HOUSE BILL No. 2228

AN ACT redesignating and establishing the Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative board as a separate state agency to be known as the Kansas veterans health commission; redesignating the Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative act as the Kansas veterans health initiative act; prescribing and providing for the transfer of certain powers, duties, functions, records, documents and property; preserving certain rights; amending K.S.A. 73-1221, 73-1222, 73-1223, 73-1224, 73-1225, 73-1226, 73-1227, 73-1229, 73-1230 and 73-1231 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. (a) The Kansas veterans health commission, as established and redesignated by K.S.A. 73-1223, and amendments thereto, is hereby established as a separate state agency within the executive branch of state government. The Kansas veterans health commission shall implement and administer the Kansas veterans health initiative act and shall have such other powers, duties and functions as may be prescribed by statute. Nothing in this act shall affect the office or term of office of any person who is a member of the Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative board on the date preceding the effective date of this act and each such person shall be a member of the Kansas veterans health commission.

(b) On the effective date of this act, all of the powers, duties and functions of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs under the Kansas veterans health initiative act, including the power to administer, expend and distribute funds now or hereafter made available in accordance with any appropriation act for the purposes of the Kansas veterans health initiative act, shall be and hereby are transferred to and conferred and imposed upon the Kansas veterans health commission, except as otherwise specifically provided by this act. The Kansas veterans health commission shall be the successor in every way to such powers, duties and functions of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs under the Kansas veterans health initiative act, in which the same were vested prior to the effective date of this act. Every act performed by or under the authority of the Kansas veterans health commission under the Kansas veterans

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 health initiative act shall be deemed to have the same force and effect as if performed by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs under the Kansas veterans health initiative act in which the authority to perform such act was vested prior to the effective date of this act.

- (c) On the effective date of this act, the Kansas veterans health commission shall succeed to the title to all property and records of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs which were used for or pertain to the performance of the powers, duties and functions transferred to the Kansas veterans health commission pursuant to this act.
- (d) On and after the effective date of this act, whenever the Kansas commission on veterans affairs is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other document and such reference relates to powers, duties, functions, records or property of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs under the Kansas veterans health initiative act prior to the effective date of this act, such reference or designation shall be deemed to apply to the Kansas veterans health commission, except as otherwise specifically provided by this act.
- (e) All rules and regulations of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs which are in existence on June 30, 2003, and which relate to a power, duty or function of the commission under the Kansas veterans health initiative act prior to the effective date of this act, shall continue to be effective and shall be deemed to be duly adopted rules and regulations of the Kansas veterans health commission until revised, amended, revoked or nullified pursuant to law.
- (f) All policies, orders and directives of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs which are in existence on June 30, 2003, and which relate to a power, duty or function of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs under the Kansas veterans health initiative act prior to the effective date of this act, shall continue to be effective and shall be deemed to be policies, orders and directives of the Kansas veterans health commission until revised, amended, revoked or nullified pursuant to law.
- New Sec. 2. (a) The Kansas veterans health commission shall provide that all officers and employees of the Kansas commission of veterans affairs, who are engaged in the exercise and performance of the powers, duties and functions that are transferred by this act, are transferred to the Kansas veterans health commission if the Kansas veterans health commission deems that the transfer of such officers and employees is necessary to the exercise and performance of such powers, duties and functions.
- (b) Officers and employees of the Kansas commission of veterans affairs who are transferred to the Kansas veterans health commission shall retain all retirement benefits and leave rights which had accrued or vested prior to the date of transfer. The service of each such officer and em-

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ployee so transferred shall be deemed to have been continuous. All transfers, layoffs and abolition of classified service positions under the Kansas civil service act which may result from transfers of powers, duties and functions shall be made in accordance with the civil service laws and any rules and regulations adopted thereunder. Nothing in this act shall affect the classified status of any transferred person employed by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs prior to the date of transfer. The Kansas veterans health commission shall be responsible for administering any layoff that is a part of the transfer. Notwithstanding the date of transfer of personnel from the Kansas commission on veterans affairs to the Kansas veterans health commission pursuant to the provisions of this act, the date of such transfer shall be effective at the start of a payroll period.

New Sec. 3. (a) When any conflict arises as to the disposition of any power, function or duty or the unexpended balance of any appropriation as a result of any transfer or change effected by or under authority of this act, such conflict shall be resolved by the governor, whose decision shall be final.

(b) Any conflict as to the proper disposition of property or records arising under authority of this act, and resulting from any transfer of powers, duties and functions effected by or under authority of this act, shall be determined by the governor, whose decision shall be final.

