. Except for clauses (6), (8) and (9), an ob-8 9 ligation under any agreement entered into as provided in the school district technology information specialist scholarship program shall not be 10 11 postponed more than two years from the time the obligation was to have 12 been commenced under such agreement. An obligation under any agree-13 ment entered into as provided in the school district technology infor-14mation specialist scholarship program shall be postponed under clause 15(6) during the period of time the medical disability exists. An obligation 16 under any agreement entered into as provided in the school district tech-17nology information specialist scholarship program shall be postponed un-18 der clause (8) during the period of time the person obligated remains on 19 FMLA leave. An obligation to engage in employment as a school district 20 technology information specialist in accordance with an agreement under 21 the school district technology information specialist scholarship program 22 shall be postponed under clause (9) during the period of time the state 23board of regents determines that the special circumstances exist. The 24state board of regents shall adopt rules and regulations prescribing criteria 25or guidelines for determination of the existence of special circumstances 26 causing an inability to be employed as a school district technology infor-27 mation specialist, and shall determine the documentation required to 28prove the existence of such circumstances.

29 (b) An obligation under any agreement entered into as provided in 30 the school district technology information specialist scholarship program 31 shall be satisfied: (1) If the obligation has been completed in accordance 32 with the agreement; (2) if the person obligated dies; (3) if, because of 33 permanent physical disability, the person obligated is unable to satisfy the 34 obligation; (4) if the person obligated fails to satisfy the requirements for 35 graduation with a degree in technology, computer science or information 36 management systems after making the best effort possible; (5) if the per-37 son obligated is unable to obtain employment by a school district in Kan-38 sas as a school district technology information specialist after making the 39 best effort possible to obtain such employment and the person obligated 40otherwise completes the terms, conditions and obligations of the 41 agreement.

42 Sec. 7. The state board of regents shall adopt rules and regulations 43 for administration of the school district technology information specialist

scholarship program and shall establish terms, conditions and obligations 1 2 which shall be incorporated into the provisions of any agreement entered 3 into between the executive officer and an applicant for the award of a scholarship under the program. The terms, conditions and obligations 4 shall be consistent with the provisions of law relating to the program and 56 shall include, but not be limited to, the circumstances under which eli-7 gibility for financial assistance under the program may be terminated, the amount of financial assistance to be provided, the circumstances under 8 9 which obligations may be discharged or forgiven, the amount of money 10 required to be repaid because of failure to satisfy the obligations under 11 an agreement and the method of repayment.

12 Sec. 8. (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the school 13 district technology information specialist scholarship program fund. The 14executive officer shall remit all moneys received under the school district 15technology information specialist scholarship program, which are paid because of nonattendance or discontinuance by scholarship recipients, to 16 17the state treasurer at least monthly. Upon receipt of each such remittance 18 the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount thereof in the state 19 treasury, and such amount shall be credited to the school district tech-20 nology information specialist scholarship program fund. All expenditures 21 from the school district technology information specialist scholarship pro-22 gram fund shall be for scholarships awarded under the school district 23 technology information specialist scholarship program and shall be made 24in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of 25accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the exec-26 utive officer or by a person designated by the executive officer.

27 There is hereby created in the state treasury the school district (b) 28technology information specialist scholarship repayment fund. The ex-29 ecutive officer shall remit all moneys received under the school district 30 technology information specialist scholarship program, which are for pay-31 ment of amounts pursuant to section 5, and amendments thereto, to the state treasurer at least monthly. Upon receipt of each such remittance 32 33 the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount thereof in the state treasury, and such amount shall be credited to the school district tech-34 35 nology information specialist scholarship repayment fund. All expendi-36 tures from the school district technology information specialist scholar-37 ship repayment fund shall be for scholarships awarded under the school 38 district technology information specialist scholarship program and shall 39 be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the di-40rector of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by 41 the executive officer or by a person designated by the executive officer. 42 Sec. 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

43 publication in the statute book.
