AN ACT concerning taxation; relating to sales tax exemptions; laundry services; employee meals; isolated sales; leases of certain tangible personal property; amending K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 79-3603 and 79-3606 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 79-3603 is hereby amended to read as follows: 79-3603. For the privilege of engaging in the business of selling tangible personal property at retail in this state or rendering or furnishing any of the services taxable under this act, there is hereby levied and there shall be collected and paid a tax at the rate of 5.3% on and after July 1, 2002, and before July 1, 2004, 5.2% on and after July 1, 2004, and before July 1, 2005, and 5% on and after July 1, 2005, and, within a redevelopment district established pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8921, and amendments thereto, there is hereby levied and there shall be collected and paid an additional tax at the rate of 2% until the earlier of the date the bonds issued to finance or refinance the redevelopment project have been paid in full or the final scheduled maturity of the first series of bonds issued to finance any part of the project upon:

(a) The gross receipts received from the sale of tangible personal property at retail within this state;

(b) (1) the gross receipts from intrastate telephone or telegraph services; (2) the gross receipts received from the sale of interstate telephone or telegraph services, which (A) originate within this state and terminate outside the state and are billed to a customer's telephone number or account in this state; or (B) originate outside this state and terminate within this state and are billed to a customer's telephone number or account in this state except that the sale of interstate telephone or telegraph service does not include: (A) Any interstate incoming or outgoing wide area telephone service or wide area transmission type service which entitles the subscriber to make or receive an unlimited number of communications to or from persons having telephone service in a specified area which is outside the state in which the station provided this service is located; (B) any interstate private communications service to the persons contracting for the receipt of that service that entitles the purchaser

1 to exclusive or priority use of a communications channel or group of
2 channels between exchanges; (C) any value-added nonvoice service in
3 which computer processing applications are used to act on the form, con-
4 tent, code or protocol of the information to be transmitted; (D) any tel-
5 ecommunication service to a provider of telecommunication services
6 which will be used to render telecommunications services, including car-
7 rier access services; or (E) any service or transaction defined in this sec-
8 tion among entities classified as members of an affiliated group as pro-
9 vided by section 1504 of the federal internal revenue code of 1986, as in
10 effect on January 1, 2001. For the purposes of this subsection the term
11 gross receipts does not include purchases of telephone, telegraph or tel-
12 ecommunications using a prepaid telephone calling card or prepaid au-
13 thorization number. As used in this subsection, a prepaid telephone call-
14 ing card or prepaid authorization number means the right to exclusively
15 make telephone calls, paid for in advance, that enables the origination of
16 calls using an access number or authorization code or both, whether man-
17 ually or electronically dialed; and (3) the gross receipts from the provision
18 of services taxable under this subsection which are billed on a combined
19 basis with nontaxable services, shall be accounted for and the tax remitted
20 as follows: The taxable portion of the selling price of those combined
21 services shall include only those charges for taxable services if the selling
22 price for the taxable services can be readily distinguishable in the retailer's
23 books and records from the selling price for the nontaxable services. Oth-
24 erwise, the gross receipts from the sale of both taxable and nontaxable
25 services billed on a combined basis shall be deemed attributable to the
26 taxable services included therein. Within 90 days of billing taxable services
27 on a combined basis with nontaxable services, the retailer shall enter into
28 a written agreement with the secretary identifying the methodology to be
29 used in determining the taxable portion of the selling price of those com-
30 bined services. The burden of proving that any receipt or charge is not
31 taxable shall be upon the retailer. Upon request from the customer, the
32 retailer shall disclose to the customer the selling price for the taxable
33 services included in the selling price for the taxable and nontaxable serv-
34 ices billed on a combined basis;

35 (c) the gross receipts from the sale or furnishing of gas, water, elec-
36 tricity and heat, which sale is not otherwise exempt from taxation under
37 the provisions of this act, and whether furnished by municipally or pri-
38 vately owned utilities but such tax shall not be levied and collected upon
39 the gross receipts from: (1) The sale of a rural water district benefit unit;
40 (2) a water system impact fee, system enhancement fee or similar fee
41 collected by a water supplier as a condition for establishing service; or (3)
42 connection or reconnection fees collected by a water supplier;

43 (d) the gross receipts from the sale of meals or drinks furnished at

1 any private club, drinking establishment, catered event, restaurant, eating
2 house, dining car, hotel, drugstore or other place where meals or drinks
3 are regularly sold to the public;

4 (e) the gross receipts from the sale of admissions to any place pro-
5 viding amusement, entertainment or recreation services including admis-
6 sions to state, county, district and local fairs, but such tax shall not be
7 levied and collected upon the gross receipts received from sales of ad-
8 missions to any cultural and historical event which occurs triennially;

