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## HOUSE BILL No. 2470

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8 9 AN ACT concerning certain wildlife; relating to management and con-10 trol; amending K.S.A. 80-1201, 80-1202, 80-1203 and 80-1207 and 11 repealing the existing sections. 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14 Section 1. K.S.A. 80-1201 is hereby amended to read as follows: 80-15 1201. (a) The township board of any township in this state or the county commission of any county in this state, at any regular or special meeting, 16 17 is hereby authorized to purchase material and to employ one or more 18 suitable persons to destroy manage and/or control prairie dogs, moles and 19 gophers within the limits of such township, or county. Any material so 20 purchased and compensation for such services to shall be paid out of the 21 general fund of such township or county. (b) The Kansas department of wildlife and parks, the Kansas depart-22 23 ment of agriculture and K-state research and extension are authorized to 24 assist counties, township boards and landowners with management and/ 25 or control of black-tailed prairie dog colonies. Assistance may include but 26 is not limited to: 27 (1) Development and distribution of educational information and 28 management plan templates; 29 (2)technical assistance with preparation and implementation of man-30 agement plans; (3) research; 31 32 cost-share assistance and distribution of equipment and materials (4) 33 used for purposes of management and/or control of prairie dog colonies or populations, or to curtail dispersal; 34 35 (5) incentive payments for cooperative wildlife habitat enhancement and species conservation programs associated with prairie dog colonies, 36 37 and related range and livestock management practices, range restoration 38 and grassland conservation programs; 39 development of conservation programs, both state sponsored and (6) 40 cooperative, for landowners who are receptive to management of black-41 tailed prairie dog colonies to prevent the species from becoming threat-42 ened or endangered or to provide habitat for other species dependent 43 upon or associated with prairie dog colonies (including, but not limited to, the black-footed ferret, burrowing owl, golden eagle, ferruginous hawk,
 swift fox and mountain plover), or both; and

3 (7) development of programs, both state sponsored and cooperative,
4 for prairie dog control and/or management to assist owners of land ad5 jacent to land enrolled in a state or federal sanctioned prairie dog con6 servation program.

7 (c) Landowners may employ voluntary "candidate conservation agreements with assurances" or "safe harbors agreements" for a federally designated candidate or federally listed species as part of the landowners"
9 prairie dog management plans and may participate in related incentive programs offered by federal agencies.

12 (d) Nothing in this act shall be construed to prevent a landowner 13 from:

14 (1) Voluntarily eliminating prairie dogs from the landowner's land;15 or

(2) except as provided in K.S.A. 80-1202, and amendments thereto,
independently conserving, managing or controlling the prairie dogs on
the landowner's land.

19 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 80-1202 is hereby amended to read as follows: 80-20 1202. In addition to the duties now prescribed by law for township trus-21 tees, in counties infested by prairie dogs, they may do and perform the 22 following services: That the township trustees of the several townships in 23 this state infested by prairie dogs may enter upon the lands so infested 24 in their respective townships and make diligent efforts to exterminate all 25 prairie dogs thereon. For the purpose of enabling them to carry into effect 26 the provisions of this act, the trustees are authorized and empowered to 27 employ all such assistance and to purchase the poison or such appliances 28 and material as they may deem necessary to exterminate such dogs. The 29 work of such extermination shall all be done under the supervision and 30 direction of the trustees: Provided, That in any county having a population 31 of more than four thousand (4,000) and less than five thousand two hun-32 dred (5,200) which contains no city of the second class and not more than two (2) cities of the third class, the trustees shall before entering upon 33 the lands give written notice to any landowner who shall fail or refuse to 34 35 make use of the materials offered or provided, that unless he or she endeavors to control such prairie dogs according to the methods pre-36 37 scribed by the board of trustees will, within fifteen (15) days after the date specified in the notice enter upon his or her land and use the nec-38 39 essary materials to eradicate the prairie dogs thereon; and the trustees or 40 their agents, may thereafter enter upon the land and proceed to eradicate 41 such prairie dogs.

