10 AN ACT concerning sales taxation; enacting the streamlined sales and  
11 use tax agreement conformity act; local sales tax transportation devel-  
12 opment district act; amending K.S.A. **12-189a**, 12-191, 12-198, 75-  
13 5151, 79-3607, 79-3608 and 79-3651 and K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 12-194,  
14 25-432, 79-3602, 79-3603, 79-3606, 79-3650 and 79-3703 and repeal-  
15 ing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 12-191a, **12-17,130**,  
16 **12-17,131**, **12-17,132**, **12-17,133**, **12-17,134**, **12-17,135**, **12-**  
17 **17,136**, **12-17,137**, **12-17,138** and **12-17,139**.

19 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

20 Section 1. **On and after July 1, 2004**, K.S.A. 12-191 is hereby  
21 amended to read as follows: 12-191. All retail transactions consummated  
22 within a county or city having a retail sales tax, which transactions are  
23 subject to the Kansas retailers' sales tax, shall also be subject to such  
24 county or city retail sales tax. Except as hereinafter provided, all retail  
25 sales, for the purpose of this act, shall be considered to have been con-  
26 summated at the ~~place of business of the retailer~~ *location determined by*  
27 *the sourcing rules as provided in section 16, and amendments thereto.*  
28 *The retail sales or transfer of watercraft, modular homes, manufactured*  
29 *homes or mobile homes, shall be considered consummated at the place of*  
30 *business of the retailer and sourced to such location. The retail sale, ex-*  
31 *cluding the lease or rental, of motor vehicles, trailers, semi-trailers or*  
32 *aircraft that do not qualify as transportation equipment, as defined in*  
33 *subsection (d) of section 16, and amendments thereto, shall be considered*  
34 *consummated at the place of business of the retailer and sourced to such*  
35 *location. The isolated or occasional sale of any motor vehicle or trailer*  
36 *shall be considered consummated at the taxing jurisdiction where the sale*  
37 *is made. If the sale negotiations occurred in different cities or counties,*  
38 *the situs of the sale for local sales tax purposes shall be the place where*  
39 *the motor vehicle or trailer was kept at the time negotiations were first*  
40 *entered into. In the event the place of business of a retailer is doubtful*  
41 *the place or places at which the retail sales are consummated for the*  
42 *purposes of this act shall be determined under rules and regulations*  
43 *adopted by the secretary of revenue which rules and regulations shall be*

1 considered with state and federal law insofar as applicable. ~~Retail sales~~  
2 ~~involving the use, consumption, or furnishing of gas, water, electricity and~~  
3 ~~heat, for the purposes of this act, shall be considered to have been con-~~  
4 ~~summated at the situs of the user or recipient thereof, and retail sales~~  
5 ~~involving the use or furnishing of telephone service or services taxed un-~~  
6 ~~der subsection (k) of K.S.A. 79-3603, and amendments thereto, shall be~~  
7 ~~considered to have been consummated at the situs of the subscriber billed~~  
8 ~~therefor. Retail sales involving the leasing of telecommunication or data~~  
9 ~~processing equipment commonly used in connection with telephone serv-~~  
10 ~~ices shall be considered to have been consummated at the situs of the~~  
11 ~~lessee. Retail sales involving the furnishing of services taxable under sub-~~  
12 ~~sections (p), (q) and (r) of K.S.A. 79-3603, and amendments thereto,~~  
13 ~~pursuant to a contract under which the sale of such services and the~~  
14 ~~furnishing of tangible personal property exceeds \$10,000 per contract per~~  
15 ~~contractor shall be considered to have been consummated at the situs~~  
16 ~~where such services are performed. The director of taxation is hereby~~  
17 ~~authorized to request and receive from any retailer or from any city or~~  
18 ~~county levying the tax such information as may be reasonably necessary~~  
19 ~~to determine the liability of retailers for any county or city sales tax. The~~  
20 ~~collection of any sales tax of a county or city approved at any election~~  
21 ~~shall commence on the first day of the calendar quarter next following~~  
22 ~~the 90th day after the date that the city or county has provided written~~  
23 ~~notice to the director of taxation of the election authorizing the levy of~~  
24 ~~such tax. *The collection of any such sales tax applicable to printed catalog*~~  
25 ~~*purchases wherein the purchaser computed the tax based upon local tax*~~  
26 ~~*rates published in the catalog, shall not commence until the first day of*~~  
27 ~~*the calendar quarter next following the 150th day after the date that the*~~  
28 ~~*city or county has provided written notice to the director of taxation of*~~  
29 ~~*the election authorizing the levy of such tax. The director of taxation shall*~~  
30 ~~*provide notice to sellers of such taxes within 30 days after receiving such*~~  
31 ~~*notice from the city or county.*~~

32 A city retailers' sales tax shall not become effective within any area  
33 annexed by a city levying such tax until the first day of the calendar quarter  
34 next following the 90th day after the date that the governing body of such  
35 city provided the state department of revenue with a certified copy of the  
36 annexation ordinance and a map of the city detailing the annexed area.  
37 *The director of taxation shall provide notice to sellers of such tax within*  
38 *30 days after receiving such notice from the city or county.*

39 Whenever any sales tax, imposed by any city or county under the pro-  
40 visions of this act, shall become effective, at any time prior to the time  
41 that revenue derived therefrom may be budgeted for expenditure in such  
42 year, such revenue shall be credited to the funds of the taxing subdivision  
43 or subdivisions and shall be carried forward to the credit of such funds

1 for the ensuing budget year in the manner provided for carrying forward  
2 balances remaining in such funds at the end of a budget year.