New Sec. 4. (a) On and after the effective date of this act, the Kansas veterans health commission shall have the legal custody of all records, memoranda, writings, entries, prints, representations or combinations thereof of any act, transaction, occurrence or event of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs which relate to a power, duty or function of the commission under the Kansas veterans health initiative act prior to the effective date of this act.

- (b) No suit, action or other proceeding, judicial or administrative, lawfully commenced, or which could have been commenced, by or against any state agency or program mentioned in this act, or by or against any officer of the state in such officer's official capacity or in relation to the discharge of such officer's official duties, shall abate by reason of this act. The court may allow any such suit, action or other proceeding to be maintained by or against the successor of any such state agency or any officer affected.
- (c) No criminal action commenced or which could have been commenced by the state shall abate by reason of the governmental reorganization effected under the provisions of this act.

New Sec. 5. (a) On the effective date of this act, the balance of all funds appropriated or reappropriated to the Kansas commission on veterans affairs which relate to powers, duties or functions of such commission under the Kansas veterans health initiative act prior to the effective

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date of this act, are hereby transferred to the Kansas veterans health commission and shall be used only for the purpose for which the appropriation was originally made.

- (b) On the effective date of this act, the liability for all accrued compensation or salaries of officers and employees who, immediately prior to such date, were engaged in the performance of powers, duties or functions of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs under the Kansas veterans health initiative act prior to the effective date of this act, shall be assumed and paid by the Kansas veterans health commission.
- Sec. 6. K.S.A. 73-1221 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1221. This act The provisions of K.S.A. 73-1221 through 73-1231, and amendments thereto, and sections 1 through 5, and amendments thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative act.
- Sec. 7. K.S.A. 73-1222 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1222. As used in K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1221 through 73-1231, and amendments thereto the Kansas veterans health initiative act, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- (a) "Birth defect" means any physical or mental abnormality or condition, including any susceptibility to any illness or condition other than normal childhood illnesses or conditions.
- (b) "Board" "Commission" means the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative board commission established by K.S.A. 73-1223, and amendments thereto.
- (e) "Commission" means the Kansas commission on veterans affairs. —(d) (c) "Director" means the executive director of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs Kansas veterans health commission.
- $\stackrel{\text{(e)}}{}$ (d) "Gulf War syndrome" means the wide range of physical and mental conditions, problems and illnesses that are connected with service in the armed forces of the United States during and in the area of operations of the Persian Gulf War.
- $\frac{(f)}{(e)}$ "Veteran" means a person who is a resident of Kansas who was a member of the armed forces of the United States of America and who served in such armed forces in the area of operations of the Persian Gulf War during the Persian Gulf War or thereafter or who served in such armed forces in any other area of military operations occurring after the Persian Gulf War, regardless of whether such person is still actively serving in the armed forces or reserve.
- Sec. 8. K.S.A. 73-1223 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-40 1223. (a) There is hereby established with the commission an advisory 41 board known to be the Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative board 42 which is hereby redesignated the Kansas veterans health commission. The 43 board shall be advisory to the commission in the implementation and

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administration of this act.

- (b) The board commission shall consist of nine 10 members appointed as follows:
- (1) At least three four members shall be veterans who represent veterans' organizations. The director shall notify the state level unit of the Disabled American Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and the American Legion contact each veterans' organization known to the commission and request a list of three nominations of veterans from each such veterans' organization who have an interest in veterans' health issues be submitted to the commission. The commission shall prepare and submit to the governor a list of not more than three nominees for each vacancy on the commission. The nominees included on any such list shall be selected from among the nominees submitted by the veterans' organizations, except that not more than one representative shall be selected from each veterans' organization. The governor shall appoint one veteran as a member of the commission from each list.
- (2) One member Four members shall be appointed by the governor and shall be expert clinicians or research scientists with qualifications in areas of expertise, as follows:
- (A) Three members shall be qualified from each of by expertise in the medical specializations sciences of pharmacology, public health, epidemiology, toxicology and, genetics or in any other specialty deemed relevant by the commission and shall have an interest in veterans' health issues. At least one of the three members shall be a doctor of medicine or a doctor of osteopathy who is licensed to practice medicine and surgery in Kansas by the state board of healing arts. At least one of the three members shall be a research scientist who has a doctoral degree, which is either a doctor of philosophy degree (Ph.D.) or an equivalent degree, or who has another doctoral degree with relevant research experience. Each of the three members shall be qualified in a different area of expertise from the areas of expertise of the other two members. No two members shall be nominated by the commission for expertise in the same area.
- (B) One member shall be a clinician qualified in one of the behavioral sciences in the speciality area of family dynamics and shall have an interest in veterans' health issues. This member may be a psychiatrist, psychologist, licensed clinical social worker or a similar level mental health professional who has a full and unrestricted license from the state of Kansas to practice and provide unsupervised mental health care in an area of mental health care deemed relevant by the commission.
- (C) The director shall notify one or more professional societies or, associations which known to the commission to represent the medical or behavioral science specialty area required appropriate specialists within Kansas who satisfy qualifications for membership under this subsection