9 (f) the gross receipts from the operation of any coin-operated device
10 dispensing or providing tangible personal property, amusement or other
11 services ~~except laundry services, whether automatic or manually operated;~~

12 (g) the gross receipts from the service of renting of rooms by hotels,
13 as defined by K.S.A. 36-501 and amendments thereto, or by accommo-
14 dation brokers, as defined by K.S.A. 12-1692, and amendments thereto
15 but such tax shall not be levied and collected upon the gross receipts
16 received from sales of such service to the federal government and any
17 agency, officer or employee thereof in association with the performance
18 of official government duties;

19 (h) the gross receipts from the service of renting or leasing of tangible
20 personal property except such tax shall not apply to the renting or leasing
21 of machinery, equipment or other personal property owned by a city and
22 purchased from the proceeds of industrial revenue bonds issued prior to
23 July 1, 1973, in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 12-1740 through
24 12-1749, and amendments thereto, and any city or lessee renting or leas-
25 ing such machinery, equipment or other personal property purchased
26 with the proceeds of such bonds who shall have paid a tax under the
27 provisions of this section upon sales made prior to July 1, 1973, shall be
28 entitled to a refund from the sales tax refund fund of all taxes paid
29 thereon;

30 (i) the gross receipts from the rendering of dry cleaning, pressing,
31 dyeing and laundry services ~~except laundry services rendered through a
32 coin-operated device whether automatic or manually operated;~~

33 (j) the gross receipts from the rendering of the services of washing
34 and washing and waxing of vehicles;

35 (k) the gross receipts from cable, community antennae and other sub-
36 scriber radio and television services;

37 (l) (1) except as otherwise provided by paragraph (2), the gross re-
38 cepts received from the sales of tangible personal property to all con-
39 tractors, subcontractors or repairmen for use by them in erecting struc-
40 tures, or building on, or otherwise improving, altering, or repairing real
41 or personal property.

42 (2) Any such contractor, subcontractor or repairman who maintains
43 an inventory of such property both for sale at retail and for use by them

1 for the purposes described by paragraph (1) shall be deemed a retailer
2 with respect to purchases for and sales from such inventory, except that
3 the gross receipts received from any such sale, other than a sale at retail,
4 shall be equal to the total purchase price paid for such property and the
5 tax imposed thereon shall be paid by the deemed retailer;

6 (m) the gross receipts received from fees and charges by public and
7 private clubs, drinking establishments, organizations and businesses for
8 participation in sports, games and other recreational activities, but such
9 tax shall not be levied and collected upon the gross receipts received from:

10 (1) Fees and charges by any political subdivision, by any organization
11 exempt from property taxation pursuant to paragraph *Ninth* of K.S.A. 79-
12 201, and amendments thereto, or by any youth recreation organization
13 exclusively providing services to persons 18 years of age or younger which
14 is exempt from federal income taxation pursuant to section 501(c)(3) of
15 the federal internal revenue code of 1986, for participation in sports,
16 games and other recreational activities; and (2) entry fees and charges for
17 participation in a special event or tournament sanctioned by a national
18 sporting association to which spectators are charged an admission which
19 is taxable pursuant to subsection (e);

20 (n) the gross receipts received from dues charged by public and pri-
21 vate clubs, drinking establishments, organizations and businesses, pay-
22 ment of which entitles a member to the use of facilities for recreation or
23 entertainment, but such tax shall not be levied and collected upon the
24 gross receipts received from: (1) Dues charged by any organization ex-
25 empt from property taxation pursuant to paragraphs *Eighth* and *Ninth* of
26 K.S.A. 79-201, and amendments thereto; and (2) sales of memberships
27 in a nonprofit organization which is exempt from federal income taxation
28 pursuant to section 501 (c)(3) of the federal internal revenue code of
29 1986, and whose purpose is to support the operation of a nonprofit zoo;

30 (o) the gross receipts received from the isolated or occasional sale of
31 motor vehicles or trailers but not including: (1) The transfer of motor
32 vehicles or trailers by a person to a corporation or limited liability com-
33 pany solely in exchange for stock securities or membership interest in
34 such corporation or limited liability company; or (2) the transfer of motor
35 vehicles or trailers by one corporation or limited liability company to
36 another when all of the assets of such corporation or limited liability
37 company are transferred to such other corporation or limited liability
38 company; or (3) the sale of motor vehicles or trailers which are subject
39 to taxation pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 79-5101 *et seq.*, and
40 amendments thereto, by an immediate family member to another im-
41 mediate family member. For the purposes of clause (3), immediate family
42 member means lineal ascendants or descendants, and their spouses. In
43 determining the base for computing the tax on such isolated or occasional

