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20 AN ACT concerning the Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative act; 21providing for certain funding; amending K.S.A. 8-145 and K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1222, 73-1224, 73-1225, 73-1226, 73-1227, 73-1230 and 73-22 23 1231 and repealing the existing sections. 24

25Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

26 Section 1. K.S.A. 8-145 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-145. 27 (a) All registration and certificates of title fees shall be paid to the county 28treasurer of the county in which the applicant for registration resides or 29 has an office or principal place of business within this state, and the county 30 treasurer shall issue a receipt in triplicate, on blanks furnished by the division of vehicles, one copy of which shall be filed in the county trea-31 surer's office, one copy shall be delivered to the applicant and the original 32 33 copy shall be forwarded to the director of vehicles. (b) The county treasurer shall deposit \$.75 of each license applica-34 35 tion, \$.75 out of each application for transfer of license plate and \$2 out 36 of each application for a certificate of title, collected by such treasurer under this act, in a special fund, which fund is hereby appropriated for 37 38 the use of the county treasurer in paying for necessary help and expenses incidental to the administration of duties in accordance with the provi-39

40 sions of this law and extra compensation to the county treasurer for the

41 services performed in administering the provisions of this act, which com-42 pensation shall be in addition to any other compensation provided by any

43 other law, except that the county treasurer shall receive as additional

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1	compensation for administering the motor vehicle title and registration
2	laws and fees, a sum computed as follows: The county treasurer, during
3	the month of December, shall determine the amount to be retained for
4	extra compensation not to exceed the following amounts each year for
5	calendar year 1990 or any calendar year thereafter: The sum of \$60 per
6	hundred registrations for the first 5,000 registrations; the sum of \$45 per
7	hundred registrations for the next 5,000 registrations; and the sum of \$2
8	per hundred registrations for all registrations thereafter. In no event,
9	however, shall any county treasurer be entitled to receive more than
10	\$9,800 additional annual compensation.
11	<u>— If more than one person shall hold the office of county treasurer during</u>
12	any one calendar year, such compensation shall be prorated among such
13	persons in proportion to the number of weeks served. The total amount
14	of compensation paid the treasurer together with the amounts expended
15	in paying for other necessary help and expenses incidental to the admin-
16	istration of the duties of the county treasurer in accordance with the
17	provisions of this act, shall not exceed the amount deposited in such spe-
18	eial fund. Any balance remaining in such fund at the close of any calendar
19	year shall be withdrawn and credited to the general fund of the county
20	prior to June 1 of the following calendar year.
21	(e) The county treasurer shall remit the remainder of all such fees
22	collected, together with the original copy of all applications, to the see-
23	retary of revenue. The secretary of revenue shall remit all such fees re-
24	mitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A.
25	75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance,
26	the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury
27	to the credit of the state highway fund, except as provided in subsection
28	(d).
29	<u>(d)</u> (1) On July 1, 1997, through June 30, 2004, \$2.50 of each certif-
30	icate of title fee collected and remitted to the secretary of revenue, shall
31	be remitted to the state treasurer who shall eredit such \$2.50 to the
32	Kansas highway patrol motor vehicle fund. On July 1, 1999, through June
33	30, 2002, \$1 of each certificate of title fee collected and remitted to the
34	secretary of revenue, shall be remitted to the state treasurer who shall
35	eredit such \$1 to the VIPS/CAMA technology hardware fund.
36	(2) For repossessed vehicles, \$3 of each certificate of title fee col-
37	lected and remitted to the secretary of revenue, shall be remitted to the
38	state treasurer who shall credit such \$3 to the repossessed certificates of
39	title fee fund.
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- (3) The state treasurer shall credit the first \$100,000 of registration fees deposited in accordance with subsection (c), which are attributable to license plates issued under K.S.A. 8-160, 8-177a, 8-177c, 8-1,139, 8-1,140, 8-1,145 and 8-1,146, and amendments thereto, to the Persian Gulf

1 War veterans health initiative fund.

Sec. 2. 1. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1222 is hereby amended to read as 2 3 follows: 73-1222. As used in K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1221 through 73-1231, 4 and amendments thereto, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: "Birth defect" means any physical or mental abnormality or con-(a) 6 dition, including any susceptibility to any illness or condition other than 7 normal childhood illnesses or conditions.

(b) "Board" means the Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative 8 9 board established by K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1223, and amendments 10 thereto.

11 (c) "Commission" means the Kansas commission on veterans affairs. 12 "Director" means the executive director of the Kansas commis-(d) sion on veterans affairs. 13

14 (e) "Gulf War syndrome" "Gulf War illness" means the wide range 15of physical and mental conditions, problems and illnesses that are con-16 nected with service in the armed forces of the United States during and 17in the area of operations of the Persian Gulf War.

"Veteran" means a person who is a resident of Kansas who was a 18 (f) 19 member of the armed forces of the United States of America and who 20 served in such armed forces in the area of operations of the Persian Gulf 21War during the Persian Gulf War or thereafter regardless of whether such 22 person is still actively serving in the armed forces or reserve.

