AN ACT concerning school districts; relating to certain pupils; amending
 K.S.A. 72-1046a and repealing the existing section.

12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

13 Section 1. K.S.A. 72-1046a is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-14 1046a. (a) The board of education of any school district is hereby au-15thorized to permit pupils who are not residents of the school district to 16 enroll in and attend the schools of the district. Subject to the provisions 17of subsections (b) and (c), the board of education may permit such pupils 18 to attend school without charge or, subject to the provisions of subsection 19 (b), may charge such pupils for attendance at school to offset, totally or 20 in part, the costs of providing for such attendance. Amounts received 21 under this subsection by the board of education of a school district for 22 enrollment and attendance of pupils at school in regular educational programs shall be deposited in the general fund of the school district. 23

(b) Pupils who are not residents of a school district and are attending the schools of the school district in accordance with the provisions of an agreement entered into under authority of K.S.A. 72-8233, and amendments thereto, shall not be charged for attendance at school. The costs of providing for the attendance of such pupils at school shall be paid by the school district of residence of the pupils in accordance with the provisions of the agreement.

(c) The board of education of any school district which permits pupils
who are not residents of the state to enroll in and attend the schools of
the district shall make provision for the payment of tuition by such pupils.
The amount of tuition shall not be less than an amount equal to the average operating cost per pupil of the school district.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 72-1046a is hereby repealed.
