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12 AN ACT enacting the voluntary political contributions act of 2001.

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14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

15 Section 1. (a) This act shall be known and may be cited as the vol-16 untary political contributions act of 2001.

17(b) No officer or employee of the state of Kansas, any county, any 18 unified school district having 35,000 or more pupils regularly enrolled in 19 the preceding school year, any city of the first class or the board of public 20 utilities of the unified government of Wyandotte county/Kansas City, 21Kansas, responsible for the disbursement of funds in payment of wages 22 or salaries shall withhold or divert a portion of an employee's wages or 23salaries for contributions to political committees for use as political con-24tributions except upon the written request of the employee. The request 25shall be made only on a form prescribed by the Kansas governmental 26 ethics commission which form shall contain a clear and unambiguous 27 statement that the employee may choose not to make such request for 28deduction and may opt to not return the form to the employer. The form 29 may only be filled out as to the amount of deduction by the employee 30 and must be signed by the employee in order to be valid. The request 31 shall be valid for no more than 12 months from the date it is signed.

32 Sec. 2. No officer or employee of any municipality or political sub-33 division of the state described in K.S.A. 25-901, and amendments thereto, 34 responsible for the disbursement of funds in payment of wages or salaries 35 shall withhold or divert a portion of an employee's wages or salaries for 36 contributions to political committees or for use as political contributions 37 except upon the written request of the employee. The request shall be 38 made only on a form prescribed by the Kansas governmental ethics com-39 mission which form shall contain a clear and unambiguous statement that 40the employee may choose not to make such request for deduction and 41 may opt to not return the form to the employer. The form may only be 42 filled out as to the amount of deduction by the employee and must be 43 signed by the employee in order to be valid. The request shall be valid

for no more than 12 months from the date it is signed.
