8 9 AN ACT relating to drivers' licenses; concerning the expiration thereof; 10 amending K.S.A. 8-240 and 8-247 and repealing the existing sections. 11 12 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:* 13 Section 1. K.S.A. 8-240 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-240. 14 (a) Every application for an instruction permit shall be made upon a form 15furnished by the division of vehicles and accompanied by a fee of \$2 for 16 class A, B, C or M and \$5 for all commercial classes. Every other appli-17cation shall be made upon a form furnished by the division and accom-18 panied by an examination fee of \$3, unless a different fee is required by 19 K.S.A. 8-241, and amendments thereto, and by the proper fee for the 20 license for which the application is made. If the applicant is not required 21to take an examination the examination fee shall not be required. The 22 examination shall consist of three tests, as follows: (1) Vision; (2) written; 23and (3) driving. If the applicant fails the vision test, the applicant may 24have correction of vision made and take the vision test again without any 25additional fee. If an applicant fails the written test, the applicant may take 26 such test again upon the payment of an additional examination fee of 27 \$1.50. If an applicant fails the driving test, the applicant may take such 28test again upon the payment of an additional examination fee of \$1.50. If 29 an applicant fails to pass all three of the tests within a period of six months 30 from the date of original application and desires to take additional tests, 31 the applicant shall file an application for reexamination upon a form fur-32 nished by the division, which shall be accompanied by a reexamination 33 fee of \$3, except that any applicant who fails to pass the written or driving 34 portion of an examination four times within a six-month period, shall be 35 required to wait a period of six months from the date of the last failed 36 examination before additional examinations may be given. Upon the filing 37 of such application and the payment of such reexamination fee, the ap-38 plicant shall be entitled to reexamination in like manner and subject to 39 the additional fees and time limitation as provided for examination on an 40 original application. If the applicant passes the reexamination, the appli-41 cant shall be issued the classified driver's license for which the applicant 42 originally applied, which license shall be issued to expire as if the applicant 43 had passed the original examination.

(b) (1) For the purposes of obtaining any driver's license, an appli-1 cant shall submit, with the application, proof of age or proof of identity, 2 3 or both, as the division may require.

(2) An applicant who submits proof of age or of identity issued by an 4 entity other than a state or the United States shall also submit such proof 56 as the division may require that the applicant is lawfully present in the 7 United States.

(3) The division shall not issue any driver's license to any person who 8 9 is not lawfully present in the United States.

10 The division shall not issue any driver's license to any person who (4)11 is not a resident of the state of Kansas, except as provided in K.S.A. 8-2,148, and amendments thereto. 12

(5) The parent or guardian of an applicant under 16 years of age shall 13 14sign the application for any driver's license submitted by such applicant. 15(c) Every application shall state the name, date of birth, sex and res-16 idence address of the applicant, and briefly describe the applicant, and 17shall state whether the applicant has theretofore been licensed as a driver, 18and, if so, when and by what state or country, and whether any such 19license has ever been suspended or revoked, or whether an application 20has ever been refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for such suspen-21sion, revocation or refusal. In addition to the above criteria, applications 22 for commercial drivers' licenses and instruction permits for commercial 23 licenses must include the following: The applicant's social security num-24ber; the person's signature; the person's color photograph; certifications, 25including those required by 49 C.F.R. 383.71(a), effective January 1, 1991; a consent to release driving record information; and, any other 26 27 information required by the division.

28(d) When an application is received from a person previously licensed 29 in another jurisdiction, the division shall request a copy of the driver's 30 record from the other jurisdiction. When received, the driver's record 31 shall become a part of the driver's record in this state with the same force 32 and effect as though entered on the driver's record in this state in the 33 original instance.

