9 AN ACT concerning the state board of healing arts; relating to the ex-10 clusion of certain team physicians from the licensure requirement; 11 amending K.S.A. 65-2869 and 65-2872 and repealing the existing 12 sections. 13

14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

15Section 1. K.S.A. 65-2869 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-16 2869. For the purpose of this act the following persons shall be deemed 17to be engaged in the practice of medicine and surgery:

18 (a) Persons who publicly profess to be physicians or surgeons, or pub-19 licly profess to assume the duties incident to the practice of medicine or 20 surgery or any of their branches.

21(b) Persons who prescribe, recommend or furnish medicine or drugs, 22 or perform any surgical operation of whatever nature to sever, penetrate, 23 destroy or alter body tissue by the use of any surgical instrument, pro-24cedure, equipment or mechanical device for the diagnosis, cure or relief 25of any wounds, fractures, bodily injury, infirmity, disease, physical or mental illness or psychological disorder, or for cosmetic or figurative purposes 26 27 of human beings.

28Persons who attach to their name the title M.D., surgeon, physi-(c) 29 cian, physician and surgeon, or any other word or abbreviation indicating 30 that they are engaged in the treatment or diagnosis of ailments, diseases 31 or injuries of human beings.

32 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 65-2872 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-33 2872. The practice of the healing arts shall not be construed to include 34 the following persons:

35 Persons rendering gratuitous services in the case of an emergency. (a)

Persons gratuitously administering ordinary household remedies. (b)

The members of any church practicing their religious tenets pro-37 (c) 38 vided they shall not be exempt from complying with all public health regulations of the state. 39

Students while in actual classroom attendance in an accredited 40(d) 41 healing arts school who after completing one (1) year's study treat diseases 42 under the supervision of a licensed instructor.

43 Students upon the completion of at least three (3) years study in (e)

an accredited healing arts school and who, as a part of their academic
 requirements for a degree, serve a preceptorship not to exceed ninety
 (90) 90 days under the supervision of a licensed practitioner.

4 (f) Persons who massage for the purpose of relaxation, muscle con-5 ditioning, or figure improvement, provided no drugs are used and such 6 persons do not hold themselves out to be physicians or healers.

(g) Persons whose professional services are performed under the supervision or by order of or referral from a practitioner who is licensed
under this act.

(h) Persons in the general fields of psychology, education and social
work, dealing with the social, psychological and moral well-being of individuals and/or groups provided they do not use drugs and do not hold
themselves out to be the physicians, surgeons, osteopathic physicians or
chiropractors.

(i) Practitioners of the healing arts in the United States army, navy,
air force, public health service, and coast guard or other military service
when acting in the line of duty in this state.

(j) Practitioners of the healing arts licensed in another state when and
while incidentally called into this state in consultation with practitioners
licensed in this state, or residing on the border of a neighboring state,
duly licensed under the laws thereof to practice a branch of the healing
arts, but who do not open an office or maintain or appoint a place to
regularly meet patients or to receive calls within this state.

(k) Dentists practicing their professions, when licensed and practicing in accordance with the provisions of article 14 of chapter 65 of the
Kansas Statutes Annotated, or and amendments thereto, and any interpretation thereof by the supreme court of this state.

(l) Optometrists practicing their professions, when licensed and practicing under and in accordance with the provisions of article 15 of chapter
65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, or and amendments thereto, and any interpretation thereof by the supreme court of this state.

(m) Nurses practicing their profession when licensed and practicing
under and in accordance with the provisions of article 11 of chapter 65
of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, or and amendments thereto, and any
interpretation thereof by the supreme court of this state.

(n) Podiatrists practicing their profession, when licensed and practicing under and in accordance with the provisions of article 20 of chapter
65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, or and amendments thereto, and
any interpretation thereof by the supreme court of this state.

40 (o) Every act or practice falling in the field of the healing art, not 41 specifically excepted herein, shall constitute the practice thereof.

(p) Pharmacists practicing their profession, when licensed and prac-ticing under and in accordance with the provisions of article 16 of chapter

65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, or and amendments thereto, and
 any interpretation thereof by the supreme court of this state.

3 (q) A dentist licensed in accordance with the provisions of article 14 4 of chapter 65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, *and amendments thereto*, 5 who administers general and local anesthetics to facilitate medical pro-6 cedures conducted by a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery 7 if such dentist is certified by the board of healing arts under K.S.A. 65-8 2899, *and amendments thereto*, to administer such general and local 9 anesthetics.

(r) Practitioners of the healing arts licensed in another state when
traveling into this state with a participant in any organized school or
professional athletic program organized in another state if the practitioner
has previously agreed with a person who is licensed to engage in a branch
of the healing arts in this state to be available for emergencies or necessary
referrals.

16 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 65-2869 and 65-2872 are hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the statute book.