3     **Sec. 2. *On and after July 1, 2004***, K.S.A. 12-198 is hereby  
4 amended to read as follows: 12-198. (a) A compensating use tax for the  
5 privilege of using or storing within a city or county any *tangible personal*  
6 *property or any* vehicle which is required to be registered under the  
7 provisions of article 1 of chapter 8 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and  
8 amendments thereto, or any vessel, as defined by K.S.A. 82a-802, and  
9 amendments thereto, *or using, consuming or realizing the benefits from*  
10 *within a city or county any service that would otherwise be subject to*  
11 *retailer's sales tax if purchased in this state*, is hereby imposed by every  
12 city, county or municipal university imposing a retailers' sales tax. The  
13 rate of any such tax shall be fixed at the same rate as such city's, county's  
14 or university's retailers' sales tax. Any city, county or municipal university  
15 imposing a compensating use tax is prohibited from administering or col-  
16 lecting such tax locally, but shall utilize the services of the state depart-  
17 ment of revenue to administer, enforce and collect such tax. Such tax  
18 shall be identical in its application and exemptions therefrom to the Kan-  
19 sas compensating tax, and all laws and rules and regulations of the state  
20 department of revenue relating to the Kansas compensating tax shall ap-  
21 ply to such local compensating use tax insofar as the same may be made  
22 applicable.

23     (b) The secretary of revenue is authorized to administer, enforce and  
24 collect a city's, county's or municipal university's compensating use tax  
25 and to adopt such rules and regulations necessary for the efficient and  
26 effective administration, enforcement and collection thereof. The state  
27 director of taxation shall cause such taxes to be collected within the  
28 boundaries of such taxing subdivision at the same time and in the same  
29 manner provided for the collection of the state compensating use tax. All  
30 moneys collected by the director of taxation pursuant to the provisions of  
31 this section shall be credited to the city and county compensating use tax  
32 fund or to the municipal university compensating use tax fund, which  
33 funds are hereby established in the state treasury. Any refund due on any  
34 city's, county's municipal university's compensating use tax collected pur-  
35 suant to this section shall be paid out of the sales tax refund fund and  
36 reimbursement to such fund shall be made by the director of taxation  
37 from collections of local compensating use tax revenue. All moneys col-  
38 lected pursuant to this section for a city or county shall be remitted at  
39 least quarterly by the state treasurer to the treasurer of such city, county  
40 or university.

41     (c) All revenue received by any county treasurer from a countywide  
42 compensating use tax shall be apportioned among the county and each  
43 city located in such county in the same manner as provided in K.S.A. 12-

1 192, and amendments thereto, for the apportionment of revenue received  
2 from a countywide retailers' sales tax.

3 Sec. 3. **On and after July 1, 2004**, K.S.A. 75-5151 is hereby  
4 amended to read as follows: 75-5151. The secretary of revenue may re-  
5 quire, consistent with sound cash management policies, that any taxpayer  
6 whose total sales tax liability exceeds \$100,000 in any calendar year, any  
7 taxpayer whose total withholding tax liability exceeds \$100,000 in any  
8 calendar year, and any person owing any taxes or fees in connection with  
9 any return, report or document other than for sales tax or withholding  
10 tax liability, shall remit their tax liability by electronic funds transfer no  
11 later than the date required for such remittance except that the secretary  
12 may adopt rules and regulations prescribing alternative filing and payment  
13 dates not later than the last day of the month in which the tax was oth-  
14 erwise due. Electronic funds transfers may be made by wire transfers of  
15 funds through the federal reserve system or by any other means estab-  
16 lished by the secretary, with the approval of the state treasurer, which  
17 insures the availability of such funds to the state on the date of payment.  
18 Evidence of such payment shall be furnished to the secretary on or before  
19 the due date of the tax as established by law. Failure to timely make such  
20 payment in immediately available funds or failure to provide such evi-  
21 dence of payment in a timely manner shall subject the taxpayer to penalty  
22 and interest as provided by law for delinquent or deficient tax payments.  
23 *All sales and use tax remittances from model 1, 2 and 3 sellers must be*  
24 *remitted electronically. Any data that accompanies a remittance must be*  
25 *formatted using uniform tax type and payment type codes approved by*  
26 *the secretary.*

