SENATE BILL No. 605

By Committee on Commerce

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AN ACT concerning certain reports to the legislature and committees thereof; amending K.S.A. 44-1408 and 66-117b and K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-5049, 74-50,151, 74-50,152, 74-8004 and 74-8204 and repealing the existing sections.

15 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

16 Section 1. K.S.A. 44-1408 is hereby amended to read as follows: 44-171408. The secretary shall annually submit a report to the house economie 18 development new economy committee and the senate commerce com-19 mittee detailing the manner in which funds were spent pursuant to K.S.A. 20 44-1401, et seq., and amendment thereto. Such report shall include the 21 nature of the work performed by participating youths, the percentage of 22 funds expended for administrative expenses, findings on the educational, 23criminal and occupational disposition of participating youths and an eval-24uation of the program as a whole including a recommendation concerning 25continuation of the program. The report to the house new economy com-26 mittee and the senate commerce committee under this section shall be 27 made by the secretary by publishing such report on the internet and by notifying each member of the committee that the report is available and 2829providing, as part of such notice, the uniform resource locator (URL) at 30 which such report is available.

31 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 66-117b is hereby amended to read as follows: 66-32 117b. The state corporation commission shall report to the legislature in 33 accordance with this section on or before February 1 each year in regard to any changed rate, joint rate, toll, charge or classification or schedule 34 35 of charges, or any rule or regulation or practice pertaining to the service 36 or rates of a public utility or common carrier approved by the state cor-37 poration commission during the preceding fiscal year. Such report shall 38 contain statistical and narrative information as the state corporation com-39 mission deems appropriate. Such report need not include any information 40regarding any public utility or common carrier that had less than ten 41 million dollars \$10,000,000 annual operating revenues in the preceding calendar year. The report to the legislature under this section shall be 42 made by the state corporation commission by publishing such report on 43

the internet and by notifying the legislature that the report is available
 and providing, as part of such notice, the uniform resource locator (URL)
 at which such report is available.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-5049 is hereby amended to read as 4 $\mathbf{5}$ follows: 74-5049. (a) In order to insure that the department of commerce and housing is effectively administering this act, the department shall 6 7 cooperate with the standing committee on commerce of the senate, the standing committee on economic development new economy of the 8 9 house of representatives and the joint committee on economic develop-10 ment and Kansas, Inc. in the performance of an independent perform-11 ance review of the activities of the department and the departmental 12 divisions. The review shall include, but not be limited to: (1) An assess-13 ment of the impacts of the department's programs corresponding to the 14 strategic plans of the department and the departmental divisions; (2) a 15comparative assessment of the relative impact of the department's pro-16 grams with similar programs in other states; and (3) a comparative assessment of the targeting of the department's programs by size and sector 1718 of economic activity, and by location in different areas of the state. The 19 review shall be completed or updated at least once every three years.

20 (b) On or before October 1, the department shall prepare and publish 21an annual report, which shall be made widely available, of its activities 22 and expenditures for the information of the governor, the standing com-23mittee on commerce of the senate, the standing committee on economie 24development new economy of the house of representatives and the joint 25committee on economic development, Kansas, Inc. and the public, and 26 shall, from time to time, submit recommendations to the governor con-27 cerning legislation found to be necessary or desirable in effecting the purposes of this act. The annual report shall include any information 2829 which the department is required to report by law. The annual report 30 shall specifically account for the ways in which the purposes of the department and its divisions as described in this act have been achieved, 31 32 and the recommendations shall specifically note what changes in the ac-33 tivities of the department and its divisions, and of state government are necessary to better address the purposes described in this act. The annual 34 35 report to the standing committee on commerce of the senate, the standing 36 committee on new economy of the house of representatives and the joint 37 committee on economic development shall be made by the department by publishing such report on the internet and by notifying each member of 38 the committees that the report is available and providing, as part of such 39 40notice, the uniform resource locator (URL) at which such report is avail-41 able.

42 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-50,151 is hereby amended to read as 43 follows: 74-50,151. (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the Kansas economic opportunity initiatives fund. Subject to acts of the leg islature applicable thereto, the moneys in the Kansas economic oppor tunity initiatives fund shall be used only for the purposes prescribed by
 this section.