1 sale, the fair market value of any motor vehicle or trailer traded in by the
2 purchaser to the seller may be deducted from the selling price;

3 (p) the gross receipts received for the service of installing or applying
4 tangible personal property which when installed or applied is not being
5 held for sale in the regular course of business, and whether or not such
6 tangible personal property when installed or applied remains tangible
7 personal property or becomes a part of real estate, except that no tax shall
8 be imposed upon the service of installing or applying tangible personal
9 property in connection with the original construction of a building or
10 facility, the original construction, reconstruction, restoration, remodeling,
11 renovation, repair or replacement of a residence or the construction, re-
12 construction, restoration, replacement or repair of a bridge or highway.

13 For the purposes of this subsection:

14 (1) "Original construction" shall mean the first or initial construction
15 of a new building or facility. The term "original construction" shall include
16 the addition of an entire room or floor to any existing building or facility,
17 the completion of any unfinished portion of any existing building or fa-
18 cility and the restoration, reconstruction or replacement of a building or
19 facility damaged or destroyed by fire, flood, tornado, lightning, explosion
20 or earthquake, but such term, except with regard to a residence, shall not
21 include replacement, remodeling, restoration, renovation or reconstruc-
22 tion under any other circumstances;

23 (2) "building" shall mean only those enclosures within which individ-
24 uals customarily are employed, or which are customarily used to house
25 machinery, equipment or other property, and including the land improve-
26 ments immediately surrounding such building;

27 (3) "facility" shall mean a mill, plant, refinery, oil or gas well, water
28 well, feedlot or any conveyance, transmission or distribution line of any
29 cooperative, nonprofit, membership corporation organized under or sub-
30 ject to the provisions of K.S.A. 17-4601 et seq., and amendments thereto,
31 or of any municipal or quasi-municipal corporation, including the land
32 improvements immediately surrounding such facility; and

33 (4) "residence" shall mean only those enclosures within which indi-
34 viduals customarily live;

35 (q) the gross receipts received for the service of repairing, servicing,
36 altering or maintaining tangible personal property which when such serv-
37 ices are rendered is not being held for sale in the regular course of busi-
38 ness, and whether or not any tangible personal property is transferred in
39 connection therewith. The tax imposed by this subsection shall be appli-
40 cable to the services of repairing, servicing, altering or maintaining an
41 item of tangible personal property which has been and is fastened to,
42 connected with or built into real property;

43 (r) the gross receipts from fees or charges made under service or

1 maintenance agreement contracts for services, charges for the providing
2 of which are taxable under the provisions of subsection (p) or (q);

3 (s) the gross receipts received from the sale of computer software,
4 and the sale of the services of modifying, altering, updating or maintaining
5 computer software. As used in this subsection, "computer software"
6 means information and directions loaded into a computer which dictate
7 different functions to be performed by the computer. Computer software
8 includes any canned or prewritten program which is held or existing for
9 general or repeated sale, even if the program was originally developed
10 for a single end user as custom computer software;

11 (t) the gross receipts received for telephone answering services, mo-
12 bile telecommunication services, beeper services and other similar serv-
13 ices. On and after August 1, 2002, the provisions of the federal mobile
14 telecommunications sourcing act as in effect on January 1, 2002, shall be
15 applicable to all sales of mobile telecommunication services taxable pur-
16 suant to this subsection. The secretary of revenue is hereby authorized
17 and directed to perform any act deemed necessary to properly implement
18 such provisions;

19 (u) the gross receipts received from the sale of prepaid telephone
20 calling cards or prepaid authorization numbers and the recharge of such
21 cards or numbers. A prepaid telephone calling card or prepaid authori-
22 zation number means the right to exclusively make telephone calls, paid
23 for in advance, that enables the origination of calls using an access number
24 or authorization code or both, whether manually or electronically dialed.
25 If the sale or recharge of such card or number does not take place at the
26 vendor's place of business, it shall be conclusively determined to take
27 place at the customer's shipping address; if there is no item shipped then
28 it shall be the customer's billing address; and

29 (v) the gross receipts received from the sales of bingo cards, bingo
30 faces and instant bingo tickets by licensees under K.S.A. 79-4701, *et seq.*,
31 and amendments thereto, shall be taxed at a rate of: (1) 4.9% on July 1,
32 2000, and before July 1, 2001; and (2) 2.5% on July 1, 2001, and before
33 July 1, 2002. From and after July 1, 2002, all sales of bingo cards, bingo
34 faces and instant bingo tickets by licensees under K.S.A. 79-4701 *et seq.*,
35 and amendments thereto, shall be exempt from taxes imposed pursuant
36 to this section.

