(a) Any person having a permanent disability to the extent that such 17person cannot physically use a conventional long bow or compound bow, as certified by a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery in this 1819 state the healing arts in any state or a Christian Science practitioner listed 20in the Christian Science journal, shall be authorized to hunt and take 21deer, antelope, elk or wild turkey with a crossbow. 22 (b) The secretary of wildlife and parks shall adopt, in accordance with 23K.S.A. 32-805, and amendments thereto, rules and regulations requiring 24permits to hunt deer, antelope, elk or wild turkey pursuant to subsection 25(a) and providing for the approval of applicants for such permits and the issuance thereof. In addition, the secretary may adopt rules and regula-26 27 tions limiting the times and areas for hunting and taking deer, antelope, 28elk and wild turkey and limiting the number of deer, antelope, elk and 29 wild turkey which may be taken pursuant to subsection (a). 30 Falsely obtaining or using a permit authorized by this section is a (c) 31 class C misdemeanor. 32 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 32-933 is hereby amended to read as follows: 32-933. 33 (a) Any person having a permanent physical or visual disability such that 34 the person cannot safely hunt or fish in accordance with law and rules 35 and regulations of the department, as certified by a person licensed to 36 practice optometry or medicine and surgery in this state the healing arts 37 in any state, or a person licensed to practice optometry in any state or a Christian Science practitioner listed in the Christian Science journal, shall 38 39 be eligible to obtain a disability assistance permit. The permit shall allow the permitholder to designate another person to take, on behalf of and 40while accompanied by the permitholder, the permitholder's legal limit of 4142 game or fish. The person designated shall hold all licenses, permits, 43 stamps or other issues of the department required for the activity being engaged in and the permitholder shall remain subject to all other laws
and rules and regulations of the department for the activity being engaged
in. On the determination of the secretary, the disability assistance permit
may designate the hunting or fishing activity for which assistance to the
permitholder may be provided.

6 (b) The secretary shall adopt, in accordance with K.S.A. 32-805, and 7 amendments thereto, rules and regulations providing for the approval of 8 applicants for permits pursuant to subsection (a) and for the issuance of 9 such permits.

10 (c) Falsely obtaining or using a permit authorized by this section is a 11 class C misdemeanor.
