9 AN ACT concerning crimes, criminal procedure and punishments; re-10 lating to sex offenders; community notification of residence. 11 12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 13 Section 1. (a) The Kansas bureau of investigation shall send by mail 14 or posted flyer notice to all persons who have a legal residence within 151,000 feet and all schools and child care facilities within three miles of 16 the declared residence of a person convicted of a sexually violent crime 17as defined in K.S.A. 22-4902, and amendments thereto, or a person con-18 victed of any sex offense as provided in article 35 or 36 of chapter 21 of 19 the Kansas Statutes Annotated when the victim is a minor that such con-

20victed person will be establishing such convicted person's residence.

21 (b) Such notice shall identify the convicted person, specify the con-22 victed person's criminal history and the address at which the convicted 23person will reside.

24(c) Such notice shall also contain information describing the fact that 25most sex offenders remain undetected in the community, most people 26 are victimized by a person that they know, known sex offenders are often 27 under the supervision of the criminal justice system and the procedures 28that the criminal justice system utilizes to control these offenders, in-29 cluding limitations on such control and methods to protect each person 30 and each person's family from victimization by sex offenders.

31 Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit community no-(d) 32 tification of the residence of such convicted persons by other methods or 33 notification to persons and schools and child care facilities whose resi-34 dence or location is more than the applicable distance from the residence 35 of the convicted person in addition to the notification provisions of this 36 section.

37 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 38 publication in the statute book.
