9 AN ACT concerning labor and employment; employee benefits; leave. 10 11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 12 Section 1. (a) The legislature hereby finds and declares that a key to 13 the enhancement of the Kansas public education system can come from 14 the active participation of a parent in the education of such parent's child 15by attending school conferences and related activities as defined by this 16 section. 17(b) Every employer as defined in K.S.A. 44-313, and amendments 18 thereto, shall provide every employee leave from work of up to a total of 19 24 hours during any twelve-month period to attend, observe or participate 20 in conferences or classroom activities related to the employee's depend-21ent children, for whom such employee is the legal guardian, that are 22 conducted at the child's school or day care center, if the conferences or 23classroom activities cannot reasonably be scheduled during the nonwork 24hours of the employee. An employee who wishes to request leave under 25this section shall provide reasonable notice to the employer prior to the 26 leave and make a reasonable effort to schedule the leave so as not to 27 unduly disrupt the operations of the employer.

For purposes of this section "related activities" means all educational related activities including: Field trips; conferences; physician, dentist or counselor visits; classroom holiday celebrations; the observation or monitoring of services or programs relating to the employee's child or any other activity or appointment reasonably related to a child's education or rearing.

(c) An employer is not required to pay an employee for any time taken
as leave pursuant to this section. However, an employee shall be permitted to substitute any accrued vacation time or other appropriate paid leave
for any leave taken pursuant to this section.

## Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the statute book.
