AN ACT dealing with the legislature; extending the privilege to members
of the legislature in court proceedings; amending K.S.A. 46-125 and
46-126 and repealing the existing sections.

14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

15Section 1. K.S.A. 46-125 is hereby amended to read as follows: 46-16 125. (a) That from and after the fifteenth day preceding the day on which 17any regular or special session of the legislature of this state shall convene, 18 and until the tenth day after adjournment is taken sine die, members of 19 the legislature of this state shall not be required to appear in any court 20 in this state and participate in the trial of any action therein pending, or 21the hearing of any motion, application or other proceeding in which such 22 member is employed as attorney or interested as a party; and no such 23member shall be required to attend the taking of any depositions in any 24action pending in any court in this state in which he is employed during 25the whole of said such period of time, except in cases where the court 26 shall, in its discretion, make an order authorizing the taking of such 27 deposition.

28(b) On any day an interim committee of the legislature meets, any 29 member of the legislature who is also a member of the interim committee 30 shall not be required to appear in any court in this state and participate 31 in the trial of any action therein pending, or the hearing of any motion, 32 application or other proceeding in which such member is employed as 33 attorney or interested as a party. No such member shall be required to 34 attend the taking of any depositions in any action pending in any court 35 in this state in which the member is employed on that day or days the 36 interim committee meets, except in cases where the court shall, in its 37 discretion, make an order authorizing the taking of such deposition.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 46-126 is hereby amended to read as follows: 46-126.
(*a*) That any member of the legislature who may have a case pending in any court in this state, may have the same continued until the legislature shall adjourn sine die in the manner hereafter provided for.

42 (b) Any member of the legislature who may have a case pending in 43 any court in this state, may have the same continued on any day or days an interim committee of the legislature meets.
