K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 72-7108 is hereby amended to read as 23 follows: 72-7108. (a) Transfers of territory from one unified district to 24another unified district shall be made only as follows: (a) 25Upon the written agreement of any two boards approved by the (1)26 state board of education;; or (b) 27 (2) upon order of the state board after petition therefor by one board 28and a public hearing thereon conducted by the state board of education. 29 (b) The effective date of any such transfer shall be the date of ap-30 proval thereof or order therefor issued by the state board of education or 31 the July 1 following. 32 (c) Notice of the public hearing on such a petition shall be given by 33 publication by the state board of education *at least once each week* for 34 two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the unified 35 district from which territory is to be transferred, the last publication to 36 be not more than 10 nor less than three days prior to the date of the 37 hearing. 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2 (f) Whenever a petition for transfer of territory has been denied by 3 the state board of education, no petition for transfer of substantially the 4 same territory shall be received or considered by the state board of ed-5 ucation for a period of two years.

6 [New Sec. 2. The state board of education shall adopt rules 7 and regulations for administration and effectuation of the provi-8 sions of this act and, in accordance therewith, may issue an initial 9 license to teach in this state to any person who successfully com-10 pletes the alternate teacher preparation program. 11 [New See. 3. As used in this act: [(a) "Alternate teacher preparation program" means a pro-12 13 gram which is provided for by the state board of education under contractual arrangements with an accredited Kansas teacher ed-14 15ucation institution having an approved teacher education program and with accredited schools and which is designed to ensure the 16 17attainment of the basic competencies necessary to engagement in the profession of teaching through correlation of professional de-18 19 velopment study at the teacher education institution with practical 20 experience at an accredited school. 21 [(b) "Teacher licensure applicant" means a person who applies 22 under authority of this act for an initial license to teach in this state. 23 [New Sec. 4. (a) The alternate teacher preparation program 24will require a teacher licensure applicant to complete: 25-[(1) Nine semester hours of professional development study at the teacher education institution. Professional development study 26 shall include, but not be limited to, study of adolescent psychology, 27 28foundations of education, elassroom management, and methodol-29 ogy. Professional development study may be taken during a sum-30 mer or regular session and must be completed by the applicant 31 prior to entry into the elassroom; 32 -[(2) a 10 contact hour preservice orientation conducted by the 33 employing accredited school prior to a classroom assignment. Orientation shall include familiarization with school policies, proce-34 35 dures, curriculum, instructional model, community characteristics, 36 and resources; 37 -[(3) an internship of two school years (four semesters). During internship, the applicant will be enrolled in three credit hours of 38 39 internship each semester. The contact and delivery system will be determined by the teacher education institution. At the successful 4041