34 (e) When the division receives a request for a driver's record from 35 another licensing jurisdiction the record shall be forwarded without 36 charge. 37

A fee shall be charged as follows: (f)

(1) For a class C driver's license issued to a person at least 21 years 38 39 of age, but less than 65 years of age, \$12;

(2) for a class C driver's license issued to a person less than 21 years 40of age or 65 years of age or older, or a farm permit, \$8 \$6; 41

42 (3) for a class M driver's license issued to a person at least 21 years 43 of age, but less than 65 years of age, \$6.50;

(4) for a class M driver's license issued to a person less than 21 years of age or 65 years of age or older, \$5 \$3.75; 2

3 (5) for a class A or B driver's license issued to a person who is at least 21 years of age, but less than 65 years of age, \$18; 4

 $\mathbf{5}$ (6) for a class A or B driver's license issued to a person less than 21 6 years of age or 65 years of age or older, \$12; or

(7) for any class of commercial driver's license, \$14.

A fee of \$10 shall be charged for each commercial driver's license 8 9 endorsement, except air brake endorsements which shall have no charge.

10 If one fails to make an original application or renewal application for a 11 driver's license within the time required by law, or fails to make appli-12 cation within 60 days after becoming a resident of Kansas, a penalty of 13 \$1 shall be added to the fee charged for the driver's license.

14 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 8-247 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-247. (a) 15All original licenses shall expire as follows:

16 Licenses issued to persons who are at least 21 years of age, but (1)17less than 65 years of age shall expire on the sixth anniversary of the date 18 of birth of the licensee which is nearest the date of application;

19 (2) licenses issued to persons who are less than 21 years of age or are 2065 years of age or older shall expire on the fourth third anniversary of 21the date of birth of the licensee which is nearest the date of application; 22 or

23(3) any commercial drivers license shall expire on the fourth anni-24versary of the date of birth of the licensee which is nearest the date of 25application. All renewals under paragraph (1) shall expire on every sixth 26 anniversary of the date of birth of the licensee; all renewals under para-27 graph (2) shall expire on every third anniversary of the date of birth of the licensee and all renewals under paragraphs (2) and paragraph (3) shall 2829 expire on every fourth anniversary of the date of birth of the licensee. No 30 driver's license shall expire in the same calendar year in which the original 31 license or renewal license is issued, except that if the foregoing provisions 32 of this section shall require the issuance of a renewal license or an original 33 license for a period of less than six calendar months, the license issued 34 to the applicant shall expire in accordance with the provisions of this 35 subsection.

36 (b) If the driver's license of any person expires while such person is outside of the state of Kansas and on active duty in the armed forces of 37 the United States, the license of such person shall be renewable, without 38 39 examination, at any time prior to the end of the sixth month following the 40discharge of such person from the armed forces, or within 90 days after reestablished residence within the state, whichever time is sooner. If the 4142 driver's license of any person expires while such person is outside the

43 United States, the division shall provide for renewal by mail.

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1 (c) At least 30 days prior to the expiration of a person's license the 2 division shall mail a notice of expiration or renewal application to such 3 person at the address shown on the license. The division shall include 4 with such notice a copy of the eyesight examination form and a copy of 5 the written examination prescribed by subsection (e). In addition, a copy 6 of the Kansas driver's manual, prepared pursuant to K.S.A. 8-266b, and 7 amendments thereto, also shall be included.

(d) Every driver's license shall be renewable on or before its expira-8 9 tion upon application and payment of the required fee and successful 10 completion of the examinations required by subsection (e). Application 11 for renewal of a valid driver's license shall be made to the division in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of reve-12nue. Such application shall contain all the requirements of subsection (b) 13 14 of K.S.A. 8-240, and amendments thereto. Upon satisfying the foregoing 15requirements of this subsection, and if the division makes the findings 16 required by K.S.A. 8-235b, and amendments thereto, for the issuance of 17an original license, the license shall be renewed without examination of 18 the applicant's driving ability. If the division finds that any of the state-19 ments relating to revocation, suspension or refusal of licenses required 20under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-240, and amendments thereto, are in 21the affirmative, or if it finds that the license held by the applicant is not 22 a valid one, or if the applicant has failed to make application for renewal 23of such person's license on or before the expiration date thereof, the 24division may require the applicant to take an examination of ability to 25exercise ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a motor ve-26 hicle as provided in K.S.A. 8-235d, and amendments thereto.