42 (a) Upon receiving a written complaint from a landowner who is di 43 rectly affected by an unmanaged or uncontrolled population of prairie

dogs, the township board or county commission shall determine whether 1 2 the population of prairie dogs poses a serious threat of destructive, inju-3 rious or detrimental effect upon the complaining landowner's property. The township board or county commission shall provide written notice of 4 the determination to the landowner or landowners of such property. The 5 notice shall indicate the determination and the specific location of the 6 7 prairie dog population and whether the board or commission has deter-8 mined that corrective management and/or control measures are necessary 9 to abate the potentially destructive, injurious or detrimental effect. If con-10 trol measures are deemed necessary, the landowner may contest the determination by the board or commission in the same manner as provided 11 by K.S.A. 19-223, and amendments thereto, for appeals of decisions by 12 13 the board of county commissioners. If the landowner does not contest such determination, the landowner, within 90 days of the written notice, shall 14 15 either:

Commence a management and/or control plan developed in con-16 (1) 17 junction with the Kansas department of wildlife and parks, which plan shall include: (A) Measures designed to curtail spread of the identified 18 prairie dog population to adjoining lands not owned by the landowner if 19 20 the owners of those adjacent lands do not want expansion of the colony 21 onto their respective land; and (B) elements addressing other objectives 22 of the landowner, such as conservation of the species and other associated 23 wildlife; or

(2) permit the township or county to undertake mutually agreed upon
prairie dog management and/or control measures on the landowner's land
and reimburse the township or county for costs incurred for such measures, if requested by the township or county.

28 (b) For the purpose of enabling the township or county to implement 29 the provisions of this act, the township or county may employ all such 30 assistance and to purchase such appliances and materials as the township 31 board or county commission deems necessary to implement prairie dog 32 management and/or control measures. Upon expiration of the 90-day no-33 tice period provided by subsection (a), the township board or county 34 commission shall give at least 30 days' written notice to any landowner 35 who has failed to either contest the board's or commission's determination 36 or comply with (a)(1) or (a)(2) before the township or county may enter 37 upon the landowner's land without permission to undertake prairie dog management and/or control measures designed to curtail the dispersal of 38 39 prairie dogs to acceptable levels needed to reduce serious destructive, 40 injurious or detrimental effects on surrounding lands. The employment of 41 management and/or control measures under this subsection shall not au-42 thorize action to eradicate or eliminate an entire prairie dog colony or

43 population unless based on a finding to support such action.

1 (c) After eradication of such prairie dogs, the trustees employment of 2 management and/or control measures pursuant to subsection (b), the 3 township or county shall immediately notify the landowner or landowners with an itemized statement of a statement itemizing the costs thereof, and 4 5 stating that unless such amount is paid within thirty (30) 30 days from the date of the notice, that the amount shall become a lien upon their 6 7 real estate the real estate of such landowner or landowners. If such costs are not paid within thirty (30) days they 30 days, the costs shall be assessed 8 9 against the property of the landowner and or landowners. In the case of 10 a township, the township clerk shall, at the time of certifying other town-11 ship taxes to the county clerk, shall certify the costs of such eradication and measures. The county clerk shall extend the same costs on the tax 12 13 roll of the township or county, as the case may be, against such property and said such costs shall be collected by the county treasurer and paid to 14 15 the township or county as other township or county taxes are collected 16 and paid.

17 (d) A township or county shall not undertake prairie dog management 18 or control measures pursuant to subsection (b) on the land of any land-19 owner who, pursuant to subsection (a)(1), is implementing a management 20 or control plan approved by the department of wildlife and parks. But if 21 the landowner who submits a management or control plan to the township 22 or county is found to have failed or refused to implement such plan, the 23 township or county may undertake the measures described in subsection 24 (b) and recover the costs thereof as provided by subsection (c).

25 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 80-1203 is hereby amended to read as follows: 80-26 1203. The trustees of the several townships infested by prairie dogs any 27 township having an unmanaged or uncontrolled prairie dog population shall appear before the board of county commissioners of their respective 28 29 counties at their the county at the commission's annual meeting in August 30 of each year, when they convene the commission convenes to make the annual tax levy, and. The township trustees shall make a report of the 31 32 probable expense to exterminate manage and/or control the prairie dogs in their respective townships. And the commissioners of the respective 33 34 counties township. The county commission, after receiving said reports 35 such report, shall cause to be levied on real estate assessed for taxation 36 in each such township thus infested by prairie dogs the approximate 37 amount estimated by the several trustees as herein provided, or any part thereof:-Provided, however, That. No assessment for this purpose shall 38 39 be greater than seventy cents \$.70 on each one hundred dollars \$100 40 valuation as herein provided.

41 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 80-1207 is hereby amended to read as follows: 80-42 1207. Whenever any township of this state shall have rid itself of the

23	commissioners and the trustee trustees of such township), the surplus
