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8 9 AN ACT concerning the secretary of state; relating to the distribution of 10 certain publications and documents thereof; amending K.S.A. 75-430, 11 75-431, 75-432, 77-151, 77-428, 77-429 and 77-430a and K.S.A. 2002 12 Supp. 77-138, 77-165, 77-430 and 77-431 and repealing the existing 13 sections. 1415 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 16 Section 1. K.S.A. 75-430 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-17430. (a) The secretary of state shall compile, index and publish a publi-18 cation to be known as the Kansas register. Such register shall contain: 19 (1)All acts of the legislature required to be published in the Kansas 20register; 21 (2)all executive orders and directives of the governor which are re-22 quired to be filed in the office of the secretary of state; 23(3) summaries of all opinions of the attorney general interpreting acts 24of the legislature as prepared by the office of the attorney general; 25notice of any public comment period on contemplated modifi-(4)26 cation of an existing rule and regulation, which notice shall contain the 27 information required by K.S.A 77-421 and amendments thereto; 28all notices of hearings on proposed administrative rules and reg- $(\mathbf{5})$ 29 ulations required to be filed in the office of the secretary of state under 30 the provisions of article 4 of chapter 77 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated 31 and a summary of all proposed administrative rules and regulations to be 32 considered at such hearings together with the address of the state agency 33 from which a copy of the full text of the proposed rules and regulations 34 may be received; 35 (6) the full text of all administrative rules and regulations which have 36 been adopted and filed in accordance with the provisions of article 4 of 37 chapter 77 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, except that the secretary of 38 state may publish a summary of any rule and regulation together with the 39 address of the state agency from which a copy of the full text of the 40 proposed rules and regulations may be received, if such rule and regu-41 lation is lengthy and expensive to publish and otherwise available in pub-42 lished form and a summary will, in the opinion of the secretary, properly

43 notify the public of the contents of such rule and regulation;

1 (7) a cumulative index of all administrative rules and regulations 2 which have been adopted and filed in accordance with the provisions of 3 article 4 of chapter 77 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated;

4 (8) all notices of hearings of special legislative interim study commit-5 tees, descriptions of all prefiled bills and resolutions and descriptions of 6 all bills and resolutions introduced in the legislature during any session 7 of the legislature, and other legislative information which is approved for 8 publication by the legislative coordinating council;

9 (9) the hearings docket of the Kansas supreme court and the court 10 of appeals;

(10) summaries of all orders of the board of tax appeals which havestatewide application;

(11) all advertisements for contracts for construction, repairs, im provements or purchases by the state of Kansas or any agency thereof for
 which competitive bids are required; and

16 (12) any other information which the secretary of state deems to be 17 of sufficient interest to the general public to merit its publication or which 18 is required by law to be published in the Kansas register.

19 (b) The secretary of state shall publish such register at regular inter-20 vals, but not less than weekly.

(c) The secretary of state may omit from the register any information the publication of which the secretary deems cumbersome, expensive, or otherwise inexpedient, if the information is made available in printed or processed form by the adopting agency on application for it, and if the register contains a notice stating the general subject matter of the information and the manner in which a copy of it may be obtained.

(d) One copy of each issue of The register shall be made available *provided* without charge on request to each officer, board, commission,
and department of the state having statewide jurisdiction, to each member of the legislature, to each county clerk in the state, and to the supreme
court, court of appeals and each district court.

(e) The secretary of state shall make copies of *provide* the register
available to other persons on payment of a fee to be fixed by the secretary
of state under K.S.A. 75-433, and amendments thereto.

35 (f) Any publication requirements under this section may be accom-36 plished by providing the information in an electronic format.

37 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 75-431 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-431.

38 (a) Each agency shall file materials for publication in the Kansas register

39 by delivering to the office of the secretary of state during normal working

40 hours two certified copies *a copy* of the document *information* to be filed,

41 except that rules and regulations required to be filed in the office of the

42 secretary of state under the provisions of article 4 of chapter 77 of the

43 Kansas Statutes Annotated shall be filed in triplicate. On receipt of a

1 document required by this act to be published in the register, the seeretary of state shall note the day and hour of filing on the certified copies. 3 published. Materials filed for publication in the Kansas register shall be 4 in the format required by the secretary of state. One certified copy of 5 cach filed document The published information shall be maintained in 6 original form by the secretary of state for six months 90 days after the 7 publication of the document in the Kansas register.

8 (b) All notices of hearings on proposed administrative rules and reg-9 ulations and the full text of adopted rules and regulations shall be filed 10 for publication in the Kansas register under the provisions of article 4 of 11 chapter 77 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto. 12 If there is a conflict, the official text of a rule and regulation is the text 13 on file with the secretary of state and not the text published in the register 14 or on file with the issuing agency.

15 (c) The secretary of state is hereby authorized to adopt rules and 16 regulations necessary to the effective administration of this act. Such rules 17 and regulations may include, but are not limited to, rules prescribing 18 paper size and the format of documents required to be published by this 19 act. The secretary of state may refuse to accept for filing and publication 20 any document *information* that does not substantially conform to the 21 promulgated rules and regulations.

