(a) If a person attempts to obtain a prescription-only drug 14 through any fraudulent means, including providing false or misleading 15 information to a physician, pharmacist, dentist or other health care pro-16 vider, the communication between such person and physician, pharma-17 cist, dentist or other health care provider shall not be a confidential com-18 munication for purposes of K.S.A. 60-427 and amendments thereto or 19 K.S.A. 65-1654 and amendments thereto or any other law which relates 20 to confidential communications between a health care provider and the 21 provider's patients or clients. A physician, pharmacist, dentist or other 22 health care provider may report to other physicians, pharmacists, dentists 23 or health care providers or law enforcement officials any information they 24 reasonably believe to be related to an attempt, or suspected attempt, by 25 26 a person to fraudulently obtain a prescription-only drug. Any physician, pharmacist, dentist, health care provider or their employee or agent who 27 in good faith furnishes, receives, disseminates or otherwise acts upon such 28 a report, without knowledge of the falsity of any information contained 29 in the report, shall have immunity from any liability, civil or criminal, that 30 might otherwise be incurred or imposed. No person shall have a privilege 31 in any prosecution for obtaining a prescription-only drug by fraudulent 32 means under K.S.A. 21-4214 and amendments thereto to refuse to dis-33 close or to prevent a witness from disclosing any communication with a 34 physician, pharmacist, dentist or other health care provider which is rel-35 evant to such prosecution. 36 37 (b) As used in this section: (1) "Dentist" means a person licensed in the state to practice 38 dentistry. 39 "Health care provider" shall have the same meaning ascribed to 40 (2) such term under K.S.A. 65-4921 and amendments thereto. 41

42 (3) "Pharmacist" means a person licensed in this state to engage in 43 the practice of pharmacy.
