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9	AN ACT concerning emergency medical technicians; relating to the ad-
10	ministration of epinephrine; amending K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 65-6121 and
11	repealing the existing section.

13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
14	Section 1. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 65-6121 is hereby amended to read as
15	follows: 65-6121. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the con-
16	trary, an emergency medical technician may perform any of the following
17	activities:
18	(a) Patient assessment and vital signs;
19	(b) airway maintenance including the use of:
20	(1) Oropharyngeal and nasopharyngeal airways;
21	(2) esophageal obturator airways with or without gastric suction
22	device;
23	(3) multi-lumen airway; and
24	(4) oxygen demand valves.
25	(c) Oxygen therapy;
26	(d) oropharyngeal suctioning;
27	(e) cardiopulmonary resuscitation procedures;
28	(f) control accessible bleeding;
29	(g) apply pneumatic anti-shock garment;
30	(h) manage outpatient medical emergencies;
31	(i) extricate patients and utilize lifting and moving techniques;
32	(j) manage musculoskeletal and soft tissue injuries including dressing
33	and bandaging wounds or the splinting of fractures, dislocations, sprains
34	or strains;
35	(k) use of backboards to immobilize the spine;
36	(l) administer syrup of ipecac, activated charcoal and, glucose and
37	epinephrine;
38	(m) monitor peripheral intravenous line delivering intravenous fluids
39	during interfacility transport with the following restrictions:
40	(1) The physician approves the transfer by an emergency medical
41	technician;
42	(2) no medications or nutrients have been added to the intravenous
43	fluids; and

1 (3) the emergency medical technician may monitor, maintain and 2 shut off the flow of intravenous fluid;

(n) use automated external defibrillators;

4 (o) perform, during nonemergency transportation, those activities 5 specified in this section when specifically authorized to perform such 6 activities by medical protocols; or

7 (p) when authorized by medical protocol, assist the patient in the 8 administration of the following medications which have been prescribed 9 for that patient: Auto-injection epinephrine, Sublingual nitroglycerin and 10 inhalers for asthma and emphysema.

11 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 65-6121 is hereby repealed.

12 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 13 publication in the statute book.