27 Sec. 4. **On and after July 1, 2004**, K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 79-3602 is  
28 hereby amended to read as follows: 79-3602. ~~(a) "Persons" means any~~  
29 ~~individual, firm, copartnership, joint adventure, association, corporation,~~  
30 ~~estate or trust, receiver or trustee, or any group or combination acting as~~  
31 ~~a unit, and the plural as well as the singular number, and shall specifically~~  
32 ~~mean any city or other political subdivision of the state of Kansas engaging~~  
33 ~~in a business or providing a service specifically taxable under the provi-~~  
34 ~~sions of this act.~~

35 ~~—(b) "Director" means the state director of taxation.~~

36 ~~—(c) "Sale" or "sales" means the exchange of tangible personal prop-~~  
37 ~~erty, as well as the sale thereof for money, and every transaction, condi-~~  
38 ~~tional or otherwise, for a consideration, constituting a sale, including the~~  
39 ~~sale or furnishing of electrical energy, gas, water, services or entertain-~~  
40 ~~ment taxable under the terms of this act and including, except as provided~~  
41 ~~in the following provision, the sale of the use of tangible personal property~~  
42 ~~by way of a lease, license to use or the rental thereof regardless of the~~  
43 ~~method by which the title, possession or right to use the tangible personal~~

1 property is transferred. The term “sale” or “sales” shall not mean the sale  
2 of the use of any tangible personal property used as a dwelling by way of  
3 a lease or rental thereof for a term of more than 28 consecutive days.

4 —(d) “Retailer” means a person ~~seller~~ regularly engaged in the business  
5 of selling, ~~leasing or renting~~ tangible personal property at retail or fur-  
6 nishing electrical energy, gas, water, services or entertainment, and selling  
7 only to the user or consumer and not for resale.

8 —(e) “Retail sale” or “sale at retail” means all sales made within the  
9 state of tangible personal property or electrical energy, gas, water, services  
10 or entertainment for use or consumption and not for resale ~~any sale, lease~~  
11 ~~or rental for any purpose other than for resale, sublease or subrent.~~

12 —(f) “Tangible personal property” means corporeal personal property  
13 ~~that can be seen, weighed, measured, felt or touched, or that is in any~~  
14 ~~other manner perceptible to the senses. Tangible personal property in-~~  
15 ~~cludes electricity, water, gas, steam and prewritten computer software.~~  
16 Such term shall include: (1) Any computer software program which is not  
17 a custom computer software program, as described by subsection (s) of  
18 K.S.A. 79-3603, and amendments thereto; and (2) any prepaid telephone  
19 calling card or prepaid authorization number, or recharge of such card  
20 or number, as described by subsection (b) of K.S.A. 79-3603, and amend-  
21 ments thereto.

22 —(g) “Sales or selling price” means the total cost to the consumer ex-  
23 clusive of discounts allowed and credited, but including freight and trans-  
24 portation charges from retailer to consumer. ~~applies to the measure sub-~~  
25 ~~ject to sales tax and means the total amount of consideration, including~~  
26 ~~cash, credit, property and services, for which personal property or serv-~~  
27 ~~ices are sold, leased or rented, valued in money, whether received in~~  
28 ~~money or otherwise, without any deduction for the following:~~

29 —(A) ~~The seller’s cost of the property sold;~~

30 —(B) ~~the cost of materials used, labor or service cost, interest, losses,~~  
31 ~~all costs of transportation to the seller, all taxes imposed on the seller and~~  
32 ~~any other expense of the seller;~~

33 —(C) ~~charges by the seller for any services necessary to complete the~~  
34 ~~sale, other than delivery and installation charges;~~

35 —(D) ~~delivery charges;~~

36 —(E) ~~installation charges; and~~

37 —(F) ~~the value of exempt personal property given to the purchaser~~  
38 ~~where taxable and exempt personal property have been bundled together~~  
39 ~~and sold by the seller as a single product or piece of merchandise.~~

40 —(2) “Sales or selling price” shall not include:

41 —(A) ~~Discounts, including cash, term or coupons that are not reim-~~  
42 ~~bursed by a third party that are allowed by a seller and taken by a pur-~~  
43 ~~chaser on a sale;~~

1 ~~—(B) interest, financing and carrying charges from credit extended on~~  
2 ~~the sale of personal property or services, if the amount is separately stated~~  
3 ~~on the invoice, bill of sale or similar document given to the purchaser;~~

4 ~~—(C) any taxes legally imposed directly on the consumer that are sep-~~  
5 ~~arately stated on the invoice, bill of sale or similar document given to the~~  
6 ~~purchaser; and~~

7 ~~—(D) the amount equal to the allowance given for the trade-in of prop-~~  
8 ~~erty, if separately stated on the invoice, billing or similar document given~~  
9 ~~to the purchaser.~~

