8 9 AN ACT concerning telecommunications; relating to carrier of last resort 10 in certain areas and KUSF funding therefor; amending K.S.A. 66-2009 11 and repealing the existing section. 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14 Section 1. K.S.A. 66-2009 is hereby amended to read as follows: 66-15 2009. (a) Local exchange carriers that provided switched local exchange services in the state prior to January 1, 1996, or their successors, shall 16 serve as the carrier of last resort in their exchanges and shall be eligible 17to receive KUSF funding. However, with respect to the Hill City 1819 exchange area in which multiple carriers were certified prior to January 20 1, 1996, the commission's determination, subject to court appeals, shall 21determine which authorized carrier shall serve as carrier of last resort. 22 *Except as provided by subsection* (c), the local exchange carrier serving as the carrier of last resort on the effective date of this act, or such local 23 24exchange carrier's successor, shall remain the carrier of last resort and 25shall be entitled to recover the costs of serving as carrier of last resort. 26 (b) Beginning March 1, 1997, The amount of KUSF funds owed to

each qualifying telecommunications carrier, telecommunications public
utility or wireless telecommunications service provider in the state, based
upon the revenue requirements assigned to the funds for such qualifying
utility, carrier or provider, shall be allocated by the fund administrator in
equal monthly installments.

32 (c) Any eligible telecommunications carrier designated as set out in 33 subsection (b) of K.S.A. 66-2008, and amendments thereto, for the pro-34 vision of local exchange or exchange access service in a local service area 35 of any telecommunications public utility subject to price cap regulation 36 shall serve as the carrier of last resort in such service area and shall be 37 eligible to receive KUSF carrier of last resort funding whenever such car-38 rier becomes the carrier for more than 50% of the total number of access 39 lines eligible for KUSF support in such service area and offers to all the 40carrier's customers in such service area high speed digital service which 41 provides upstream, from customer to provider, and downstream, from 42 provider to customer, transmission of digital signals at a rate of at least 200 kilobits per second. 43
