(a) The director of the Kansas bureau of investigation may fix, charge and collect fees in order to recover all or part of the direct and indirect operating expenses for criminal history record checks conducted for noncriminal justice entities including government agencies and private organizations.

moneys received by or for the director from fees collected under this
section to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A.

The fees shall be fixed in order to recover 5 all of the direct data processing expenses incurred in preparation of re-6 quested water data.

7 (b) The secretary of agriculture shall remit all moneys received by or 8 for the secretary from fees collected under this section to the state trea-9 surer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amend-10 ments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer 11 shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the 12 water rights information system fees fund of the Kansas department of 13 agriculture.

Sec. 40. 35. (a) The director of the Kansas water office may fix, charge and collect fees for training and informational programs provided by the Kansas water office. The fees for such program shall be fixed in order to recover all or part of the operating expenses incurred for such programs, including official hospitality.

(b) The director of the Kansas water office shall remit all moneys
received by or for the director from fees collected under this section to
the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215,
and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state
treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit
of the general fees fund of the Kansas water office.

Sec. 41. 36. (a) The secretary of wildlife and parks may fix, charge and collect fees for the provision of aircraft services to other state agencies. The fees shall be fixed to recover all or part of the operating expenditures incurred in providing such services.

(b) The secretary of wildlife and parks shall remit all moneys received by or for the secretary from fees collected under this section to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the central aircraft fund of the department of wildlife and parks.

Sec. 42. 37. (a) The secretary of transportation may fix, charge and collect fees for motor vehicle fuel sold to the Kansas highway patrol. The fees shall be fixed in order to recover all or part of the expenses incurred in providing motor vehicle fuel to the Kansas highway patrol.

(b) The secretary of transportation shall remit all moneys received by or for the secretary from fees collected under this section to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit 1 of the interagency motor vehicle fuel sales fund of the department of 2 transportation.

3 Sec. 43. 38. (a) The secretary of transportation may fix, charge and 4 collect conference, training and workshop attendance and registration 5 fees for conferences, training seminars and workshops sponsored or cos-6 ponsored by the department of transportation.

7 (b) The secretary of revenue *transportation* shall remit all moneys 8 received by or for the secretary from fees collected under this section to 9 the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, 10 and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state 11 treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit 12 of the conference fees account of the state highway fund of the depart-13 ment of transportation.

Sec. 44. 39. (a) The division of post audit may fix, charge and collect fees for copies of public records of the division, including distribution of such copies. The fees shall be fixed to recover all or part of the expenses incurred for reproducing and distributing such copies and shall be consistent with policies and fees established in accordance with K.S.A. 46-1207a and amendments thereto.

(b) The division of post audit shall remit all moneys received by or for the division from fees collected under this section to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the audit services fund of the division of post audit.

Sec. 45. 40. (a) The governor may fix, charge and collect fees for special programs or conferences sponsored by the governor. Fees for such special programs or conferences shall be fixed in order to recover all or part of the operating expenses incurred for such special programs or conferences, including official hospitality.

31 (b) The governor shall remit all moneys received by or for the gov-32 ernor from fees collected under this section and all fees received by the 33 governor's department under the open records act for providing access 34 to or furnishing copies of public records to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. 35 36 Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit 37 the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the special programs fund of the governor's department. 38