10 ~~—(h) “Gross receipts” means the total selling price or the amount re-~~  
11 ~~ceived as defined in this act, in money, credits, property or other consid-~~  
12 ~~eration valued in money from sales at retail within this state; and em-~~  
13 ~~braced within the provisions of this act. The taxpayer, may take credit in~~  
14 ~~the report of gross receipts for: (1) An amount equal to the selling price~~  
15 ~~of property returned by the purchaser when the full sale price thereof,~~  
16 ~~including the tax collected, is refunded in cash or by credit, and (2) an~~  
17 ~~amount equal to the allowance given for the trade-in of property.~~

18 ~~—(i) “Taxpayer” means any person obligated to account to the director~~  
19 ~~for taxes collected under the terms of this act.~~

20 ~~—(j) “Isolated or occasional sale” means the nonrecurring sale of tan-~~  
21 ~~gible personal property, or services taxable hereunder by a person not~~  
22 ~~engaged at the time of such sale in the business of selling such property~~  
23 ~~or services. Any religious organization which makes a nonrecurring sale~~  
24 ~~of tangible personal property acquired for the purpose of resale shall be~~  
25 ~~deemed to be not engaged at the time of such sale in the business of~~  
26 ~~selling such property. Such term shall include: (1) Any sale by a bank,~~  
27 ~~savings and loan institution, credit union or any finance company licensed~~  
28 ~~under the provisions of the Kansas uniform consumer credit code of tan-~~  
29 ~~gible personal property which has been repossessed by any such entity;~~  
30 ~~and (2) any sale of tangible personal property made by an auctioneer or~~  
31 ~~agent on behalf of not more than two principals or households if such~~  
32 ~~sale is nonrecurring and any such principal or household is not engaged~~  
33 ~~at the time of such sale in the business of selling tangible personal~~  
34 ~~property.~~

35 ~~—(k) “Service” means those services described in and taxed under the~~  
36 ~~provisions of K.S.A. 79-3603 and amendments thereto.~~

37 ~~—(l) “Ingredient or component part” means tangible personal property~~  
38 ~~which is necessary or essential to, and which is actually used in and be-~~  
39 ~~comes an integral and material part of tangible personal property or ser-~~  
40 ~~vices produced, manufactured or compounded for sale by the producer,~~  
41 ~~manufacturer or compounder in its regular course of business. The fol-~~  
42 ~~lowing items of tangible personal property are hereby declared to be~~  
43 ~~ingredients or component parts, but the listing of such property shall not~~

1 be deemed to be exclusive nor shall such listing be construed to be a  
2 restriction upon, or an indication of, the type or types of property to be  
3 included within the definition of “ingredient or component part” as  
4 herein set forth:

5 —(1) Containers, labels and shipping cases used in the distribution of  
6 property produced, manufactured or compounded for sale which are not  
7 to be returned to the producer, manufacturer or compounder for reuse.

8 —(2) Containers, labels, shipping cases, paper bags, drinking straws,  
9 paper plates, paper cups, twine and wrapping paper used in the distri-  
10 bution and sale of property taxable under the provisions of this act by  
11 wholesalers and retailers and which is not to be returned to such whole-  
12 saler or retailer for reuse.

13 —(3) Seeds and seedlings for the production of plants and plant prod-  
14 ucts produced for resale.

15 —(4) Paper and ink used in the publication of newspapers.

16 —(5) Fertilizer used in the production of plants and plant products  
17 produced for resale.

18 —(6) Feed for animals, fowl and aquatic plants and animals, the primary  
19 purpose of which is use in agriculture or aquaculture, as defined in K.S.A.  
20 47-1901, and amendments thereto, the production of food for human  
21 consumption, the production of animal, dairy, poultry or aquatic plant  
22 and animal products, fiber, fur, or the production of offspring for use for  
23 any such purpose or purposes.

24 —(m) “Property which is consumed” means tangible personal property  
25 which is essential or necessary to and which is used in the actual process  
26 of and consumed, depleted or dissipated within one year in (1) the pro-  
27 duction, manufacture, processing, mining, drilling, refining or compound-  
28 ing of tangible personal property, (2) the providing of services, (3) the  
29 irrigation of crops, for sale in the regular course of business, or (4) the  
30 storage or processing of grain by a public grain warehouse or other grain  
31 storage facility, and which is not reusable for such purpose. The following  
32 is a listing of tangible personal property, included by way of illustration  
33 but not of limitation, which qualifies as property which is consumed:

34 —(A) Insecticides, herbicides, germicides, pesticides, fungicides, fu-  
35 migants, antibiotics, biologicals, pharmaceuticals, vitamins and chemicals  
36 for use in commercial or agricultural production, processing or storage of  
37 fruit, vegetables, feeds, seeds, grains, animals or animal products whether  
38 fed, injected, applied, combined with or otherwise used;

39 —(B) electricity, gas and water; and

40 —(C) petroleum products, lubricants, chemicals, solvents, reagents and  
41 catalysts.

