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HOUSE BILL No. 2116

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9 AN ACT creating the Kansas commission on health; providing for the
powers, duties and functions thereof.

12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

13 Section 1. There is hereby created the Kansas commission on health, 14 hereinafter referred to as the "commission," to oversee the necessary 15changes in state laws and regulations in order for the commission to reach 16 its goal to be able to examine and make recommendation on all aspects 17of health in Kansas. The commission shall make a determination of what 18 should be the appropriate levels and delivery of services in Kansas, tran-19 scending the scope of practice of all providers of health care. A focus on 20 both mental and physical health is to be included. The underserved areas 21of Kansas and the total aspect of the delivery of health care in Kansas, 22 including telemedicine shall also be reviewed. Finally, the commission 23shall place an emphasis on prevention, health promotion and the reduc-24tion of health disparities in the overall Kansas population.

25Sec. 2. (a) The commission shall be composed of 19 members. With 26 an emphasis and consideration of the member's ethnicity, gender and 27 geographic area, the members of the commission shall be as follows: Two 28 members of the house of representatives, one appointed by the speaker 29 of the house of representatives and one member appointed by the mi-30 nority leader of the house of representatives; two members of the senate, 31 one appointed by the president of the senate and one member of the 32 senate appointed by the minority leader of the senate; the remaining 15 33 members of the commission shall be appointed by the governor who shall 34 appoint these members from the following categories: One member rep-35 resenting a large self-insured employer, one member representing an 36 employer who is insured with a privately purchased group health insur-37 ance policy, one member who is a mental health care provider, one mem-38 ber who is a health care provider who is not licensed to practice medicine 39 and surgery or a licensed dentist, one member who is licensed to practice 40medicine and surgery, one member who is a licensed dentist, one mem-41ber who is licensed to practice chiropractic, one member who is licensed 42 to practice nursing as a registered professional nurse, one member who 43 is a registered physical therapist or a licensed occupational therapist, one

member representing the health care commission, one member repre-1 senting small business, one member representing a local health depart-2 3 ment, one member representing organized labor, one member who is a consumer of health care, one member representing the American asso-4 ciation of retired persons-Kansas, one member representing a major 56 insurance company, one member representing public health academia 7 and one member representing kindergarten to 12th grade education. The secretary of health and environment, the secretary of social and rehabil-8 9 itation services and the secretary of aging or such secretaries' designees 10 shall be advisors to the commission. Since every state agency of Kansas 11 has a stake in the health of all Kansans, the commission may call upon, request and recover information from any state agency. 12

13 (b) Any person who is appointed to the commission shall serve until 14 July 1, 2007. After that date, the appointing authority shall appoint mem-15bers to the commission to serve until July 1, 2008. Members may be 16 reappointed. In order to be a member of the commission, each member 17must continue to maintain such member's status from the category from 18 which such person was appointed. If a member of the commission resigns, 19 no longer resides in the state of Kansas, is no longer qualified to represent 20 the category from which such member was appointed, dies, or, as it per-21tains to each of the four legislative members of the commission, is no 22 longer an elected or appointed member of the Kansas legislature, then 23in each situation the appointing authority shall fill the vacancy on the 24commission, and the person so appointed shall serve the remaining term 25of that party.

(c) A quorum of the commission shall be ten. All action of the com-26 27 mission may be taken by a majority of those present when there is a 28quorum. The chairperson and the vice-chairperson shall be elected from 29 the 19 members of the commission. The vice-chairperson shall exercise 30 all the powers of the chairperson in the absence of the chairperson. The 31 commission may appoint advisory subcommittees as it deems appropriate. 32 All subcommittees shall meet and report at the direction of the commis-33 sion. All meetings shall be subject to the Kansas open meetings act.

(d) Funding of operations of the commission shall be from moneys received from grants and contributions made from foundations, nonprofit organizations and other entities or persons who have common goals of the commission. Officers and employees of the state, and the departments of health and environment, social and rehabilitation services, and aging shall pursue grants and contributions to fund the activities of the commission.

(e) The Kansas commission on health shall meet on call of the chairperson. All such meetings shall be held in Topeka unless authorized to
be held in a different place by the commission. Interactive electronic

meetings may also be used by the commission to expand involvement
 throughout the state.

(f) The commission shall work cooperatively with all relevant state
and federal agencies, health care providers, payors and consumer groups
in the development of integrated health for all Kansans. The commission
shall accomplish this by identifying measurable health goals and treatment
based upon evidence the commission gathers. The commission shall have
the power to recommend priorities to state agencies with regard to health
spending.

10 Sec. 3. (a) From moneys received by the commission, the commis-11 sion shall employ an executive secretary who shall receive compensation 12 as approved by the commission. The executive secretary shall act as staff to the commission and its subcommittees and shall serve as liaison with 13 14 state agencies and the office of the governor. The executive secretary and 15the commission may use office space provided by the state of Kansas or 16 any philanthropic organization. The commission shall make the final de-17cision as to where the commission's office will be located.

(b) All officers and employees of the state of Kansas shall provide
such information and assistance as may be deemed necessary by the commission. Administrative support for the commission shall be provided by
the division of legislative administrative services. Other staff assistance
shall be provided by the office of the revisor of statutes, the legislative
research department and such other legislative offices and employees as
may be directed by the legislative coordinating council.

25Sec. 4. The commission on or before the first Tuesday of each year 26 shall prepare and publish an annual report of its activities and recom-27 mendations for the governor, insurance commissioner, all health related 28committees of the legislature and any member of the Kansas legislature 29 for their information and review. This report is also available to the public, 30 upon request. The report shall be available at the Kansas commission on 31 health and by publishing such report on the internet and by notifying the 32 legislature that the report is available and providing, as part of such notice, 33 the uniform resource locator (URL) at which such report is available.

34 Sec. 5. The provisions of sections 1 through 5, and amendments 35 thereto, shall expire on June 30, 2008.

Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the statute book.

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