(b)(2) and request a list of not more than three nominations from that the specialty area represented who have an interest in veterans' health issues. The commission shall appoint one member of the board from each list consider such lists and shall prepare a list of nominees for each member to be appointed under this subsection (b)(2) in a manner that provides balance between the specialties represented and the nominating organizations. The governor shall appoint each member to be appointed under this subsection (b)(2) from the list of nominees submitted by the commission therefor.

- (3) Two legislators, one from each house, shall be appointed to the board *commission* with the speaker of the house of representatives and president of the senate each appointing a member. One legislator shall be a member of the democratic party and one legislator shall be a member of the republican party.
- (D) The governor may reject all nominees on any list submitted by the commission under subsection (b)(1) or (b)(2) and may request an additional list of nominees prepared in accordance with subsection (b)(1) or (b)(2), as the case may be, by the commission to consider for appointment as a member of the commission.
- Within 90 days of the effective date of this act, the governor, the commission, the speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate shall appoint the initial members of the board. Of the initial appointments to the board by the governor, one shall be for a term of one year, one shall be for a term of two years and one shall be for a term ending three years after the date of the initial appointment. Of the initial appointments to the board by the commission, two shall be for a term of one year, one shall be for a term of two years and one shall be for a term ending three years after the date of the initial appointment. After the initial appointments, The terms of office of the members of the Kansas veterans health commission appointed by the governor or the commission shall be for three years but no person shall be appointed for more than two successive three-year terms. The term of office of each member appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives or the president of the senate shall end on the first day of the regular session of the legislature which commences in the first odd-numbered year occurring after the year such member was appointed.
- (d) Each member of the board commission shall serve until a successor is appointed and qualified. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the membership of the board commission for any reason other than the expiration of a member's term of office, the governor, the commission, speaker of the house of representatives or president of the senate shall appoint a successor of like qualifications to fill the unexpired term in accordance with this section. In the case of any vacancy occurring in the position of

a board member of the commission who was appointed from a list of nominations submitted by a veterans' organization, the governor director shall notify that veterans' organization organizations of the vacant position and request a list of three nominations of veterans from which the governor shall appoint a successor to the board as provided in this section. In the case of any vacancy occurring in the position of a board member of the commission who is qualified in one of the speciality areas listed in subsection (b)(3) after the initial appointments (b)(2), the director shall notify one or more professional societies or associations which represent the medical or behavioral science speciality required for the vacant position and request a list of three nominations from that speciality area from which the commission shall appoint a successor to the board commission as provided in this section.

- (e) Annually, the board commission shall elect a chairperson, vice-chairperson and secretary from among its members and shall meet at least four times each year at the call of the chairperson. A quorum of the commission shall be six members and all actions of the commission shall be by the affirmative votes of a majority of the quorum.
- (f) The members of the board commission attending meetings of the board commission or attending a subcommittee meeting thereof authorized by the board commission shall receive no compensation for their services but shall may be paid subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided in subsections (b), (c) and (d) of K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto, subject to the provisions of appropriation acts and the availability of appropriations therefor.
- Sec. 9. K.S.A. 73-1224 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1224. (a) The commission shall develop comprehensive surveys, or adopt one or more existing surveys, to be conducted to determine and study the physical and mental conditions, problems and illnesses, including birth defects, as well as the employment, social, emotional and family problems experienced by veterans, their spouses and family members since the veteran's return to Kansas and by any other persons residing in Kansas who are suffering from Gulf War syndrome or any new or emerging health problems which result from military service after the Persian Gulf War. The commission shall administer such surveys. The commission may provide for research to be conducted regarding Gulf War syndrome or any new, emerging health problems which result from military service after the Persian Gulf War or other veterans' health problems related to military service arising during or after the Persian Gulf War.
- (b) The commission shall develop or adopt the surveys within the first four months after the effective date of this act. The Kansas veterans health commission shall administer the surveys and review the completed surveys and the results of any such research with the board Kansas commis-

sion on veterans affairs and other appropriate state and federal agencies. The Kansas veterans health commission shall compile the results of the surveys and research and develop recommendations for the legislature based thereon. The director shall report the results to appropriate federal agencies and shall request additional assistance for veterans commensurate with the director's duties of the Kansas veterans health commission under K.S.A. 73-1209, and amendments thereto the Kansas veterans health initiative act.

