HOUSE BILL No. 2972

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9 AN ACT concerning school districts; relating to school site councils; 10 amending K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 72-6439 and repealing the existing section.

13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

14 Section 1. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 72-6439 is hereby amended to read as 15follows: 72-6439. (a) In order to accomplish the mission for Kansas ed-16 ucation, the state board of education shall design and adopt a school 17performance accreditation system based upon improvement in perform-18 ance that reflects high academic standards and is measurable.

19 (b) The state board of education shall provide for assessments in the 20 core academic areas of mathematics, science, reading, writing, and social 21 studies, and shall establish curriculum standards for such core academic 22 areas. The assessments shall be administered at three grade levels, as 23determined by the state board. The curriculum standards shall be equal 24to the best standards and shall be reviewed at least every three years. The 25state board shall ensure compatibility between the statewide assessments 26 and the curriculum standards. Nothing in this subsection shall be con-27 strued in any manner so as to impinge upon any district's authority to 28determine its own curriculum.

29 (c) The state board of education shall determine performance levels 30 on the statewide assessments, the achievement of which represents ex-31 cellence in the academic area at the grade level to which the assessment 32 applies. The state board should specify the measure of excellence both 33 for individual performance and school performance on the assessments.

34 (d) Each school in every district shall establish a school site council 35 composed of the principal and representatives of teachers and other 36 school personnel, parents of pupils attending the school, the business 37 community, and other community groups. School site councils shall be 38 responsible for providing advice and counsel in evaluating state, school 39 district, and school site performance goals and objectives and in deter-40mining the methods that should be employed at the school site to meet

these goals and objectives. School site councils may also be involved in 41

42 reviewing budgets, making suggested budget cuts, assisting administra-

43 tion with site-based management as mutually agreed upon, reviewing cur-

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riculum, reviewing textbooks, evaluating teachers, and any other assis-1 tance deemed necessary. 2 3 (e) On or before January 1, 1997, the state board of education shall prepare a public education performance report card consisting of state-4 wide aggregated data pertaining to performance on statewide assessments 56 and other measurable performance indicators specified by the state board 7 as part of the accreditation system. The report card shall be designed to show comparative data over multiple years, as determined by the state 8 9 board. In addition to the public education performance report card, the 10 state board shall prepare a school building report card for each school 11 building operated by a district and shall provide the board of each district 12 with information showing the statewide data and school building data, 13 including multiple year data. 14 (f) Under the direction of Kansas, Inc., and subject to appropriations 15therefor, a study evaluating changes in pupil performance attributable to the school accreditation system shall be conducted between July 1 and 16 November 30, 1997. The main purpose of the study shall be to ascertain, 17through evaluation of the 48 school districts that began implementation 1819 of the school performance accreditation process in the 1991-92 school 20 year, the extent of the change in pupil academic performance under the 21system and to provide an explanation of the factors that have contributed materially to the changes that have occurred. The study shall be based 22 on data for the 1996-97 school year. The results of the study shall be 2324reported to the legislature at the commencement of the 1998 session. Kansas, Inc. shall convene an advisory committee for assistance in de-2526 signing the study, providing direction for the conducting of research, analyzing research findings, and preparing the report of the results of the 27 study. The advisory committee shall consist of not less than seven and 2829 not more than 11 members and shall be representative of the state board of education, teachers, school administrators, boards of education, busi-30 ness, and the public. Members of the advisory committee attending meet-31 32 ings of the committee or subcommittee meetings authorized by Kansas,

Inc. shall be paid amounts provided for in subsection (e) of K.S.A. 75 3223, and amendments thereto.

35 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 72-6439 is hereby repealed.
