	AN ACT concerning elections; relating to advance voting; amending K.S.A. 25-1122, 25-1123 and 25-1124 and repealing the existing sections.
	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 25-1122 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25- 1122. (a) Any registered voter may file with the county election officer where such person is a resident, or where such person is authorized by law to vote as a former precinct resident, an application for an advance voting ballot. The signed application shall be transmitted only to the county election officer by personal delivery, mail, facsimile or as otherwise
	<ul> <li>provided by law.</li> <li>(b) Applications for advance voting ballots to be transmitted to the voter by mail shall be filed only at the following times: <ul> <li>(1) For the primary election occurring on the first Tuesday in August in even-numbered years, between April 1 of such year and the last business day of the week preceding such primary election.</li> <li>(2) For the general election occurring on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November in even-numbered years, between 90 days prior to such election and the last business day of the week preceding such general election.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
c l l c	<ul> <li>(3) For the primary election held five weeks preceding the first Tuesday in April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the last business day of the week preceding such primary election.</li> <li>(4) For the general election occurring on the first Tuesday in April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the last business day of the week preceding such general election.</li> <li>(5) For question submitted elections occurring on the date of a primary or general election, the same as is provided for ballots for election of officers at such election.</li> </ul>
	(6) For question submitted elections not occurring on the date of a primary or general election, between the time of the first published notice thereof and the last business day of the week preceding such question submitted election, except that if the question submitted election is held on a day other than a Tuesday, the county election officer shall determine

the final date for mailing of advance voting ballots, but such date shallnot be more than three business days before such election.

3 (7) For any special election of officers, at such time as is specified by 4 the secretary of state.

5 (8) For the presidential preference primary, between January 1 of 6 the year in which such primary is held and the last business day of the 7 week preceding such primary election.

8 The county election officer of any county may receive applications prior 9 to the time specified in this subsection (b) and hold such applications 10 until the beginning of the prescribed application period. Such applications 11 shall be treated as filed on that date.

Unless an earlier date is designated by the county election office, 12 (c) applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in person 13 in the office of the county election officer shall be filed on the Tuesday 14 next preceding the election and on each subsequent business day until 15 no later than 12:00 noon on the day preceding such election. If the county 16 election officer so provides, applications for advance voting ballots trans-17 mitted to the voter in person in the office of the county election officer 18 also may be filed on the Saturday preceding the election. Upon receipt 19 of any such properly executed application, the county election officer shall 20 deliver to the voter such ballots and instructions as are provided for in 21 this act. 22

An application for an advance voting ballot filed by a sick, physically
disabled or illiterate voter or by a person rendering assistance to such
voter may be filed during the regular advance ballot application periods
until the close of the polls on election day.

In any county having a population exceeding 250,000, the county election officer may designate places other than the central county election office as satellite advance voting sites. At any satellite advance voting site, a registered voter may obtain an application for advance voting ballots, such ballots and instructions shall be delivered to the voter in the same manner and subject to the same limitations as otherwise provided by this subsection.

(d) Any person having a permanent physical disability or an illness
which has been diagnosed as a permanent illness is hereby authorized to
make an application for permanent advance voting status. Applications
for permanent advance voting status shall be in the form and contain such
information as is required for application for advance voting ballots and
also shall contain information which establishes the voter's right to permanent advance voting status.

41 (e) On receipt of any application filed under the provisions of this
42 section, the county election officer shall prepare and maintain in such
43 officer's office a list of the names of all persons who have filed such

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applications, together with their correct post office address and the precinct, ward, township or voting area in which such persons claim to be 2 registered voters or to be authorized by law to vote as former precinct 3 residents and the present resident address of each applicant. Such names 4 and addresses shall remain so listed until the day of such election. The 5 county election officer shall maintain a separate listing of the names and 6 addresses of persons qualifying for permanent advance voting status. All 7 such lists shall be available for inspection upon request in compliance 8 with this subsection by any registered voter during regular business hours. 9 The county election officer upon receipt of such applications shall enter 10 upon a record kept by such officer the name and address of each appli-11 cant, which record shall conform to the list above required. Before in-12 spection of any advance voting ballot application list, the person desiring 13 to make such inspection shall provide to the county election officer iden-14 tification in the form of driver's license or other reliable identification and 15 shall sign a log book or application form maintained by such officer stating 16 such person's name and address and showing the date and time of in-17 spection. All records made by the county election officer shall be subject 18 to public inspection, except that the identifying number on ballots and 19 ballot envelopes and records of such number shall not be made public. 20 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 25-1123 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-21 1123. (a) When an application for an advance voting ballot has been filed 22 in accordance with K.S.A. 25-1122, and amendments thereto, the county 23 election officer shall transmit to the voter applying therefor one each of 24 the appropriate ballots. Except as provided by subsection (b) subsections 25 26 (b) and (c), the county election officer shall transmit the advance voting ballots to the voter at one of the following addresses as specified by the 27 voter on such application: (1) The voter's residential address or mailing 28 address as indicated on the registration list; (2) the voter's temporary 29 residential address; or (3) a medical care facility as defined in K.S.A. 65-30 425, and amendments thereto, psychiatric hospital, hospice or adult care 31 home where the voter resides. No advance voting ballot shall be trans-32 mitted by the county election officer by any means prior to the 20th day 33 before the election for which an application for an advance voting ballot 34 has been received by such county election officer. If the advance voting 35 ballot is transmitted by mail, such ballot shall be transmitted with printed 36 37 instructions prescribed by the secretary of state and a ballot envelope bearing upon the outside a printed form as described in K.S.A. 25-1120, 38 and amendments thereto, and the same number as the number of the 39 ballot. If the advance voting ballot is transmitted to the applicant in person 40 in the office of the county election officer or at a satellite advance voting 41 site, such advance voting ballot and printed instructions shall be trans-42 mitted in an advance voting ballot envelope bearing upon the outside a 43