(e) The aggregate amount expended for the development and administration of surveys and studies set out under this section and for board expenses, including the position established by K.S.A. 73-1225, and amendments thereto, shall not exceed \$100,000 per fiscal year.

-(d) (c) The commission shall request the different media, including radio, television and newspaper, to make public service announcements publicizing information on the Persian Gulf War and other surveys and research and to inform Kansans of the health problems identified and where help is available. The public service announcements should be published no less than four times a year. Upon request of the commission, the state educational institutions, as defined in K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto, the university of Kansas medical center and the university of Kansas hospital authority shall assist the commission in the development and distribution of public service announcements through the public information staff and facilities of such institutions.

Sec. 10. K.S.A. 73-1225 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1225. There is hereby established with the commission a full-time position dedicated to seeking and applying for grants and other moneys to fund activities under this the Kansas veterans health initiative act, to assist in the preparation and administration of surveys under this the Kansas veterans health initiative act, to promote programs and activities designed to assist persons affected by Gulf War syndrome, or any new or emerging health problems which are associated with military service after the Persian Gulf War, to receive the help they need and to perform such other duties as the chairperson of the commission may prescribe. Within 90 days of the effective date of this act, the commission shall appoint a qualified individual to this position.

Sec. 11. K.S.A. 73-1226 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1226. (a) The commission shall request that the department of health and environment contact families of any children born after August 1, 1991, who are on any state birth defect list maintained by the department, to inform the families of the availability of the survey and the registry if either parent served in the Persian Gulf War. If the family voluntarily participates in the survey, the veteran's child's name shall be listed in the state Persian Gulf War registry.

- (b) The commission shall determine the appropriate health programs and the confidential mechanisms that shall be utilized to ask participants in such programs whether they are Persian Gulf War veterans, and if so, offer the veterans voluntary participation in the survey under K.S.A. 73-1224, and amendments thereto.
- (c) The commission shall establish and maintain a state Persian Gulf War registry containing the names of veterans, their spouses, family members and other persons in Kansas who have been affected by Gulf War syndrome. The commission may establish and maintain additional registeries or expand the Persian Gulf War registry to similarly include veterans and their families who are affected by new or emerging health problems which are associated with military service after the Persian Gulf War.
- (d) The commission shall inform veterans of any state and federal programs available to meet the veterans' needs.
- (e) Any person who in good faith provides information to the commission under the provisions of this section shall be immune from civil or criminal liability therefor.
- Sec. 12. K.S.A. 73-1227 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1227. Subject to funds available, the commission shall conduct a fiscal impact study, aimed at identifying the annual budgetary impact on Kansas of Gulf War syndrome on Kansas and any new or emerging health problems, which are associated with military service after the Persian Gulf War, in terms of increased costs of education, medical coverage, correction of birth defects and other expenses identified through the results of the surveys conducted under K.S.A. 73-1224, and amendments thereto.
- Sec. 13. K.S.A. 73-1229 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1229. The commission shall adopt rules and regulations to implement and administer the provisions of K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 73-1221 through 73-1231, and amendments thereto the Kansas veterans health initiative act.
- Sec. 14. K.S.A. 73-1230 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1230. The Kansas commission on veterans affairs commission shall cooperate and share information with appropriate state and federal agencies as necessary for the purposes of this the Kansas veterans health initiative act to aid veterans and other persons in obtaining aid and relief from the effects of Gulf War syndrome and any new or emerging health problems which are associated with military service after the Persian Gulf War. Such cooperation shall include reporting the survey statistics to appropriate federal agencies to bring issues to the notice of appropriate agencies.
- agencies.
 Sec. 15. K.S.A. 73-1231 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1231. (a) There is hereby established in the state treasury the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative fund which shall be adminis-

tered by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs commission. All moneys received from any grants from federal or other nonstate sources, from contributions or from any other source for the purpose of financing the activities of the board commission or the development or administration of the surveys developed by the board under this Kansas veterans health initiative act, shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative fund.

- (b) All expenditures from the Persian Gulf War Kansas veterans health initiative fund shall be for the purposes of financing the activities of the commission for the implementation and administration, including of the activities of the board commission and the development and administration of the surveys under this the Kansas veterans health initiative act and shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs Kansas veterans health commission or the commission's designee.
- (c) The Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative fund is hereby redesignated the Kansas veterans health initiative fund. On and after the effective date of this act, whenever the Persian Gulf War veterans health initiative fund is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other document, such reference shall be deemed to refer to the Kansas veterans health initiative fund.
- Sec. 16. K.S.A. 73-1221, 73-1222, 73-1223, 73-1224, 73-1225, 73-1226, 73-1227, 73-1229, 73-1230 and 73-1231 are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 17. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