42 —(n) “Political subdivision” means any municipality, agency or subdivi-  
43 sion of the state which is, or shall hereafter be, authorized to levy taxes

1 upon tangible property within the state or which certifies a levy to a  
2 municipality, agency or subdivision of the state which is, or shall hereafter  
3 be, authorized to levy taxes upon tangible property within the state. Such  
4 term also shall include any public building commission, housing, airport,  
5 port, metropolitan transit or similar authority established pursuant to law.

6 —(o) “Municipal corporation” means any city incorporated under the  
7 laws of Kansas.

8 —(p) “Quasi-municipal corporation” means any county, township,  
9 school district, drainage district or any other governmental subdivision in  
10 the state of Kansas having authority to receive or hold moneys or funds.

11 —(q) “Nonprofit blood bank” means any nonprofit place, organization,  
12 institution or establishment that is operated wholly or in part for the  
13 purpose of obtaining, storing, processing, preparing for transfusing, fur-  
14 nishing, donating or distributing human blood or parts or fractions of  
15 single blood units or products derived from single blood units, whether  
16 or not any remuneration is paid therefor, or whether such procedures are  
17 done for direct therapeutic use or for storage for future use of such  
18 products.

19 —(r) “Educational institution” means any nonprofit school, college and  
20 university that offers education at a level above the twelfth grade, and  
21 conducts regular classes and courses of study required for accreditation  
22 by, or membership in, the North Central Association of Colleges and  
23 Schools, the state board of education, or that otherwise qualify as an  
24 “educational institution,” as defined by K.S.A. 74-50,103, and amend-  
25 ments thereto. Such phrase shall include: (1) A group of educational in-  
26 stitutions that operates exclusively for an educational purpose; (2) non-  
27 profit endowment associations and foundations organized and operated  
28 exclusively to receive, hold, invest and administer moneys and property  
29 as a permanent fund for the support and sole benefit of an educational  
30 institution; (3) nonprofit trusts, foundations and other entities organized  
31 and operated principally to hold and own receipts from intercollegiate  
32 sporting events and to disburse such receipts, as well as grants and gifts,  
33 in the interest of collegiate and intercollegiate athletic programs for the  
34 support and sole benefit of an educational institution; and (4) nonprofit  
35 trusts, foundations and other entities organized and operated for the pri-  
36 mary purpose of encouraging, fostering and conducting scholarly inves-  
37 tigation and industrial and other types of research for the support and  
38 sole benefit of an educational institution.

39 —(s) “Agent” means a person appointed by a seller to represent the  
40 seller before the member states.

41 —(t) “Agreement” means the multistate agreement entitled the stream-  
42 lined sales and use tax agreement approved by the streamlined sales tax  
43 implementing states at Chicago, Illinois on November 12, 2002.



1 ~~—(u) “Alcoholic beverages” means beverages that are suitable for hu-~~  
2 ~~man consumption and contain .05% or more of alcohol by volume.~~

3 ~~—(v) “Certified automated system (CAS)” means software certified un-~~  
4 ~~der the agreement to calculate the tax imposed by each jurisdiction on a~~  
5 ~~transaction, determine the amount of tax to remit to the appropriate state~~  
6 ~~and maintain a record of the transaction.~~

7 ~~—(w) “Certified service provider (CSP)” means an agent certified under~~  
8 ~~the agreement to perform all the seller’s sales and use tax functions, other~~  
9 ~~than the seller’s obligation to remit tax on its own purchases.~~

10 ~~—(x) “Computer” means an electronic device that accepts information~~  
11 ~~in digital or similar form and manipulates it for a result based on a se-~~  
12 ~~quence of instructions.~~

13 ~~—(y) “Computer software” means a set of coded instructions designed~~  
14 ~~to cause a computer or automatic data processing equipment to perform~~  
15 ~~a task.~~

16 ~~—(z) “Delivery charges” means charges by the seller of personal prop-~~  
17 ~~erty or services for preparation and delivery to a location designated by~~  
18 ~~the purchaser of personal property or services including, but not limited~~  
19 ~~to, transportation, shipping, postage, handling, crating and packing.~~

20 ~~—(aa) “Delivered electronically” means delivered to the purchaser by~~  
21 ~~means other than tangible storage media.~~

22 ~~—(bb) “Direct mail” means printed material delivered or distributed by~~  
23 ~~United States mail or other delivery services to a mass audience or to~~  
24 ~~addressees on a mailing list provided by the purchaser or at the direction~~  
25 ~~of the purchaser when the cost of the items are not billed directly to the~~  
26 ~~recipients. Direct mail includes tangible personal property supplied di-~~  
27 ~~rectly or indirectly by the purchaser to the direct mail seller for inclusion~~  
28 ~~in the package containing the printed material. Direct mail does not in-~~  
29 ~~clude multiple items of printed material delivered to a single address.~~