23Sec. 3. **2.** K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1224 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1224. (a) The commission shall develop comprehensive sur-2425veys, or adopt one or more existing surveys, to be conducted to determine 26 and study the physical and mental conditions, problems and illnesses, 27including birth defects, as well as the employment, social, emotional and 28family problems experienced by veterans, their spouses and family mem-29bers since the veteran's return to Kansas and by any other persons resid-30 ing in Kansas who are suffering from Gulf War syndrome illness.

31 (b) The commission shall develop or adopt the surveys within the first 32 four months after the effective date of this act. The commission shall 33 administer the surveys and review the completed surveys with the board. 34 The commission shall compile the results of the surveys and develop recommendations for the legislature based thereon. The director shall 35 36 report the results to appropriate federal agencies and shall request ad-37 ditional assistance for veterans commensurate with the director's duties under K.S.A. 73-1209, and amendments thereto. 38

39 (c) The aggregate amount expended for the development and ad-40ministration of surveys and studies set out under this section and for board expenses, including the position established by K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-4142 1225, and amendments thereto, shall not exceed \$100,000 per fiscal year. 43 (d) The commission shall request the different media, including ra-

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dio, television and newspaper, to make public service announcements
publicizing information on the Persian Gulf War surveys and inform Kansans of the health problems identified and where help is available. The
public service announcements should be published no less than four times
a year.

6 (e) The commission may conduct research or provide funding for re-7 search on Gulf War illness.

Sec. 4. 3. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1225 is hereby amended to read as 8 9 follows: 73-1225. There is hereby established with the commission a full-10 time position dedicated to seeking and applying for grants and other mon-11 eys to fund activities under this act, to assist in the preparation and administration of surveys under this act, to promote programs and activities 12designed to assist persons affected by Gulf War syndrome illness to re-13 14 ceive the help they need, to assist in conducting research or providing funding for research on Gulf War illness and to perform such other duties 15as the chairperson of the commission may prescribe. Within 90 days of 16 17the effective date of this act, the commission shall appoint a qualified 18individual to this position.

19 Sec. 5. 4. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1226 is hereby amended to read as 20follows: 73-1226. (a) The commission shall request that the department of health and environment contact families of any children born after 2122 August 1, 1991, who are on any state birth defect list maintained by the 23department, to inform the families of the availability of the survey and 24the registry if either parent served in the Persian Gulf War. If the family 25voluntarily participates in the survey, the veteran's child's name shall be 26 listed in the state Persian Gulf War registry.

(b) The commission shall determine the appropriate health programs
and the confidential mechanisms that shall be utilized to ask participants
in such programs whether they are Persian Gulf War veterans, and if so,
offer the veterans voluntary participation in the survey under K.S.A. 2001
Supp. 73-1224, and amendments thereto.

(c) The commission shall establish and maintain a state Persian Gulf
War registry containing the names of veterans, their spouses, family members and other persons in Kansas who have been affected by Gulf War
syndrome illness.

36 (d) The commission shall inform veterans of any state and federal37 programs available to meet the veterans' needs.

(e) Any person who in good faith provides information to the commission under the provisions of this section shall be immune from civil
or criminal liability therefor.

41 Sec. 6. 5. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1227 is hereby amended to read as 42 follows: 73-1227. Subject to funds available, the commission shall conduct 43 a fiscal impact study, aimed at identifying the annual budgetary impact of Gulf War syndrome illness on Kansas in terms of increased costs of
 education, medical coverage, correction of birth defects and other ex penses identified through the results of the surveys conducted under
 K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1224, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 7. 6. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1230 is hereby amended to read as 56 follows: 73-1230. The Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall coop-7 erate and share information with appropriate state and federal agencies as necessary for the purposes of this act to aid veterans and other persons 8 9 in obtaining aid and relief from the effects of Gulf War syndrome illness. 10 Such cooperation shall include reporting the survey statistics to appro-11 priate federal agencies to bring issues to the notice of appropriate 12 agencies.

13 Sec. 8. 7. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1231 is hereby amended to read as 14follows: 73-1231. There is hereby established in the state treasury the 15Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative fund which shall be adminis-16 tered by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs. All moneys received 17from any grants from federal or other nonstate sources, from contribu-18 tions or from any other source for the purpose of financing the activities 19 of the board or the development or administration of the surveys devel-20 oped by the board under this act, shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments 2122 thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall 23deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the Persian 24Gulf War veterans health initiative fund. All expenditures from the Per-25sian Gulf War veterans health initiative fund shall be for the purposes of 26 financing the activities of the commission for the implementation and 27 administration, including the activities of the board and, the development 28and administration of the surveys under this act and the conducting or 29 funding of research on Gulf War illness and shall be made in accordance 30 with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and 31 reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the Kansas commission 32 on veterans affairs or the commission's designee.

New Sec. 8. On July 1, 2002, or as soon thereafter as moneys
 are available, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer
 \$100,000 from the state general fund to the Persian Gulf War vet erans health initiative fund.

Sec. 9. K.S.A. 8-145 and K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1222, 73-1224, 73 1225, 73-1226, 73-1227, 73-1230 and 73-1231 are hereby repealed.

39 Sec. 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its40 publication in the statute book.

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
