9 AN ACT concerning open meetings; amending K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 754318 and repealing the existing section.

12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

13 Section 1. K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 75-4318 is hereby amended to read as 14follows: 75-4318. (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (f), all meet-15ings for the conduct of the affairs of, and the transaction of business by, 16 all legislative and administrative bodies and agencies of the state and 17political and taxing subdivisions thereof, including boards, commissions, 18authorities, councils, committees, subcommittees and other subordinate 19 groups thereof, receiving or expending and supported in whole or in part 20 by public funds shall be open to the public and no binding action by such 21 bodies shall be by secret ballot. Meetings of task forces, advisory com-22 mittees or subcommittees of advisory committees created pursuant to a 23governor's executive order shall be open to the public in accordance with 24this act.

(b) Notice of the date, time and place of any regular or special meeting of a public body designated hereinabove shall be furnished to any
person requesting such notice, except that:

(1) If notice is requested by petition, the petition shall designate one
person to receive notice on behalf of all persons named in the petition,
and notice to such person shall constitute notice to all persons named in
the petition;

(2) if notice is furnished to an executive officer of an employees' organization or trade association, such notice shall be deemed to have been
furnished to the entire membership of such organization or association;
and

(3) the public body may require that a request to receive notice must
be submitted again to the body prior to the commencement of any subsequent fiscal year of the body during which the person wishes to continue
receiving notice, but, prior to discontinuing notice to any person, the
public body must notify the person that notice will be discontinued unless
the person resubmits a request to receive notice.

42 (c) It shall be the duty of the presiding officer or other person calling43 the meeting, if the meeting is not called by the presiding officer, to furnish

1 the notice required by subsection (b).

2 (d) Prior to any meeting hereinabove mentioned, any agenda relating
3 to the business to be transacted at such meeting shall be made available
4 to any person requesting said agenda.

5 (e) The use of cameras, photographic lights and recording devices 6 shall not be prohibited at any meeting mentioned by subsection (a), but 7 such use shall be subject to reasonable rules designed to insure the or-8 derly conduct of the proceedings at such meeting.

(f) The provisions of the open meetings law shall not apply:

(1) To any administrative body that is authorized by law to exercise
quasi-judicial functions when such body is deliberating matters relating
to a decision involving such quasi-judicial functions;

(2) to the parole board when conducting parole hearings or paroleviolation hearings held at a correctional institution;

(3) to any impeachment inquiry or other impeachment matter referred to any committee of the house of representatives prior to the report
of such committee to the full house of representatives; and

(4) if otherwise provided by state or federal law or by rules of the
Kansas senate or house of representatives except that meetings of political
party caucuses of the Kansas senate or house of representatives shall be
open meetings and meetings of the senate committee on organization,
calendar and rules, or any successor committee to the senate committee
on organization, calendar and rules, shall be open meetings.