30 ~~—(cc) “Electronic” means relating to technology having electrical, dig-~~  
31 ~~ital, magnetic, wireless, optical, electromagnetic or similar capabilities.~~

32 ~~—(dd) “Food and food ingredients” means substances, whether in liq-~~  
33 ~~uid, concentrated, solid, frozen, dried or dehydrated form, that are sold~~  
34 ~~for ingestion or chewing by humans and are consumed for their taste or~~  
35 ~~nutritional value. “Food and food ingredients” does not include alcoholic~~  
36 ~~beverages or tobacco.~~

37 ~~—(ee) “Lease or rental” means any transfer of possession or control of~~  
38 ~~tangible personal property for a fixed or indeterminate term for consid-~~  
39 ~~eration. A lease or rental may include future options to purchase or~~  
40 ~~extend.~~

41 ~~—(1) Lease or rental does not include: (A) A transfer of possession or~~

35 a sale is not subject to tax is upon the ~~vendor~~ seller unless the ~~vendor~~  
36 seller takes from the purchaser an exemption certificate to the effect that  
37 the property or service purchased is not subject to tax.

38 (b) An exemption certificate shall relieve the ~~vendor~~ seller from col-  
39 lecting and remitting tax ~~when taken in good faith. A vendor shall be~~  
40 ~~presumed to have accepted an exemption certificate in good faith in the~~  
41 ~~absence of evidence to the contrary. A vendor shall be deemed to have~~  
42 ~~accepted an exemption certificate in good faith if the vendor: (1) Main-~~  
43 ~~tains a completed exemption certificate; (2) has ascertained the identity~~

1 of the person or entity who presented the exemption certificate; and (3)  
2 has not been shown by a preponderance of the evidence to have had  
3 knowledge that the presentation of the certificate was improper if the  
4 seller has obtained the required identifying information as determined by  
5 the director, from the purchaser and the reason for claiming the exemption  
6 at the time of purchase and has maintained proper records of exempt  
7 transactions pursuant to subsection (a) of K.S.A. 79-3609, and amend-  
8 ments thereto and provided them to the director when requested, except  
9 that a seller who fraudulently fails to collect the tax or solicits purchasers  
10 to participate in the unlawful claim of an exemption shall not be relieved  
11 from such liability. The seller shall obtain the same information for proof  
12 of a claimed exemption regardless of the medium in which the transaction  
13 occurred. The purchaser improperly claiming an exemption shall remain  
14 liable for the nonpayment of tax.

15 (c) The exemption certificate shall be substantially in such form as  
16 the director may prescribe. *The seller shall use the standard form for*  
17 *claiming an exemption electronically as adopted by the director. A vendor*  
18 *seller may require a purchaser to provide a copy of the purchaser's sales*  
19 *tax registration certificate with a resale certificate as a condition for hon-*  
20 *oring the purchaser's resale exemption claim. A purchaser is not required*  
21 *to provide a signature to claim an exemption from tax unless a paper*  
22 *exemption certificate is used.*

23 (d) To lawfully present a resale exemption certificate the purchaser  
24 must be engaged in the business of selling property or services of the  
25 same kind that is purchased, hold a registration certificate, and at the  
26 time of purchase, either intend to resell the property in the regular course  
27 of business or be unable to ascertain whether the property will be resold  
28 or used for some other purpose.

29 (e) Any person who issues a resale certificate or other exemption  
30 certificate in order to unlawfully avoid payment of tax for business or  
31 personal gain shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall  
32 be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or imprisonment for not  
33 more than one year, or by both. In addition, if the director determines  
34 that a person issued a resale certificate in order to unlawfully avoid pay-  
35 ment of tax for business or personal gain, the director shall increase any  
36 penalty that is due from the person under K.S.A. 79-3615, and amend-  
37 ments thereto, by \$250 or 10 times the tax due, whichever is greater, on  
38 each transaction where the misuse of a resale certificate occurred.

39 (f) Exemption certificates issued by a nonprofit entity claiming a spe-  
40 cific exemption under K.S.A. 79-3606, and amendments thereto, shall  
41 bear the name and address of the entity and indicate the subsection under  
42 which the exemption is being claimed. Such certificate shall be signed by  
43 an officer, office manager or other administrator of the nonprofit entity,



1 *if in paper form*, and contain the driver's license number of the signer.  
2 The certificate shall be substantially in such form as the director may  
3 prescribe. Payments made on an exempt entity's check, warrant, voucher  
4 or is charged to the entity's account shall relieve the ~~vendor~~ *seller* from  
5 collecting and remitting the tax if it is taken in good faith.

6 (g) It shall be the duty of every person who purchases tangible per-  
7 sonal property or services that are taxable under this act to pay the full  
8 amount of tax that is lawfully due to the retailer making the sale. Any  
9 person who willfully and intentionally refuses to pay such tax to the re-  
10 tailer shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be pun-  
11 ished and fined as provided by subsection (g) of K.S.A. 79-3615, and  
12 amendments thereto.

