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9	AN ACT concerning emergency medical services; establishing a graduate
10	level of certification; amending K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 65-6112, 65-6120,
11	65-6121, 65-6123 and 65-6133 and repealing the existing sections; also
12	repealing K.S.A. 65-6122.
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14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
15	Section 1. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 65-6112 is hereby amended to read as
16	follows: 65-6112. As used in this act, unless the context clearly shows
17	otherwise:
18	(a) "Administrator" means the administrator of the emergency med-
19	ical services board.
20	(b) "Ambulance" means any privately or publicly owned motor ve-
21	hicle, airplane or helicopter designed, constructed, prepared and
22	equipped for use in transporting and providing emergency care for in-
23	dividuals who are ill or injured.
24	(c) "Ambulance service" means any organization operated for the
25	purpose of transporting sick or injured persons to or from a place where
26	medical care is furnished, whether or not such persons may be in need
27	of emergency or medical care in transit.
28	(d) "Attendant" means a first responder, emergency medical tech-
29	nician, emergency medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical
30	technician-defibrillator or, a mobile intensive care technician or a para-
31	<i>medic</i> certified pursuant to this act.
32	(e) "Board" means the emergency medical services board established
33	pursuant to K.S.A. 65-6102, and amendments thereto.
34	(f) "Emergency medical service" means the effective and coordinated
35	delivery of such care as may be required by an emergency which includes
36	the care and transportation of individuals by ambulance services and the
37	performance of authorized emergency care by a physician, professional
38	nurse, a licensed physician assistant or attendant.
39	(g) "Emergency medical technician" means a person who holds an
40	emergency medical technician certificate issued pursuant to this act.
41	(h) "Emergency medical technician-defibrillator" means a person
42	who holds an emergency medical technician defibrillator certificate issued
43	pursuant to this act.

1	(i) "Emergency medical technician-intermediate" means a person
2	who holds an emergency medical technician intermediate certificate is-
3	sued pursuant to this act.
4	(i) "Final managed and " and a second a helder (instrument of the second s

4 (j) "First responder" means a person who holds a first responder cer-5 tificate issued pursuant to this act.

6 (k) "Hospital" means a hospital as defined by K.S.A. 65-425, and 7 amendments thereto.

8 (l) "Instructor-coordinator" means a person who is certified under 9 this act to teach initial courses of certification of instruction and contin-10 uing education classes.

11 (m) "Medical adviser" means a physician.

(n) "Medical protocols" mean written guidelines which authorize attendants to perform certain medical procedures prior to contacting a physician, or professional nurse authorized by a physician. These protocols
shall be developed and approved by a county medical society or, if there
is no county medical society, the medical staff of a hospital to which the
ambulance service primarily transports patients.

(o) "Mobile intensive care technician" means a person who holds a
mobile intensive care technician certificate or a paramedic certificate issued pursuant to this act.

21 (p) "Municipality" means any city, county, township, fire district or 22 ambulance service district.

(q) "Nonemergency transportation" means the care and transport of a sick or injured person under a foreseen combination of circumstances calling for continuing care of such person. As used in this subsection, transportation includes performance of the authorized level of services of the attendant whether within or outside the vehicle as part of such transportation services.

(r) "Operator" means a person or municipality who has a permit tooperate an ambulance service in the state of Kansas.

(s) "Paramedic" means a person who holds a mobile intensive care
 technician certificate or a paramedic certificate issued pursuant to this
 act.

34 (s)(t) "Person" means an individual, a partnership, an association, a 35 joint-stock company or a corporation.

36 (t) (u) "Physician" means a person licensed by the state board of 37 healing arts to practice medicine and surgery.

(u) (v) "Physician assistant" means a person who is licensed under the physician assistant licensure act and who is acting under the direction

40 of a responsible physician in accordance with K.S.A. 65-28a01 et seq. and

41 amendments thereto.

