AN ACT relating to the state board of healing arts; providing for the granting of certain licenses; amending K.S.A. 65-2873a and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 65-2873a is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-2873a. (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of K.S.A. 65-2873, the state board of healing arts may grant a license to practice medicine and surgery and renew the same annually as provided in K.S.A. 65-2809, and amendments thereto, to any person who meets all of the requirements of K.S.A. 65-2873, and amendments thereto, except the requirements of clause (2) clauses (1) and (3) of subsection (a) of such section, if such person is a citizen of the United States, a resident of Kansas, has a fellowship license, has been employed as a physician or by the state of Kansas for twenty (20) years or more, has been the head of a state hospital for five (5) years or more and has successfully completed the licensing examinations given by the state board of healing arts.:

- (1) Has completed at least two years of postgraduate training in a postgraduate training program in the United States approved by the board;
- (2) holds a valid institutional license issued under K.S.A. 65-2895, and amendments thereto, on the effective date of this act; and
- (3) has held a valid institutional license issued under K.S.A. 65-2895 and amendments thereto, for a period of at least five years.
  - (b) The provisions of this section shall expire on July 1, 2007.
  - Sec. 2. K.S.A. 65-2873a is hereby repealed.
- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