(d) Upon otherwise complying with the provisions of this section, the
 secretary of state may destroy the original copies of all information sub mitted for publication.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 75-432 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-432.
(a) Each issue of the register shall contain a table of contents.

(b) A cumulative index to all information required by this act to be
published during the previous year shall be published at least once each
year.

30 (c) Each document submitted to the secretary of state for publication
31 as provided in this act must be certified by an official of the submitting
32 agency authorized to certify documents of that agency.

33 (d) Each agency shall designate at least one individual to act as a
 34 liaison through whom all required documents may be submitted to the
 35 secretary of state for publication.

36 <u>(e) Each issue of the register shall be punched for standard three-</u> 37 ring binders.

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 77-138 is hereby amended to read as follows: 77-138. (a) Volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated shall be printed and bound by the director of printing and delivered to the sec-

41 retary of state who shall dispose of them as follows:

42 *First*, the secretary of state shall deposit in the supreme court law 43 library and in the state library such number of copies as the state law 1 librarian and the state librarian, respectively, shall request for use in the 2 law library and the state library, for the purposes of the publication col-3 lection and depository system established under K.S.A. 75-2566, and 4 amendments thereto, and for the purpose of making exchanges with the 5 various states and territories, and the secretary of state shall retain one 6 set for the secretary's use in the secretary's office.

Second, (1) the secretary of state shall distribute two one complete sets
set of the Kansas Statutes Annotated to each member of the legislature
at each regular session, one set of which shall have the respective member's name printed thereon following such member's election or appointment to such member's first term of office in the legislature.

12 (2) The secretary of state shall distribute such number of complete 13 sets and individual volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated: (A) To the 14 office of revisor of statutes as the revisor of statutes shall request; (B) to 15the legislative research department as the director of legislative research 16 shall request; (C) to the division of post audit as the post auditor shall 17request; (D) to the division of legislative administrative services as the director of legislative administrative services shall request; and (E) to the 1819judicial branch of state government as the chief justice of the supreme 20court shall request.

21 (3) The secretary of state shall distribute: (A) Two sets to each rep-22 resentative in congress and United States senator from the state of Kan-23sas, upon request by such representative or senator; (B) one set each to 24the governor, lieutenant governor and attorney general; (C) to Washburn 25university school of law, the number of sets, not to exceed 60 sets, that 26 the librarian of the school of law certifies to the secretary of state as 27 necessary for the purpose of exchanging with other states and territories 28and to be kept in the library for the use of faculty and students of the 29 university; (D) to the school of law of the university of Kansas, the number 30 of sets, not to exceed 60 sets, that the librarian of the school of law certifies 31 to the secretary of state as necessary for the purpose of exchanging with 32 other states and territories and to be kept in the library for the use of 33 faculty and students of the university; (E) to the clerk of the district court of the United States for the state of Kansas, the number of sets, not to 34 35 exceed five sets, as are requested by such clerk; (F) one set to each county 36 law library in the state, upon request by the librarian thereof; (G) to each 37 county clerk, the number of sets requested by the county clerk, not to 38 exceed seven sets, to be distributed not more than one set each to the 39 county or district attorney, the county clerk, the county counselor, if any, 40the register of deeds, the sheriff, the county treasurer, and the board of county commissioners, which set shall be retained by the county clerk for 4142 use by such board; (H) not more than one set to each city of the third 43 class, one set to each city of the second class and two sets to each city of the first class, upon request by the city clerk; and (I) one set to the state
 historical society library.

3 *Third*, the balance of statute books, after the above distribution shall 4 be kept by the secretary of state for sale.

(b) The secretary of state shall sell each volume of the Kansas Statutes 56 Annotated, including replacement volumes, at the per volume price fixed 7 therefor by the legislative coordinating council under this section. General index volumes, when sold separately and not as a part of a set of 8 9 cumulative supplements, shall be sold at the per volume price fixed there-10 for by the legislative coordinating council. The secretary of state shall 11 remit all moneys received from such sales under this section to the state 12 treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and 13 amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state 14 treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit 15of the state general fund.

16 (c) The legislative coordinating council shall fix the per volume price 17 of each volume of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, including replacement 18 volumes, sold under this section to recover the costs of printing and bind-19 ing such volumes. The legislative coordinating council shall revise such 20 prices from time to time for the purposes of covering and recovering such 21 costs.

22 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 77-151 is hereby amended to read as follows: 77-151. 23(a) Each year the revisor of statutes shall edit and prepare for printing 24and publication such volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated as have 25been included in the detailed budget of the legislative coordinating coun-26 cil for the revisor of statutes. Except as otherwise provided by law for 27 volumes containing constitutions and the general index, the volume or 28volumes published each year shall contain all of the statutes in force and 29 effect then contained in the volume or volumes of the Kansas Statutes 30 Annotated being replaced and the then current supplements thereto, to-31 gether with all acts passed by the current session of the legislature and assigned by the revisor of statutes to chapters in the volume or volumes 32 33 being newly published.