37 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 79-3606 is hereby amended to read as
38 follows: 79-3606. The following shall be exempt from the tax imposed by
39 this act:

40 (a) All sales of motor-vehicle fuel or other articles upon which a sales
41 or excise tax has been paid, not subject to refund, under the laws of this
42 state except cigarettes as defined by K.S.A. 79-3301 and amendments
43 thereto, cereal malt beverages and malt products as defined by K.S.A. 79-

1 3817 and amendments thereto, including wort, liquid malt, malt syrup
2 and malt extract, which is not subject to taxation under the provisions of
3 K.S.A. 79-41a02 and amendments thereto, motor vehicles taxed pursuant
4 to K.S.A. 79-5117, and amendments thereto, tires taxed pursuant to
5 K.S.A. 65-3424d, and amendments thereto, and drycleaning and laundry
6 services taxed pursuant to K.S.A. 65-34,150, and amendments thereto;

7 (b) all sales of tangible personal property or service, including the
8 renting and leasing of tangible personal property, purchased directly by
9 the state of Kansas, a political subdivision thereof, other than a school or
10 educational institution, or purchased by a public or private nonprofit hos-
11 pital or public hospital authority or nonprofit blood, tissue or organ bank
12 and used exclusively for state, political subdivision, hospital or public hos-
13 pital authority or nonprofit blood, tissue or organ bank purposes, except
14 when: (1) Such state, hospital or public hospital authority is engaged or
15 proposes to engage in any business specifically taxable under the provi-
16 sions of this act and such items of tangible personal property or service
17 are used or proposed to be used in such business, or (2) such political
18 subdivision is engaged or proposes to engage in the business of furnishing
19 gas, electricity or heat to others and such items of personal property or
20 service are used or proposed to be used in such business;

21 (c) all sales of tangible personal property or services, including the
22 renting and leasing of tangible personal property, purchased directly by
23 a public or private elementary or secondary school or public or private
24 nonprofit educational institution and used primarily by such school or
25 institution for nonsectarian programs and activities provided or sponsored
26 by such school or institution or in the erection, repair or enlargement of
27 buildings to be used for such purposes. The exemption herein provided
28 shall not apply to erection, construction, repair, enlargement or equip-
29 ment of buildings used primarily for human habitation;

30 (d) all sales of tangible personal property or services purchased by a
31 contractor for the purpose of constructing, equipping, reconstructing,
32 maintaining, repairing, enlarging, furnishing or remodeling facilities for
33 any public or private nonprofit hospital or public hospital authority, public
34 or private elementary or secondary school or a public or private nonprofit
35 educational institution, which would be exempt from taxation under the
36 provisions of this act if purchased directly by such hospital or public hos-
37 pital authority, school or educational institution; and all sales of tangible
38 personal property or services purchased by a contractor for the purpose
39 of constructing, equipping, reconstructing, maintaining, repairing, en-
40 larging, furnishing or remodeling facilities for any political subdivision of
41 the state or district described in subsection (s), the total cost of which is
42 paid from funds of such political subdivision or district and which would
43 be exempt from taxation under the provisions of this act if purchased

