AN ACT concerning the Kansas law enforcement training commission;
requiring reimbursement of tuition and actual expense in certain situations; amending K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-5609a and repealing the existing section.

14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

15 Section 1. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-5609a is hereby amended to read 16 as follows: 74-5609a. (a) The law enforcement training center is author-17ized to charge tuition for each railroad policeman, each employee of a 18 tribal law enforcement agency and each school law enforcement officer 19 enrolled in a course at the training center. Such tuition shall not exceed 20 the training center's average operating cost per trainee. Tuition charges 21authorized by this section shall cover the cost of room, board and all 22 necessary instructional supplies and material for any railroad policeman 23 or school law enforcement officer attending the law enforcement training 24center.

25(b) Any city, county or state agency which commences employment 26 of a police officer or law enforcement officer within one year of the time 27 such police officer or law enforcement officer has completed a course of 28instruction at a state or local law enforcement training school shall reimburse the city, county or state agency which paid the tuition for training 29 30 such officer. This reimbursement shall include the amount of the tuition 31 paid, the officer's salary and travel expenses and any other expenses in-32 curred which were incidental to training such officer. This reimbursement 33 shall not exceed the actual expenses incurred during the state-mandated 34 portion of the basic training for the officer's tuition, salary and benefits, 35 travel to and from the basic training site and any unrecoverable uniform 36 and equipment expenses.

37 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-5609a is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the statute book.
