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House Concurrent Resolution No. 5055

A PROPOSITION to amend section 8 of article 2 of the constitution of 9 10 the state of Kansas, relating to legislative sessions. 11 12 Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, two-thirds of the 13 members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Repre-14sentatives and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and 15 qualified to the Senate concurring therein: 16 Section 1. The following proposition to amend the constitution of the 17 state of Kansas shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the state 18 for their approval or rejection: Section 8 of article 2 of the constitution 19 of the state of Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows: 20 "§ 8. Organization and sessions. The legislature shall meet 21in regular session annually commencing on the second Monday in 22 January, and as provided by law. All sessions shall be held at the 23 state capital. The duration of regular sessions held in even-num-24bered years shall not exceed ninety calendar days. Such sessions 25may be extended beyond ninety calendar days by an affirmative vote 26 of two-thirds of the members elected to each house. Bills and con-27 current resolutions under consideration by the legislature upon adjournment of a regular session held in an odd-numbered year may 28 29 be considered at the next succeeding regular session held in an 30 even-numbered year, as if there had been no such adjournment. 31 The legislature shall be organized concurrently with the terms of

32 representatives except that the senate shall remain organized during 33 the terms of senators. The president of the senate shall preside over the senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives shall 34 35 preside over the house of representatives. A majority of the mem-36 bers then elected (or appointed) and qualified of the house of rep-37 resentatives or the senate shall constitute a quorum of that house. 38 Neither house, without the consent of the other, shall adjourn for more than two days, Sundays excepted. Each house shall elect its 39 40 presiding officer and determine the rules of its proceedings, except 41 that the two houses may adopt joint rules on certain matters and 42 provide for the manner of change thereof. Each house shall provide

43 for the expulsion or censure of members in appropriate cases. Each

1	house shall be the judge of elections, returns and qualifications of
2	its own members."
3	Sec. 2. The following statement shall be printed on the ballot with
4	the amendment as a whole:

- *Explanatory statement.* The purpose of this amendment is to authorize the legislature to provide by statute for the time of commencement of regular legislative sessions.
- 8 "A vote for this amendment would favor authorizing the legislature
 9 to provide by statute for the time of commencement of regular
 10 legislative sessions.
- "A vote against this amendment would favor making no change in
 the current constitutional provision establishing the time for
 commencement of regular legislative sessions."

Sec. 3. This resolution, if approved by two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Representatives and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the Senate, shall be entered on the journals, together with the yeas and nays. The secretary of state shall cause this resolution to be published as pro-vided by law and shall cause the proposed amendment to be submitted to the electors of the state at the general election in the year 2002 unless a special election is called at a sooner date by concurrent resolution of the legislature, in which case it shall be submitted to the electors of the state at the special election.