13 Sec. 11. ***On and after July 1, 2004***, K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 79-3703 is  
14 hereby amended to read as follows: 79-3703. There is hereby levied and  
15 there shall be collected from every person in this state a tax or excise for  
16 the privilege of using, storing, or consuming within this state any article  
17 of tangible personal property *or using, consuming or otherwise realizing*  
18 *the benefits in this state from any services provided*. Such tax shall be  
19 levied and collected in an amount equal to the consideration paid by the  
20 taxpayer multiplied by the rate of 5.3% on and after July 1, 2002, and  
21 before July 1, 2004, 5.2% on and after July 1, 2004, and before July 1,  
22 2005, and 5% on and after July 1, 2005. Within a redevelopment district  
23 established pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8921, and amendments thereto, there  
24 is hereby levied and there shall be collected and paid an additional tax of  
25 2% until the earlier of: (1) The date the bonds issued to finance or re-

35 New Sec. 12. State sales tax rate changes must take effect on the first  
36 day of a calendar quarter. The secretary shall make a reasonable effort to  
37 provide sellers with as much advance notice as practicable of any rate  
38 changes, legislative change in the tax base and amendments to sales and  
39 use tax rules and regulations. Failure of a seller to receive such notice or  
40 failure of the secretary to provide such notice to a seller or limit the  
41 effective date of a rate change shall not relieve the seller of its obligation  
42 to collect sales or use tax or otherwise comply with any such legislative,  
43 rule or regulatory changes.

1 New Sec. 13. On and after the databases are developed pursuant to  
2 subsections (a), (b) and (c) of section 14 and amendments thereto and  
3 after the state has joined and become a member of the agreement, but  
4 not before July 1, 2004, sellers and certified service providers (CSPs) are  
5 relieved from liability for state and local sales and use tax for having  
6 charged and collected the incorrect amount of sales tax resulting from

20 and use tax rates for all taxing jurisdictions. For the identification of coun-  
21 ties and cities, codes corresponding to the rates must be provided ac-  
22 cording to federal information processing standards (FIPS) as developed  
23 by the national institute of standards and technology. For the identifica-  
24 tion of all other jurisdictions, codes corresponding to the rates must be  
25 in the format determined by the secretary.

26 (c) The secretary must provide and maintain a database that assigns

1 and (d) shall be in downloadable format as determined by the secretary.  
2 The provisions of subsections (c) and (d) do not apply when the purchased  
3 product is received by the purchaser at the business location of the seller.

4 New Sec. 15. (a) The retail sale of a product shall be sourced in  
5 accordance with section 16 and amendments thereto. The provisions of  
6 section 16 and amendments thereto apply regardless of the characteri-  
7 zation of a product as tangible personal property, a digital good or a  
8 service. The provisions of section 16 and amendments thereto only apply  
9 to determine a seller's obligation to pay or collect and remit a sales or  
10 use tax with respect to the seller's retail sale of a product. These provisions  
11 do not affect the obligation of a purchaser or lessee to remit tax on the  
12 use of the product to the taxing jurisdictions of that use.

13 (b) Section 16 and amendments thereto does not apply to sales or  
14 use taxes levied on the following: (1) The retail sale or transfer of water  
15 craft, modular homes, manufactured homes or mobile homes. The retail  
16 sale of these items shall be sourced according to K.S.A. 12-191 and  
17 amendments thereto;

18 (2) the retail sales, excluding lease or rental, of motor vehicles, trail-  
19 ers, semi-trailers or aircraft that do not qualify as transportation equip-  
20 ment, as defined in subsection (d) of section 16 and amendments thereto.  
21 The retail sale of these items shall be sourced according to K.S.A. 12-191  
22 and amendments thereto and the lease or rental of these items must be  
23 sourced according to subsection (c) of section 16 and amendments  
24 thereto; and

25 (3) telecommunications services, as set out in section 19 and amend-  
26 ments thereto, shall be sourced in accordance with section 19 and amend-  
27 ments thereto.

28 New Sec. 16. (a) The retail sale, excluding lease or rental, of a prod-  
29 uct shall be sourced as follows: (1) When the product is received by the  
30 purchaser at a business location of the seller, the sale is sourced to that  
31 business location;

32 (2) when the product is not received by the purchaser at a business  
33 location of the seller, the sale is sourced to the location where receipt by  
34 the purchaser, or the purchaser's donee, designated as such by the pur-  
35 chaser, occurs, including the location indicated by instructions for delivery  
36 to the purchaser or donee, known to the seller;

37 (3) when subsection (a)(1) and (a)(2) do not apply, the sale is sourced  
38 to the location indicated by an address for the purchaser that is available  
39 from the business records of the seller that are maintained in the ordinary  
40 course of the seller's business when use of this address does not constitute  
41 bad faith;