(b) All expenditures made pursuant to this act shall be made in ac-56 cordance with appropriations acts upon warrants of the director of ac-7 counts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the governor or the governor's designee. The governor may approve a warrant upon 8 9 certification, by the secretary of commerce and housing, that an economic 10 emergency or unique opportunity exists which warrant funding for a stra-11 tegic economic intervention by such state agency or agencies to address expenses involved in securing economic benefits or avoiding or remedying 12economic losses related to: 13

14 (1) A major expansion of an existing Kansas commercial enterprise;

15 (2) the potential location in Kansas of the operations of a major 16 employer;

(3) the award of a significant federal or private sector grant which hasa financial matching requirement;

(4) the departure from Kansas or the substantial reduction of the20 operations of a major employer; and

(5) the closure or the substantial reduction of a major federal or stateinstitution or facility.

23(c) An intervention strategy may include financial assistance in the 24form of grants, loans or both. The department of commerce and housing 25shall adopt written guidelines concerning the terms and conditions of any such loans. However, all repaid funds shall be credited to the Kansas 26 27 economic opportunity initiatives fund. No intervention strategy approved 28pursuant to this act shall facilitate the moving of an existing Kansas firm 29 to another location within the state unless such restriction is waived by 30 the secretary of commerce and housing. Every intervention strategy ap-31 proved pursuant to this act shall identify the intended outcomes to be 32 realized by the strategy for which funding is sought.

(d) The department of commerce and housing and Kansas, Inc. shall
make joint findings concerning the costs and benefits, on both a local and
statewide basis, of projects proposed pursuant to this act. Prior to allocation of any funds pursuant to this act, the governor shall review the
cost-benefit findings performed on each project.

(e) The director of the budget and the director of the legislative research department shall consult periodically and review the balance credited to and the estimated receipts to be credited to the state economic
development initiatives fund during the fiscal year. During any period
when the legislature is not in session, upon a finding by the director of
the budget in consultation with the director of the legislative research

department that the total of the unencumbered balance and estimated 1 receipts to be credited to the state economic development initiatives fund 2 3 during a fiscal year are insufficient to fund the budgeted expenditures and transfers from the state economic development initiatives fund for 4 the fiscal year in accordance with the provisions of appropriation acts, the 56 director of the budget shall make a certification of such finding to the 7 governor. Upon approval by the governor, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer the amount of moneys from the Kansas economic 8 9 opportunity initiatives fund to the state economic development initiatives 10 fund that is required, in accordance with a certification by the director 11 of the budget under this subsection, to fund the budgeted expenditures 12 and transfers from the state economic development initiatives fund for 13 the fiscal year in accordance with the provisions of appropriation acts, as 14 specified by the director of the budget pursuant to such certification.

(f) On or before the 10th day of each month, the director of accounts
and reports shall transfer from the state general fund to the state economic development initiatives fund interest earnings based on:

(1) The average daily balance of moneys in the Kansas economic op-portunity initiatives fund for the preceding month; and

20 (2) the net earnings rate for the pooled money investment portfolio 21 for the preceding month.

(g) A five member panel consisting of the secretary of commerce and 22 23 housing, the president of Kansas, Inc., the president of the Kansas tech-24nology enterprise corporation, the private sector chairperson of the board 25of Kansas, Inc. and the private sector chairperson of the Kansas technol-26 ogy enterprise corporation shall review annually the propriety of projects 27 funded under this section. The panel shall report its findings in writing to the governor, the economic development new economy committee of 2829 the house of representatives, the senate commerce committee and the 30 joint committee on economic development. The report to the new econ-31 omy committee of the house of representatives, the commerce committee 32 of the senate and the joint committee on economic development under this 33 subsection shall be made by the panel by publishing such report on the internet and by notifying each member of the committees that the report 34 35 is available and providing, as part of such notice, the uniform resource 36 locator (URL) at which such report is available.

Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-50,152 is hereby amended to read as
follows: 74-50,152. required pursuant to K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-5049, and
amendments thereto, the secretary of commerce and housing shall issue
a report concerning the use of the fund to the joint committee on eco-

41 nomic development. The secretary's report shall include a detailed de-

42 scription of how funds were spent, what, if any, economic benefits were

43 realized from the expenditures and whether the intended outcomes iden-

1 tified pursuant to subsection (c) of K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-50,151 and 2 amendments thereto have been realized. The report to the joint committee 3 on economic development under this section shall be made by the secre-4 tary by publishing such report on the internet and by notifying each 5 member of the joint committee that the report is available and providing, 6 as part of such notice, the uniform resource locator (URL) at which such 7 report is available.

Sec. 6. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-8004 is hereby amended to read as
follows: 74-8004. (a) In order to achieve its purpose as provided in this
act, Kansas, Inc. shall:

(1) Serve in an advisory capacity to the governor, the Kansas depart ment of commerce and housing and the standing committee on commerce of the senate, the standing committee on economic development
 new economy of the house of representatives and the joint committee on economic development.

16 (2) Assume central responsibility to develop, with the guidance of 17 both the private and public sectors, all facets of a comprehensive long 18 term economic development strategy.

(3) Coordinate the strategy development with all other state and local agencies and offices and state educational institutions which do research work, develop materials and programs, gather statistics, or which perform functions related to economic development; and such state and local agencies and offices and state educational institutions shall advise and cooperate with Kansas, Inc. in the planning and accomplishment of the strategy.

26 (4) Evaluate and analyze the state's economy to guide the direction 27 of future public and private actions, and report and make recommenda-28tions to the governor, the department of commerce and housing, and the 29 standing committee on commerce of the senate, the standing committee 30 on economic development new economy of the house of representatives 31 and the joint committee on economic development with respect to the 32 state's economy. The report to the committee on commerce of the senate, 33 the committee on new economy of the house of representatives and the 34 joint committee on economic development under this subsection shall be 35 made by Kansas, inc., by publishing such report on the internet and by 36 notifying each member of the committees that the report is available and providing, as part of such notice, the uniform resource locator (URL) at 37 38 which such report is available.

(5) Oversee and evaluate the state's economic development activities
on an ongoing basis through the establishment of goals, priorities performance standards and the periodic program audit of those goals, priorities and performance standards.

43 (6) Oversee the implementation of the state's economic development

1 plan and monitor updates of that plan.

2 (7) Provide appropriate oversight to ensure the successful implemen-3 tation of Kansas venture capital, Inc.

4 (8) Oversee the targeting of scarce state resources by size and sector 5 of economic activity and by geographic location within the state in order 6 to enhance the state's potential comparative economic advantages.

7 (9) Review and evaluate the annual reports of the department of com-8 merce and housing, Kansas technology enterprise corporation and Kansas 9 venture capital, Inc. Kansas, Inc. shall transmit recommendations con-10 cerning the agencies' activities to the governor and the legislature no later 11 than September 1 of each year.

(b) Kansas, Inc. shall seek advice from the general public and from
professional associations, academic groups and institutions and individuals
with knowledge of and interest in areas of economic development and
planning.

(c) The department of commerce and housing and all other interested state agencies shall cooperate with Kansas, Inc. in providing information and other assistance as may be requested for the performance of
its duties with respect to the state's economic development plan.

20 Sec. 7. K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-8204 is hereby amended to read as 21 follows: 74-8204. Kansas Venture Capital, Inc. shall prepare and publish 22 an annual report of its activities for the information of the governor, the 23standing committee on commerce of the senate, the standing committee 24on economic development new economy of the house of representatives 25and the joint committee on economic development, Kansas, Inc., and the 26 public which shall be made widely available and shall specifically account 27 for:

(a) The manner in which the purpose as described in this act hasbeen carried out by Kansas Venture Capital, Inc.

(b) The total investments made annually by Kansas Venture Capital,Inc. in Kansas businesses.

(c) An estimate of jobs created and jobs preserved by investments byKansas Venture Capital, Inc. in Kansas businesses.

(d) An estimate of the multiplier effect on the Kansas economy ofinvestments by Kansas Venture Capital, Inc. in Kansas businesses.

(e) An analysis of the targeting of scarce resources by Kansas Venture
 Capital, Inc. by size, sector and location to enterprises of particular need
 and opportunity.

42 made by Kansas venture capital, inc., by publishing such report on the
