AN ACT concerning controlled substances; relating to methampheta-9 mine and other substances; prohibited acts and penalties therefor; 11 amending K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 21-3718, 65-4152 and 65-7006 and re-12 pealing the existing sections. 13

14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

15New Section 1. (a) Except as otherwise provided, no person shall 16 deliver in any single over-the-counter sale more than three packages of 17any methamphetamine precursor drug or any combination of metham-18phetamine precursor drugs.

19 (b) The provisions of this section shall not apply to any product la-20 beled pursuant to federal regulation for use only in children under 12 21years of age, or to any products that the state department of health and 22 environment, upon application of a manufacturer, exempts by rule and 23regulation from this section because the product has been formulated in 24such a way as to effectively prevent the conversion of the active ingredient 25into methamphetamine, or its salts or precursors.

26 (c) Any person who is considered the general owner or operator of 27 the outlet where ephedrine, pseudoephedrine or phenylpropanolamine 28products are available for sale who violates subsection (a) shall not be 29 penalized pursuant to this section if such person documents that an em-30 ployee training program was in place to provide the employee with in-31 formation on the state and federal rules and regulations regarding ephed-32 rine, pseudoephedrine or phenylpropanolamine.

33 (d) As used in this section, "methamphetamine precursor drug" 34 means any drug containing ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, phenylpropan-35 olamine or any of their salts, optical isomers or salts of optical isomers.

36 (e) Any person who knowingly or recklessly violates any provision of 37 this section is guilty of a class A nonperson misdemeanor.

38 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 21-3718 is hereby amended to read as 39 follows: 21-3718. (a) Arson is: (1) Knowingly, by means of fire or explosive: 40(1) (A) Damaging any building or property which is a dwelling in 41 which another person has any interest without the consent of such other

intent to injure or defraud an insurer or lienholder; 1

(3) (C) damaging any building or property which is not a dwelling in 2 3 which another person has any interest without the consent of such other 4 person; or

(4) (D) damaging any building or property which is not a dwelling 5with intent to injure or defraud an insurer or lienholder; or 6

7 (2) accidently, by means of fire or explosive as a result of manufacturing or attempting to manufacture a controlled substance in violation 8 9 of K.S.A. 65-4159, and amendments thereto, damaging any building or 10 property.

Arson, as described in subsections subsection (a)(1)(A) or (2) 11 (b) (1), (a)(1)(B) or (a)(2), is a severity level 6, person felony. 12

13 (2) Arson, as described in subsections (a)(3) or (4) subsection 14 (a)(1)(C) or (a)(1)(D), is a severity level 7, nonperson felony.

15Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 65-4152 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-4152. (a) No person shall use or possess with intent to use: 16 17

Any simulated controlled substance; (1)

18 any drug paraphernalia to use, store, contain, conceal, inject, in-(2)19 gest, inhale or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled 20substance in violation of the uniform controlled substances act;

21 any drug paraphernalia to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, har-(3)22 vest, manufacture, compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, repack, sell or distribute a controlled substance in violation 2324of the uniform controlled substances act; or

25anhydrous ammonia for the illegal production of a controlled sub-(4)stance or pressurized ammonia in a container not approved for that chem-26 27 ical by the Kansas department of agriculture.

(b) Violation of subsections subsection (a)(1) or (a)(2) is a class A 2829 nonperson misdemeanor.

30 (c) Violation of subsection (a)(3), other than as described in para-31 graph (d), or subsection (a)(4) is a drug severity level 4 felony.

32 (d) Violation of subsection (a)(3) which involves the possession of 33 drug paraphernalia for the planting, propagation, growing or harvesting of less than five marijuana plants is a class A nonperson misdemeanor. 34

35 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 65-7006 is hereby amended to read as 36 follows: 65-7006. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to possess ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, red phosphorus, lithium metal, sodium metal, io-37 dine, anhydrous ammonia, pressurized ammonia or phenylpropanolam-38 ine, or their salts, isomers or salts of isomers with intent to use the product 39

40as a precursor to any illegal to manufacture a controlled substance. (b) It shall be unlawful for any person to market, sell, distribute, ad-41

vertise, or label any drug product containing ephedrine, pseudoephed-42

rine, red phosphorus, lithium metal, sodium metal, iodine, anhydrous am-43

monia, pressurized ammonia or phenylpropanolamine, or their salts,
isomers or salts or isomers if the person knows or reasonably should know
that the purchaser will use the product as a precursor to any illegal to *manufacture a controlled* substance.

5 (c) It shall be unlawful for any person to market, sell, distribute, ad-6 vertise or label any drug product containing ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, 7 or phenylpropanolamine, or their salts, isomers or salts of isomers for 8 indication of stimulation, mental alertness, weight loss, appetite control, 9 energy or other indications not approved pursuant to the pertinent federal 10 over-the-counter drug final monograph or tentative final monograph or 11 approved new drug application.

12 (d) A violation of this section shall be a drug severity level ± 2 felony.
13 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 21-3718, 65-4152 and 65-7006 are hereby
14 repealed.

15 Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its16 publication in the statute book.