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printed form as described in K.S.A. 25-1120, and amendments thereto, 1 and the same number as the number of the ballot unless the voter elects 2 3 to deposit the advance voting ballot into a locked ballot box without an envelope. All ballots shall be transmitted to the advance voting voter not 4 5 more than 20 days before the election but within two business days of the receipt of such voter's application by the election officer or the com-6 mencement of such 20-day period. In primary elections required to be 7 conducted on a partisan basis, the election officer shall deliver to such 8 voter the ballot of the political party of the applicant. 9

10 (b) The restrictions in subsection (a) relating to where a county elec-11 tion officer may transmit an advance voting ballot shall not apply to an 12 advance voting ballot requested pursuant to an application for an advance 13 voting ballot filed by a sick, physically disabled or illiterate voter.

(c) Advance voting ballots which are to be transmitted to an adult 14 care home shall be delivered to voters at such adult care home by a special 15 election board. Such board shall be composed of members from each po-16 litical party having the name of a candidate on the ballot. The voted ballots 17 shall be collected within two hours of the time of delivery by the special 18 election board. The voted ballots shall be placed by the voter in a locked 19 20 ballot box which box shall be returned to the county election office by the special election board on the same day on which such ballots are delivered 2122 to the voter.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 25-1124 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-23 1124. (a) Upon receipt of the advance voting ballot, the voter shall cast 24 25 such voter's vote as follows: The voter shall make a cross or check mark 26 in the square or parentheses opposite the name of each candidate or question for whom the voter desires to vote. The voter shall make no 27 other mark, and shall allow no other person to make any mark, upon such 28 ballot. If the advance voting ballot was transmitted by mail, the voter 29 personally shall place the ballot in the ballot envelope bearing the same 30 number as the ballot and seal the envelope. The voter shall complete the 31 form on the ballot envelope and shall sign the same. Except as provided 32 by K.S.A. 25-1123, and amendments thereto, for ballots cast by residents 33 of adult care homes and by K.S.A. 25-2908, and amendments thereto, the 34 ballot envelope shall be mailed or otherwise transmitted to the county 35 election officer. If the advance voting ballot was transmitted to the voter 36 37 in person in the office of the county election officer or at a satellite advance voting site, the voter may deposit such ballot into a locked ballot 38 box without an envelope. 39 (b) Any sick, physically disabled or illiterate voter who is unable to 40

apply for or mark or transmit an advance voting ballot, may request assistance by a person who has signed a statement required by subsection
(d) in applying for or marking an advance voting ballot.

An application for an advance voting ballot filed by a sick, physi-1 (c) cally disabled or illiterate voter or by a person rendering assistance to 2 such voter may be filed during the regular advance ballot application 3 periods until the close of the polls on election day. Any voted ballot may 4 be transmitted to the county election officer by the voter or by another 5 person upon request of the voter. Any such voted ballot shall be trans-6 mitted to the county election officer before the close of the polls on 7 8 election day.

(d) The county election officer shall allow a person to assist a sick, 9 physically disabled or illiterate voter in applying for or marking an appli-10 cation or advance voting ballot, provided a written statement is signed by 11 the person who renders assistance to the sick, physically disabled or illit-12 erate voter and submitted to the county election officer with the appli-13 cation or ballot. The statement shall be on a form prescribed by the 14 secretary of state and shall contain a statement from the person providing 15 assistance that the person has not exercised undue influence on the voting 16 decision of the sick, physically disabled or illiterate voter and that the 17 person providing assistance has completed the application or marked the 18 ballot as instructed by the sick, physically disabled or illiterate voter. 19

(e) Any person assisting a sick, physically disabled or illiterate voter
in applying for or marking an advance voting ballot who knowingly and
willfully fails to sign and submit the statement required by this section or
who exercises undue influence on the voting decision of such voter shall
be guilty of a severity level 9 nonperson felony.

25 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 25-1122, 25-1123 and 25-1124 are hereby repealed.

26 Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 27 publication in the statute book.

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