(b) When more than one volume is being newly published in any year, 34 35 the material in the replacement volumes shall be divided between or 36 among the replacement volumes as nearly equally as practicable by the 37 revisor of statutes. Each volume shall be printed and bound by the division of printing in the format prescribed by K.S.A. 77-152 and amend-38 39 ments thereto. Replacement volumes shall not contain volume indexes. 40In editing and preparing the material to be contained in replacement 41 volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated for publication, the provisions 42 of K.S.A. 77-133, 77-136, 77-136a and 77-152, and amendments to these

43 statutes, shall govern the revisor and the division of printing, insofar as

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1 the same can be made applicable, and the statutes to be contained in 2 replacement volumes shall be authenticated in the same manner as re-3 quired under K.S.A. 77-137 and amendments thereto. After publication 4 of replacement volumes, each shall thereafter be kept up to date by cu-5 mulative supplements in the same manner as provided for supplemen-6 tation of Kansas Statutes Annotated by K.S.A. 77-163 *et seq.* and amend-7 ments thereto.

8 (c) Replacement volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated shall be 9 printed in the number of copies specified by the revisor of statutes, sub-10 ject to available appropriations, and shall be distributed and sold in the 11 same manner as provided in K.S.A. 77-138 77-165 and amendments 12 thereto as for the distribution of volumes of the Kansas Statutes 13 Annotated.

14 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 77-165 is hereby amended to read as fol-15lows: 77-165. (a) Such number of copies of the cumulative supplements 16 for each volume of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, corresponding as 17nearly as possible in size and page with the current bound volumes, as is 18specified by the revisor of statutes, subject to available appropriations, 19 shall be printed by the director of printing and delivered to the secretary 20 of state. Each year such number of sets of the general index paperbound 21volume or volumes as is specified by the revisor of statutes, subject to 22 available appropriations, shall be printed by the director of printing and 23 delivered to the secretary of state. For purposes of this section the general 24index paperbound volume or volumes shall be considered supplements. 25The revisor of statutes, with the approval of the legislative coordinating 26 council, may provide for printing and delivery of additional copies of 27 supplements to volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated.

(b) The secretary of state shall dispose of full sets of supplements,
including the general index paperbound volume or volumes, as follows: *First*, by delivering to all state officers, county officers and other departments and officers the same number of sets and in the same manner
as provided by K.S.A. 77-138, and amendments thereto, for the distribution of volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated and by delivering to
each member of the legislature three sets one set of such supplements.

35 Second, the balance of such supplements including as a part thereof 36 the general index paperbound volume or volumes, after such distribution, 37 shall be kept by the secretary of state for sale. Supplements for individual 38 volumes except index volumes shall be sold at the per volume price fixed 39 therefor by the legislative coordinating council under this section. Com-40plete sets of cumulative supplements including the general index volume shall be sold at the complete set price fixed therefor by the legislative 4142 coordinating council under this section.

43 (c) The secretary of state shall remit all moneys received from the

sale of supplements under this section to the state treasurer in accordance
 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon
 receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire
 amount in the state treasury to the credit of the state general fund.

5 (d) The legislative coordinating council shall fix the per volume and 6 complete set prices of the cumulative supplements for the Kansas Statutes 7 Annotated sold under this section to recover the costs of printing and 8 binding such supplements. The legislative coordinating council shall re-9 vise such prices from time to time for the purposes of covering and re-10 covering such costs.

11 Sec. 7. K.S.A. 77-428 is hereby amended to read as follows: 77-428. 12 (a) At the beginning of each calendar year the secretary of state, as soon as possible, shall assemble all rules and regulations, except temporary 13 14 rules and regulations, filed during the preceding year in accordance with 15the provisions of this act. The state rules and regulations board shall determine which of such rules and regulations are to be published in the 16 17Kansas administrative regulations or annual supplement as provided in 18 this act.

19 (b) Annual supplements shall be cumulative and shall include all rules 20and regulations published in the annual supplement in the next preceding 21year which remain in force and effect on the effective date of the current 22 supplement, together with all rules and regulations, other than temporary 23rules and regulations, which were regularly adopted and filed in the office 24of the secretary of state in the year next preceding the year when such 25annual supplement is published and which were approved for publication 26 by the state rules and regulations board.

27(c) The secretary of state shall prepare annual supplements to the 28rules and regulations and material to be published therewith, in one or 29 more paperbound volumes in the form determined by the secretary of 30 state. The annual supplement of rules and regulations shall be published 31 and shall include a general index of all rules and regulations contained 32 therein and such notes, cross references and explanatory materials as will 33 facilitate the use of such supplements. All rules and regulations and material published in the annual supplement shall be delivered to and pub-34 lished by the director of printing. Authentication Certification of all sup-35 36 plement volumes shall be in the manner provided in K.S.A. 77-429, and amendments thereto. The director of printing shall print the number of 37 copies requisitioned by the secretary of state. 38
