9 AN ACT concerning the Kansas highway patrol; relating to pay rates and 10 prevailing total compensation in Kansas public law enforcement agen-11 cies; amending K.S.A. 75-2938 and K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-2114 and 12 repealing the existing sections. 13

14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-2114 is hereby amended to read as 15 16 follows: 74-2114. (a) The personnel of the Kansas highway patrol shall be 17paid compensation for their services as determined by the superintendent 18 in accordance with provisions of applicable laws, rules and regulations. 19 Military service of any member of the Kansas highway patrol who leaves 20 or has left the patrol for the purpose of serving in any branch of the armed 21forces of the United States, during any war or national emergency and 22 who returns to the patrol within 60 days after release therefrom, shall be 23considered as service with the patrol for the purpose of calculating any 24longevity pay increase. The governor shall determine when a national 25emergency exists or has existed.

26 (b) The salary of each member of the Kansas highway patrol shall be 27 fixed by the superintendent in accordance with the Kansas civil service 28act. All members of the patrol shall receive their actual and necessary 29 traveling expenses and all salaries shall be paid monthly. The Kansas high-30 way patrol superintendent shall hold office at the pleasure of the gover-31 nor. The personnel of the Kansas highway patrol other than the super-32 intendent shall serve upon first appointment for a probationary period of 33 one year. The superintendent is authorized to assign any major, captain, 34 lieutenant, sergeant or trooper for duty other than the place to which 35 presently assigned. In such cases, the superintendent shall pay necessary 36 moving expense from moneys appropriated for the Kansas highway patrol 37 from the state general fund and available therefor in accordance with 38 K.S.A. 75-3225 and amendments thereto.

39 (c) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, and for each fiscal year

40 there after, the director of personnel services shall determine and maintain

41 total compensation for troopers of the Kansas highway patrol in accord-42 ance with this subsection. For the purposes of determining and maintain-

43 ing total compensation for troopers of the Kansas highway patrol, the

director of personnel services shall assign and reassign each trooper job 1 class in accordance with this subsection to a pay rate under the pay plan 2 3 for classified employees under the Kansas civil service act so that such trooper job class is receiving total compensation which is equal to or 4 greater than the prevailing total compensation determined pursuant to 5this subsection. The director of personnel services shall conduct annual 6 7 surveys of pay rates and other benefits and other compensation practices to determine the prevailing total compensation for all public law enforce-8 9 ment agencies with commissioned officers performing law enforcement 10 duties within Kansas. As used in this subsection, "total compensation" 11 means the amount of salary, benefits, including retirement benefits, and premium pay practices and "prevailing total compensation" means that 12 13 total compensation that is equal to or greater than 99% of the average 14 total compensation provided to the commissioned law enforcement officers 15of the three public law enforcement agencies performing law enforcement duties within Kansas, having more than 100 commissioned officers and 16 having the highest actual average total compensation of all the public law 1718 enforcement agencies performing law enforcement duties within Kansas. Sec. 2. K.S.A. 75-2938 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-19 20 2938. (a) Except as otherwise provided in the Kansas civil service act, the 21 director of personnel services, after consultation with the heads of state 22 agencies or persons designated by them, shall assign each position in the classified service to a class according to the duties and responsibilities 2324thereof. Titles shall be specified by the director for each such class for 25use in certifying the names of persons for appointment under this act. A 26 description of the duties and responsibilities with suitable qualifications 27 required for satisfactory performance in each class shall be specified by the director. The classes and titles so specified and described shall be 2829 used for: (1) Original appointments; (2) promotions; (3) payrolls; and (4) 30 all other records affecting the status of persons in the classified service. Each class when approved or modified and approved as modified by the 31 32 governor shall take effect on a date or dates specified by the governor. 33 After consultation with the director of the budget and the heads of state agencies or persons designated by them, the director shall recommend 34 35 changes in classes from time to time, and such changes, when approved 36 or modified and approved as modified by the governor, shall take effect 37 on a date or dates specified by the governor.

(b) The director of personnel services shall recommend to the governor the assignment, and from time to time the reassignment, of each
class to a specified range approved or modified and approved as modified
by the governor, the same shall become effective on a date or dates specified by the governor. In adopting or revising any plans, the governor shall
give consideration to pertinent rates in other public and private employ-

ment in the appropriate labor markets, and for this purpose the director 1 shall have made periodic wage and salary surveys with one survey to be 2 3 conducted each year. The results of such survey and recommendations for revisions in the pay plan are to be forwarded to the governor, the 4 secretary of administration, the director of the budget and the legislature. 56 The recommendations shall give consideration and weight to survey results, to changes in the cost-of-living and to proper internal alignment of 7 the various job classes. The director may use the results of other appro-8 9 priate surveys conducted by public or private agencies in lieu of or in 10 addition to surveys authorized to be conducted under this subsection.

11 (c) The secretary of administration may delegate the authority to as-12 sign positions in the classified service to a class according to the duties 13 and responsibilities thereof to the appointing authority. Such delegation 14 shall specify the particular classes, ranges, and schedules authorized. Ap-15pointing authorities delegated such assigning authority shall make 16 monthly reports of assigning transactions to the director of personnel 17services. Any delegation of such authority is subject to review by the secretary of administration who may modify any delegation made in order 1819 to ensure consistency with the state classification plan and may withdraw 20 the delegated authority from the appointing authority upon evidence of improper use of such authority by the appointing authority. The decision 2122 of the secretary of administration in regard to the withdrawal of such 23delegated authority shall be final.

24(d) After consultation with the director of the budget and the sec-25retary of administration, the director of personnel services shall prepare 26 a pay plan which shall contain a schedule of salary and wage ranges and 27 steps, and from time to time changes therein. When such pay plan or any 28change therein is approved or modified and approved as modified by the 29 governor, the same shall become effective on a date or dates specified by 30 the governor and any such modification, change of date shall be in ac-31 cordance with any enactments of the legislature applicable thereto.

(e) The classes and pay plan for the classified service as approved by
the governor shall be used by the director of the budget in preparation
of the budget.

(f) Whenever any appropriation or other act specifies any pay plan or any change, limitation or condition upon the pay plan, personnel or policies of the state or any state agency, such appropriation act or other act shall control the provisions of this section to the extent of their application thereto.

40 (g) The provisions of this section and the pay plan for the classified 41 service are subject to the provisions of subsection (c) of K.S.A. 74-2114

42 and amendments thereto. The powers, duties and functions prescribed by

43 this section for the director of personnel services, the secretary of admin-

1	istration and the governor shall be performed subject to and in confor-
2	mance with the provisions of subsection (c) of K.S.A. 74-2114 and amend-

- 2 mance with the provisions of subsection (c) of K.S.A. 74-2114 and amend3 ments thereto.
- 4 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 75-2938 and K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-2114 are hereby 5 repealed.
- 6 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 7 publication in the statute book.