1 directly by such political subdivision or district. Nothing in this subsection
2 or in the provisions of K.S.A. 12-3418 and amendments thereto, shall be
3 deemed to exempt the purchase of any construction machinery, equip-
4 ment or tools used in the constructing, equipping, reconstructing, main-
5 taining, repairing, enlarging, furnishing or remodeling facilities for any
6 political subdivision of the state or any such district. As used in this sub-
7 section, K.S.A. 12-3418 and 79-3640, and amendments thereto, “funds
8 of a political subdivision” shall mean general tax revenues, the proceeds
9 of any bonds and gifts or grants-in-aid. Gifts shall not mean funds used
10 for the purpose of constructing, equipping, reconstructing, repairing, en-
11 larging, furnishing or remodeling facilities which are to be leased to the
12 donor. When any political subdivision of the state, district described in
13 subsection (s), public or private nonprofit hospital or public hospital au-
14 thority, public or private elementary or secondary school or public or
15 private nonprofit educational institution shall contract for the purpose of
16 constructing, equipping, reconstructing, maintaining, repairing, enlarg-
17 ing, furnishing or remodeling facilities, it shall obtain from the state and
18 furnish to the contractor an exemption certificate for the project involved,
19 and the contractor may purchase materials for incorporation in such pro-
20 ject. The contractor shall furnish the number of such certificate to all
21 suppliers from whom such purchases are made, and such suppliers shall
22 execute invoices covering the same bearing the number of such certifi-
23 cate. Upon completion of the project the contractor shall furnish to the
24 political subdivision, district described in subsection (s), hospital or public
25 hospital authority, school or educational institution concerned a sworn
26 statement, on a form to be provided by the director of taxation, that all
27 purchases so made were entitled to exemption under this subsection. As
28 an alternative to the foregoing procedure, any such contracting entity may
29 apply to the secretary of revenue for agent status for the sole purpose of
30 issuing and furnishing project exemption certificates to contractors pur-
31 suant to rules and regulations adopted by the secretary establishing con-
32 ditions and standards for the granting and maintaining of such status. All
33 invoices shall be held by the contractor for a period of five years and shall
34 be subject to audit by the director of taxation. If any materials purchased
35 under such a certificate are found not to have been incorporated in the
36 building or other project or not to have been returned for credit or the
37 sales or compensating tax otherwise imposed upon such materials which
38 will not be so incorporated in the building or other project reported and
39 paid by such contractor to the director of taxation not later than the 20th
40 day of the month following the close of the month in which it shall be
41 determined that such materials will not be used for the purpose for which
42 such certificate was issued, the political subdivision, district described in
43 subsection (s), hospital or public hospital authority, school or educational

1 institution concerned shall be liable for tax on all materials purchased for
2 the project, and upon payment thereof it may recover the same from the
3 contractor together with reasonable attorney fees. Any contractor or any
4 agent, employee or subcontractor thereof, who shall use or otherwise
5 dispose of any materials purchased under such a certificate for any pur-
6 pose other than that for which such a certificate is issued without the
7 payment of the sales or compensating tax otherwise imposed upon such
8 materials, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction therefor,
9 shall be subject to the penalties provided for in subsection (g) of K.S.A.
10 79-3615, and amendments thereto;

11 (e) all sales of tangible personal property or services purchased by a
12 contractor for the erection, repair or enlargement of buildings or other
13 projects for the government of the United States, its agencies or instru-
14 mentalities, which would be exempt from taxation if purchased directly
15 by the government of the United States, its agencies or instrumentalities.
16 When the government of the United States, its agencies or instrumen-
17 talities shall contract for the erection, repair, or enlargement of any build-
18 ing or other project, it shall obtain from the state and furnish to the
19 contractor an exemption certificate for the project involved, and the con-
20 tractor may purchase materials for incorporation in such project. The
21 contractor shall furnish the number of such certificates to all suppliers
22 from whom such purchases are made, and such suppliers shall execute
23 invoices covering the same bearing the number of such certificate. Upon
24 completion of the project the contractor shall furnish to the government
25 of the United States, its agencies or instrumentalities concerned a sworn
26 statement, on a form to be provided by the director of taxation, that all
27 purchases so made were entitled to exemption under this subsection. As
28 an alternative to the foregoing procedure, any such contracting entity may
29 apply to the secretary of revenue for agent status for the sole purpose of
30 issuing and furnishing project exemption certificates to contractors pur-
31 suant to rules and regulations adopted by the secretary establishing con-
32 ditions and standards for the granting and maintaining of such status. All
33 invoices shall be held by the contractor for a period of five years and shall
34 be subject to audit by the director of taxation. Any contractor or any agent,
35 employee or subcontractor thereof, who shall use or otherwise dispose of
36 any materials purchased under such a certificate for any purpose other
37 than that for which such a certificate is issued without the payment of
38 the sales or compensating tax otherwise imposed upon such materials,
39 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction therefor, shall be
40 subject to the penalties provided for in subsection (g) of K.S.A. 79-3615
41 and amendments thereto;

42 (f) tangible personal property purchased by a railroad or public utility
43 for consumption or movement directly and immediately in interstate

1 commerce;

2 (g) sales of aircraft including remanufactured and modified aircraft,
3 sales of aircraft repair, modification and replacement parts and sales of
4 services employed in the remanufacture, modification and repair of air-
5 craft sold to persons using directly or through an authorized agent such
6 aircraft and aircraft repair, modification and replacement parts as certified
7 or licensed carriers of persons or property in interstate or foreign com-
8 merce under authority of the laws of the United States or any foreign
9 government or sold to any foreign government or agency or instrumen-

2 without the state of Kansas; and any purchaser of such property may
3 obtain from the director of taxation and furnish to the supplier an ex-
4 emption certificate number for tangible personal property for consump-
