8 9 AN ACT relating to license plates for United States military veterans; 10 amending K.S.A. 8-1,146 and repealing the existing section. 11 12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 13 Section 1. K.S.A. 8-1,146 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-141,146. (a) Any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles, trucks 15of a gross weight of 20,000 pounds or less or motorcycles, who is a resident 16 of the state of Kansas, and who submits satisfactory proof to the director 17of vehicles, in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the sec-18 retary of revenue, that such person has proof of having served and is 19 designated as a veteran, and has had an honorable discharge from the 20 United States army, navy, air force, marine corps, coast guard or merchant 21 marines, upon compliance with the provisions of this section, may be 22 issued one distinctive license plate for each such passenger vehicle, truck 23or motorcycle designating such person as an United States military vet-24eran. Such license plates shall be issued for the same period of time as

other license plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular
license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto. *In addition to such license plate, the person may request a decal*

27 (b) In addition to such license plate, the person may request a deca 28 for each license plate indicating:

(1) The appropriate military branch in which the person served; and
 (2) upon submitting satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the secretary, that such
 person was awarded a silver star or bronze star medal by the United States
 government.

A fee of \$2 shall be paid for each decal. The decals shall be affixed to
 the license plate in the location required by the director.

36 (b) (c) Any person who is a veteran of the United States army, navy, 37 air force, marine corps, coast guard or merchant marines may make ap-38 plication for such distinctive license plates, not less than 60 days prior to 39 such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and fur-40nished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for the distinctive license plates shall furnish the director with proof as the director shall 4142 require that the applicant is a veteran of the United States army, navy, 43 air force, marine corps, coast guard or merchant marines. Application for $1 \quad \mbox{the registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle and issuance}$

2 of the license plates under this section shall be made by the owner or
3 lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms
4 furnished by the director.

(e)(d) No registration of *or* distinctive license plates issued under the 6 authority of this section shall be transferable to any other person.

 $\frac{d}{d}(e)$ Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the man-ner prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant has filed with the director a form as provided in subsection (b) (c). If such form is not filed, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and return the distinctive license plates to the county treasurer of such person's residence.