27 (e) (1) Prior to renewal of a driver's license, the applicant shall pass 28an examination of eyesight and a written examination of ability to read 29 and understand highway signs regulating, warning and directing traffic 30 and knowledge of the traffic laws of this state. Such examination shall be 31 equivalent to the tests required for an original driver's license under 32 K.S.A. 8-235d, and amendments thereto. A driver's license examiner shall 33 administer the examinations without charge and shall report the results 34 of the examinations on a form provided by the division, which shall be 35 submitted by the applicant to the division at the time such applicant 36 applies for license renewal.

(2) In lieu of the examination of the applicant's eyesight by the examiner, the applicant may submit a report on the examination of eyesight by a physician licensed to practice medicine and surgery or by a licensed optometrist. The report shall be based on an examination of the applicant's eyesight not more than three months prior to the date the report is submitted, and it shall be made on a form furnished the applicant with the notice of the expiration of license under subsection (c).

(3) In lieu of the driver's license examiner administering the written
examination, the applicant may complete the examination furnished with
the notice of the expiration of license under subsection (c) and submit
the completed examination to the division.

5 (4) The division shall determine whether the results of the written 6 examination and the eyesight reported are sufficient for renewal of the 7 license and, if the results of either or both of the examinations are insuf-8 ficient, the division shall notify the applicant of such fact and return the 9 license fee. In determining the sufficiency of an applicant's eyesight, the 10 division may request an advisory opinion of the medical advisory board, 11 which is hereby authorized to render such opinions.

12 (5) An applicant who is denied a license under this subsection (e) 13 may reapply for renewal of such person's driver's license, except that if 14 such application is not made within 90 days of the date the division sent 15notice to the applicant that the license would not be renewed, the appli-16 cant shall proceed as if applying for an original driver's license. If the 17applicant has been denied renewal of such person's driver's license because such applicant failed to pass the written examination, the applicant 1819 shall pay an examination fee of \$1.50 to take the test again.

20 (6) When the division has good cause to believe that an applicant for 21 renewal of a driver's license is incompetent or otherwise not qualified to 22 operate a motor vehicle in accord with the public safety and welfare, the 23division may require such applicant to submit to such additional exami-24nations as are necessary to determine that the applicant is qualified to 25receive the license applied for. Subject to paragraph (7) of this subsection, 26 in so evaluating such qualifications, the division may request an advisory 27 opinion of the medical advisory board which is hereby authorized to ren-28der such opinions in addition to its duties prescribed by subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-255b, and amendments thereto. Any such applicant who is de-29 30 nied the renewal of such a driver's license because of a mental or physical 31 disability shall be afforded a hearing in the manner prescribed by sub-32 section (c) of K.S.A. 8-255, and amendments thereto.

33 Seizure disorders which are controlled shall not be considered a (7)disability. In cases where such seizure disorders are not controlled, the 34 35 director or the medical advisory board may recommend that such person 36 be issued a driver's license to drive class C or M vehicles and restricted 37 to operating such vehicles as the division determines to be appropriate 38 to assure the safe operation of a motor vehicle by the licensee. Restricted 39 licenses issued pursuant to this paragraph shall be subject to suspension 40or revocation. For the purpose of this paragraph, seizure disorders which are controlled means that the licensee has not sustained a seizure involv-4142 ing a loss of consciousness in the waking state within six months preceding the application or renewal of a driver's license and whenever a person 43

licensed to practice medicine and surgery makes a written report to the division stating that the licensee's seizures are controlled. The report shall be based on an examination of the applicant's medical condition not more than three months prior to the date the report is submitted. Such report shall be made on a form furnished to the applicant by the division. Any $\mathbf{5}$ physician who makes such report shall not be liable for any damages which may be attributable to the issuance or renewal of a driver's license and subsequent operation of a motor vehicle by the licensee. (f) If the driver's license of any person expires while such person is outside the state of Kansas, the license of such person shall be extended for a period not to exceed six months and shall be renewable, without a driving examination, at any time prior to the end of the sixth month fol-lowing the original expiration date of such license or within 10 days after such person returns to the state, whichever time is sooner. Sec. 3. K.S.A. 8-240 and 8-247 are hereby repealed. Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after Jan-uary 1, 2003, and its publication in the statute book.
