

## SENATE BILL No. 207

AN ACT concerning diplomatic immunities and privileges; relating to reports by law enforcement officers.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

Section 1. (a) When a law enforcement officer stops a person operating a vehicle within this state who the law enforcement officer has probable cause to believe has committed a violation of the uniform act regulating traffic and such person displays a driver's license issued by the United States department of state or who otherwise claims immunities or privileges under title 22, chapter 6 of the U.S.C., the law enforcement officer shall:

(1) As soon as practicable, contact the United States department of state office in order to verify the person's status and immunity, if any;

(2) record all relevant information from any driver's license or identification card, including a driver's license or identification card issued by the United States department of state; and

(3) within five working days after the date of the stop, forward the following to the bureau of diplomatic security office of foreign missions, of the United States department of state:

(A) A vehicle accident report, if the person was involved in a vehicle accident;

(B) if a citation or other charging document was issued to the person, a copy of the citation or other charging document; and

(C) if a citation or other charging document was not issued to the person, a written report of the incident.

(b) The provisions of this section do not prohibit or limit the application of any law to a criminal or motor vehicle violation by an individual who has or claims immunities or privileges under title 22 of the United States code.

(c) If any provision of this section or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this section which can be given effect without the invalid provision or applications, and, to this end, the provisions of this section are severable.
