27 (c) This section shall not apply to the state economic development 28initiatives fund, the children's initiatives fund or the state water plan fund 29 or any account of any of such funds.

30 Sec. 30. [80.] During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, all moneys 31 which are lawfully credited to and available in any bond special revenue 32 fund, which are not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited by this 33 or other appropriation act of the 2002 regular session of the legislature, 34 are hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, for the 35 state agency for which the bond special revenue fund was established for 36 the purposes authorized by law for expenditures from such bond special 37 revenue fund. As used in this subsection, "bond special revenue fund" 38 means any special revenue fund or account thereof established in the 39 state treasury prior to or on or after the effective date of this act for the 40 deposit of the proceeds of bonds issued by the Kansas development fi-41 nance authority, for the payment of debt service for bonds issued by the 42 Kansas development finance authority, or for any related purpose in ac-

43 cordance with applicable bond covenants.

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1 Sec. 31. [81.] *Federal grants*. (a) During the fiscal year ending June 2 30, 2003, each federal grant or other federal receipt which is received by 3 a state agency named in this act and which is not otherwise appropriated 4 to that state agency by this or other appropriation act of the 2002 regular 5session of the legislature, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending 6 June 30, 2003, for that state agency for the purpose set forth in such 7 federal grant or receipt, except that no expenditure shall be made from and no obligation shall be incurred against any such federal grant or other 8 9 federal receipt, which has not been previously appropriated or reappro-10 priated or approved for expenditure by the governor, until the governor 11 has authorized the state agency to make expenditures therefrom. This 12 subsection shall not apply to any state agency named in section 99 of 13 chapter 144 of the 2001 Session Laws of Kansas.

14(b) During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, each federal grant 15or other federal receipt which is received by a state agency named in 16 section 99 of chapter 144 of the 2001 Session Laws of Kansas and which 17is not otherwise appropriated to that state agency for fiscal year 2003 by 18 chapter 144 or chapter 216 of the 2001 Session Laws of Kansas or by this 19 or other appropriation act of the 2002 regular session of the legislature, 20 is hereby appropriated for fiscal year 2003 for that state agency for the 21 purpose set forth in such federal grant or receipt, except that no expend-22 iture shall be made from and no obligation shall be incurred against any 23 such federal grant or other federal receipt, which has not been previously 24appropriated or reappropriated or approved for expenditure by the gov-25ernor, for fiscal year 2003, until the governor has authorized the state 26 agency to make expenditures from such federal grant or other federal 27 receipt for fiscal year 2003.

28(c) In addition to the other purposes for which expenditures may be 29 made by any state agency which is named in this act or other appropriation 30 act of the 2002 regular session of the legislature and which is not other-31 wise authorized by law to apply for and receive federal grants, expendi-32 tures may be made by such state agency from moneys appropriated for 33 fiscal year 2003 by chapter 144 or chapter 216 of the 2001 Session Laws 34 of Kansas or by this or other appropriation act of the 2002 regular session 35 of the legislature to apply for and receive federal grants during fiscal year 36 2003, which federal grants are hereby authorized to be applied for and 37 received by such state agencies: Provided, That no expenditure shall be 38 made from and no obligation shall be incurred against any such federal 39 grant or other federal receipt, which has not been previously appropriated 40or reappropriated or approved for expenditure by the governor, until the 41 governor has authorized the state agency to make expenditures there-42 from.

43 Sec. <u>32.</u> [82.] Any correctional institutions building fund appropria-

1 tion heretofore appropriated to any state agency named in this or other 2 appropriation act of the 2002 regular session of the legislature, and having 3 an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2002, in excess of \$100 is hereby 4 reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, for the same uses 5 and purposes as originally appropriated unless specific provision is made 6 for lapsing such appropriation.

Sec. <u>33.</u> [83.] Any Kansas educational building fund appropriation heretofore appropriated to any institution named in this or other appropriation act of the 2002 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2002, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, for the same use and purpose as originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such appropriation.

Sec. <u>34.</u> [84.] Any state institutions building fund appropriation heretofore appropriated to any state agency named in this or other appropriation act of the 2002 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2002, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, for the same use and purpose as originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such appropriation.

Sec. <u>35.</u> [85.] Any transfers of money during the fiscal year ending
June 30, 2003, from any special revenue fund of any state agency named
in this act to the audit services fund of the division of post audit under
K.S.A. 46-1121 and amendments thereto shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation imposed on any such fund for the fiscal year ending
June 30, 2003.

27 Sec. <u>36.</u> [86.] This act shall take effect and be in force from and after 28 its publication in the Kansas register.

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