42 (\mathbf{w}) (*w*) "Professional nurse" means a licensed professional nurse as 43 defined by K.S.A. 65-1113, and amendments thereto. 1 $(\mathbf{w})(\mathbf{x})$ "Provider of training" means a corporation, partnership, ac-2 credited postsecondary education institution, ambulance service, fire de-3 partment, hospital or municipality that conducts training programs that 4 include, but are not limited to, initial courses of instruction and continuing 5 education for attendants, instructor-coordinators or training officers.

9 (y)(z) "Training officer" means a person who is certified pursuant to 10 this act to teach initial courses of instruction for first responders and 11 continuing education as prescribed by the board.

12 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 65-6120 is hereby amended to read as 13 follows: 65-6120. (*a*) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the 14 contrary, an emergency medical technician-intermediate may:

15 (a)(1) Perform any of the activities identified by K.S.A. 65-6121, and 16 amendments thereto;

(b) (2) when approved by medical protocols and where voice contact 1718 by radio or telephone is monitored by a physician, physician's assistant 19 where authorized by a physician or licensed professional nurse where 20 authorized by a physician, and direct communication is maintained, upon order of such person, may perform veni-puncture for the purpose of 2122 blood sampling collection and initiation and maintenance of intravenous infusion of saline solutions, dextrose and water solutions or ringers lactate 23 24IV solutions, endotracheal intubation and administration of nebulized 25albuterol;

26 (c) (3) perform, during an emergency, those activities specified in
27 subsection (2) before contacting the persons identified in subsection (2)
28 when specifically authorized to perform such activities by medical pro29 tocols; or

(b) The board may adopt rules and regulations authorizing other
techniques of patient care that an emergency medical technician-intermediate may provide after considering:

10 (b) (2) when approved by medical protocols and where voice contact 11 by radio or telephone is monitored by a physician, physician's assistant where authorized by a physician or licensed professional nurse where 12 authorized by a physician, and direct communication is maintained, upon 13 14 order of such person, may perform electrocardiographic monitoring and 15defibrillation;

(e) (3) perform, during an emergency, those activities specified in 16 subsection (b) paragraph (2) before contacting the persons identified in 17subsection (b) paragraph (2) when specifically authorized to perform 18 such activities by medical protocols; or 19

20(d) (4) perform, during nonemergency transportation, those activities 21specified in this section when specifically authorized to perform such 22 activities by medical protocols.

(b) The board may adopt rules and regulations authorizing other 2324techniques of patient care that an emergency medical technician-defibril-25lator may provide after considering:

34 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 65-6133 is hereby amended to read as 35 follows: 65-6133. (a) An attendant's or instructor-coordinator's certificate 36 may be denied, revoked, limited, modified or suspended by the board or the board may refuse to renew such certificate upon proof that such 37 38 individual:

39 (1)Has made intentional misrepresentations in obtaining a certificate or renewing a certificate; 40

(2) has performed or attempted to perform activities not authorized 41

42 by statute or rule and regulation at the level of certification held by the individual; 43

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1	(3) has demonstrated incompetence as defined by rules and regula-
2	tions adopted by the board or has provided inadequate patient care as
3	determined by the board;
4	(4) has violated or aided and abetted in the violation of any provision
5	of this act or the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder;
6	(5) has been convicted of a felony and, after investigation by the
7	board, it is determined that such person has not been sufficiently reha-
8	bilitated to warrant the public trust;
9	(6) has demonstrated an inability to perform authorized activities with
10	reasonable skill and safety by reason of illness, alcoholism, excessive use
11	of drugs, controlled substances or any physical or mental condition; or
12	(7) has engaged in unprofessional conduct, as defined by rules and
13	regulations adopted by the board.
14	(b) The board may limit, modify, revoke or suspend an attendant's or
15	instructor-coordinator's certificate or the board may refuse to renew such
16	certificate in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas administrative
17	procedure act.
18	Sec. 6. K.S.A. 65-6122 and K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 65-6112, 65-6120, 65-
19	6121, 65-6123 and 65-6133 are hereby repealed.
20	Sec. 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
21	publication in the statute book.
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
