AN ACT concerning retirement and pensions; relating to the Kansas
public employees retirement system; employment after retirement;
amending K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-4914 and repealing the existing
section.

14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

15Section 1. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-4914 is hereby amended to read as 16 follows: 74-4914. (1) The normal retirement date for a member of the 17system shall be the first day of the month coinciding with or following 18 termination of employment with any participating employer not followed 19 by employment with any participating employer within 30 days and the 20 attainment of age 65 or, commencing July 1, 1993, age 62 with the com-21 pletion of 10 years of credited service or the first day of the month co-22 inciding with or following the date that the total of the number of years 23of credited service and the number of years of attained age of the member 24is equal to or more than 85. In no event shall a normal retirement date 25for a member be before six months after the entry date of the participating 26 employer by whom such member is employed. A member may retire on 27 the normal retirement date or on the first day of any month thereafter 28upon the filing with the office of the retirement system of an application 29 in such form and manner as the board shall prescribe. Nothing herein 30 shall prevent any person, member or retirant from being employed, ap-31 pointed or elected as an employee, appointee, officer or member of the 32 legislature. Elected officers may retire from the system on any date on 33 or after the attainment of the normal retirement date, but no retirement 34 benefits payable under this act shall be paid until the member has ter-35 minated such member's office.

36 (2) No retirant shall make contributions to the system or receive serv-37 ice credit for any service after the date of retirement.

(3) Any member who is an employee of an affiliating employer pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4954b and amendments thereto and has not withdrawn
such member's accumulated contributions from the Kansas police and
firemen's retirement system may retire before such member's normal
retirement date on the first day of any month coinciding with or following
the attainment of age 55.

1 (4) Any member may retire before such member's normal retirement 2 date on the first day of any month coinciding with or following termination 3 of employment with any participating employer not followed by employment with any participating employer within 30 days and the attainment 4 of age 55 with the completion of 10 years of credited service, but in no 56 event before six months after the entry date, upon the filing with the 7 office of the retirement system of an application for retirement in such form and manner as the board shall prescribe. 8

9 (5)If a retirant who retired on or after July 1, 1988, is employed or 10 appointed in or to any position or office for which compensation for serv-11 ice is paid in an amount equal to \$15,000 or more in any one such calendar year, by any participating employer for which such retirant was employed 1213 or appointed during the final two years of such retirant's participation, 14 such retirant shall not receive any retirement benefit for any month for 15which such retirant serves in such position or office. The participating 16 employer shall report to the system within 30 days of when the compen-17sation paid to the retirant is equal to or exceeds any limitation provided 18 by this section. Any retirant employed by a participating employer shall 19 not make contributions nor receive additional credit under such system 20 for such service except as provided by this section. Upon request of the 21 executive director of the system, the secretary of revenue shall provide 22 such information as may be needed by the executive director to carry out 23the provisions of this act. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply 24to retirants employed as substitute teachers or officers, employees or 25appointees of the legislature. On and after July 1, 2002, the provisions of 26 this subsection shall not apply to retirants employed as teachers. The 27 provisions of this subsection shall not apply to members of the legislature 28prior to January 8, 2000. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply 29 to any other elected officials prior to the term of office of such elected 30 official which commences on or after July 1, 2000. The provisions of this 31 subsection shall apply to any other elected official on and after the term 32 of office of such other elected official which commences on or after July 33 1, 2000. Except as otherwise provided, commencing January 8, 2001, the 34 provisions of this subsection shall apply to members of the legislature. 35 For determination of the amount of compensation paid pursuant to this 36 subsection, for members of the legislature, compensation shall include 37 any amount paid as provided pursuant to subsections (a), (b), (c) and (d) 38 of K.S.A. 46-137a, and amendments thereto, or pursuant to K.S.A. 46-39 137b, and amendments thereto. Notwithstanding any provision of law to 40the contrary, when a member of the legislature is paid an amount of compensation of \$15,000 or more in any one calendar year, the member 4142 may continue to receive any amount provided in subsections (b) and (d) of K.S.A. 46-137a, and amendments thereto, and still be entitled to re-43

1 ceive such member's retirement benefit.

(6) For purposes of this section, any employee of a local governmental unit which has its own pension plan who becomes an employee of a participating employer as a result of a merger or consolidation of services provided by local governmental units, which occurred on January 1, 1994, may count service with such local governmental unit in determining whether such employee has met the years of credited service requirements contained in this section.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-4914 is hereby repealed.

10 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 11 publication in the statute book.

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
