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8 9 AN ACT concerning community colleges; relating to determination of 10 operating grants; amending K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 71-620 and repealing 11 the existing section. 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14 Section 1. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 71-620 is hereby amended to read as 15follows: 71-620. (a) In each fiscal year, commencing with the 2001 fiscal 16 year, each community college is entitled to an operating grant from the 17state general fund in an amount to be determined by the state board. The 18 state board shall: 19 (1) Determine the average amount of moneys from the state general 20 fund expended per FTE lower division undergraduate student in the 21preceding fiscal year at the regional state educational institutions; 22 (2) (A) in the 2001 fiscal year, compute 50% of the amount deter-23mined under (1); (B) in the 2002 fiscal year, compute 55% of the amount 24determined under (1); (C) in the 2003 fiscal year, compute 60% of the 25amount determined under (1); in the 2004 fiscal year and in each fiscal 26 year thereafter, compute 65% of the amount determined under (1); 27 determine the total number of FTE students of all the community (3)28colleges; (4) multiply the amount computed under (2) by the total number of 29 30 FTE students determined under (3). The product is the total amount of 31 operating grants the community colleges are entitled to receive for the 32 fiscal year. 33 Each community college which is not an officially designated area (5)34 vocational school shall receive an amount equivalent to the difference 35 between credit hour state aid received in the 1999 fiscal year for credit 36 hours in any subject or course approved as a vocational education subject 37 or course and 11/6 times the amount of credit hour state aid received in 38 the 1999 fiscal year for credit hours in any subject or course approved as 39 a vocational education subject or course. The amount determined under 40 this provision shall be distributed in equal installments in the 2001 41 through 2004 fiscal years as a part of the community college's operating 42 grant, but shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 71-204, and 43 amendments thereto.

1 (6) In each fiscal year, the state board, for the purpose of allocating 2 the amount determined under (4) to the community colleges, shall deduct 3 the total of the amounts determined under (5) from the amount deter-4 mined under (4).

5 (7) In the 2001 fiscal year, the remaining balance determined under 6 (6) shall be allocated to each community college according to the ratio 7 the total amount of state aid received by the community college in the 8 2000 fiscal year bears to the total amount of state aid received by all 9 community colleges in the 2000 fiscal year, subject to adjustments for 10 changes in each community college's FTE enrollment from the 2000 fis-11 cal year to the 2001 fiscal year.

12 (8) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (e), in the 2002 fiscal 13 year and in each fiscal year thereafter, the remaining balance determined 14 under (6) shall be allocated to each community college according to the 15ratio the amount of the operating grant received by the community col-16 lege in the prior fiscal year bears to the total amount of operating grants 17received by all community colleges in the prior fiscal year, subject to 18 adjustments for changes in each community college's FTE enrollment 19 from the prior fiscal year to the current fiscal year.

20 (b) In each fiscal year, commencing with the 2003 fiscal year, each 21community college is eligible to receive a quality performance grant from 22 the state general fund. If the state board determines that the community 23college has demonstrated effectiveness in complying with its role and 24mission statement and has met or exceeded the core indicators of quality 25performance for community colleges identified and approved by the state board, the community college shall receive a quality performance grant 26 27 in an amount which shall be determined by the state board by computing 282% of the amount of the operating grant the community college received 29 in the preceding fiscal year. The computed amount is the amount of the 30 quality performance grant the community college shall receive for the 31 fiscal year.

(c) For the purposes of this section, the FTE enrollment of the community college shall be based on: (1) Enrollment of students who are residents of the state of Kansas, or are considered residents of the state of Kansas pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 71-407, and amendments thereto; and (2) the greater of FTE enrollment of the community college in the current fiscal year or FTE enrollment in the preceding fiscal year.

(d) As used in this section, the term regional state educational institutions means Emporia state university, Fort Hays state university and
Pittsburg state university and the term lower division undergraduate student means a freshman or sophomore.

43 (e) Commencing with the 2003 fiscal year, the amount of the oper-

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ating grant a community college is entitled to for a fiscal year under this

2 section shall not be less than the amount that the community college would

3 have been entitled to under the provisions of this section prior to its

4 amendment by section 1 of chapter 158 of the 2000 Session Laws of Kan5 sas on July 1, 2000, if such provisions were still in effect and had not been

amended by section 1 of chapter 158 of the 2000 Session Laws of Kansas.

7 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 71-620 is hereby repealed.

8 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 9 publication in the statute book.
