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8 9 AN ACT relating to property taxation; reauthorizing the statewide edu-10 cation mill levy and the exemption therefrom; amending K.S.A. 2000 11 Supp. 72-6431 and 79-201x and repealing the existing sections. 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 72-6431 is hereby amended to read as 14 15 follows: 72-6431. (a) The board of each district shall levy an ad valorem tax upon the taxable tangible property of the district in the school years 16 17 specified in subsection (b) for the purpose of: (1) Financing that portion of the district's general fund budget which 18 19 is not financed from any other source provided by law; 20 paying a portion of the costs of operating and maintaining public 21 schools in partial fulfillment of the constitutional obligation of the legis-22 lature to finance the educational interests of the state; and 23 (3) with respect to any redevelopment district established prior to 24 July 1, 1997, pursuant to K.S.A. 12-1771, and amendments thereto, pay-25 ing a portion of the principal and interest on bonds issued by cities under 26 authority of K.S.A. 12-1774, and amendments thereto, for the financing 27 of redevelopment projects upon property located within the district. The tax required under subsection (a) shall be levied at a rate of 28 (b) 20 mills in the 1999 2000 school year and in the 2000 01 2001-02 school 29 30 year and in the 2002-03 school year. 31 (c) The proceeds from the tax levied by a district under authority of 32 this section, except the proceeds of such tax levied for the purpose of 33 paying a portion of the principal and interest on bonds issued by cities under authority of K.S.A. 12-1774, and amendments thereto, for the fi-34 35 nancing of redevelopment projects upon property located within the district, shall be deposited in the general fund of the district. 36 37 On June 1 of each year, the amount, if any, by which a district's (d) local effort exceeds the amount of the district's state financial aid, as 38 determined by the state board, shall be remitted to the state treasurer. 39 40 Upon receipt of any such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the 41 same in the state treasury to the credit of the state school district finance 42 fund. 43 (e) No district shall proceed under K.S.A. 79-1964, 79-1964a or 791 1964b, and amendments to such sections.

2 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-201x is hereby amended to read as fol-3 lows: 79-201x. For taxable years 1999 and 2000 *2001* and *2002*, the fol-4 lowing described property, to the extent herein specified, shall be and is 5 hereby exempt from the property tax levied pursuant to the provisions of 6 K.S.A. 72-6431, and amendments thereto: Property used for residential 7 purposes to the extent of \$20,000 of its appraised valuation.

8 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 72-6431 and 79-201x are hereby repealed.