42 (4) when subsections (a)(1), (a)(2) and (a)(3) do not apply, the sale is  
43 sourced to the location indicated by an address for the purchaser obtained

1 during the consummation of the sale, including the address of a pur-  
2 chaser's payment instrument, if no other address is available, when use  
3 of this address does not constitute bad faith;

4 (5) when none of the previous rules of subsection (a)(1), (a)(2), (a)(3)  
5 or (a)(4) apply, including the circumstance in which the seller is without  
6 sufficient information to apply the previous rules, then the location will  
7 be determined by the address from which tangible personal property was  
8 shipped, from which the digital good or the computer software delivered  
9 electronically was first available for transmission by the seller, or from  
10 which the service was provided, disregarding for these purposes any lo-  
11 cation that merely provided the digital transfer of the product sold.

12 (b) The lease or rental of tangible personal property, other than prop-  
13 erty identified in subsection (c) or (d), shall be sourced as follows: (1) For  
14 a lease or rental that requires recurring periodic payments, the first pe-  
15 riodic payment is sourced the same as a retail sale in accordance with the  
16 provisions of subsection (a). Periodic payments made subsequent to the  
17 first payment are sourced to the primary property location for each period  
18 covered by the payment. The primary property location shall be as indi-  
19 cated by an address for the property provided by the lessee that is avail-  
20 able to the lessor from its records maintained in the ordinary course of  
21 business, when use of this address does not constitute bad faith. The

25 (2) for a lease or rental that does not require recurring periodic pay-  
26 ments, the payment is sourced the same as a retail sale in accordance  
27 with the provisions of subsection (a); and

28 (3) this subsection does not affect the imposition or computation of  
29 sales or use tax on leases or rentals based on a lump sum or accelerated  
30 basis, or on the acquisition of property for lease.

31 (c) The lease or rental of motor vehicles, trailers, semi-trailers or air-  
32 craft that do not qualify as transportation equipment, as defined in sub-  
33 section (d), shall be sourced as follows: (1) For a lease or rental that  
34 requires recurring periodic payments, each periodic payment is sourced  
35 to the primary property location. The primary property location shall be  
36 as indicated by an address for the property provided by the lessee that is  
37 available to the lessor from its records maintained in the ordinary course  
38 of business, when use of this address does not constitute bad faith. This  
39 location shall not be altered by intermittent use at different locations;

40 (2) for a lease or rental that does not require recurring periodic pay-  
41 ments, the payment is sourced the same as a retail sale in accordance  
42 with the provisions of subsection (a); and

43 (3) this subsection does not affect the imposition or computation of

1 sales or use tax on leases or rentals based on a lump sum or accelerated  
2 basis or on the acquisition of property for lease.

3 (d) The retail sale, including lease or rental, of transportation equip-  
4 ment shall be sourced the same as a retail sale in accordance with the  
5 provisions of subsection (a), notwithstanding the exclusion of lease or  
6 rental in subsection (a). “Transportation equipment” means any of the  
7 following: (1) Locomotives and railcars that are utilized for the carriage  
8 of persons or property in interstate commerce;

9 (2) trucks and truck-tractors with a gross vehicle weight rating  
10 (GVWR) of 10,001 pounds or greater, trailers, semi-trailers or passenger  
11 buses that are: (A) Registered through the international registration plan;  
12 and

13 (B) operated under authority of a carrier authorized and certificated  
14 by the United States department of transportation or another federal or

28 a shipping company on behalf of the purchaser.

29 New Sec. 17. (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 16 and  
30 amendments thereto, a business purchaser that is not a holder of a direct  
31 pay permit that knows at the time of its purchase of a digital good, com-  
32 puter software delivered electronically or a service that the digital good,  
33 computer software delivered electronically or service will be concurrently  
34 available for use in more than one jurisdiction shall deliver to the seller  
35 in conjunction with its purchase a multiple points of use or MPU exemp-  
36 tion form disclosing this fact.

37 (b) Upon receipt of the MPU exemption form, the seller is relieved

7 the MPU exemption form to the seller. A direct pay permit holder shall

9 digital good or a service that will be concurrently available for use in more  
10 than one jurisdiction.

11 New Sec. 18. (a) (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 16  
12 and amendments thereto, a purchaser of direct mail that is not a holder  
13 of a direct pay permit shall provide to the seller in conjunction with the  
14 purchase either a direct mail form or information to show the jurisdictions  
15 to which the direct mail is delivered to recipients.

33 (c) If a purchaser of direct mail provides the seller with documen-  
34 tation of direct pay authority, the purchaser shall not be required to pro-  
35 vide a direct mail form or delivery information to the seller.

36 New Sec. 19. (a) Except for the defined telecommunication services  
37 in subsection (c), the sale of telecommunication service sold on a call-by-  
38 call basis shall be sourced to each level of taxing jurisdiction where the  
39 call originates and terminates in that jurisdiction or each level of taxing  
40 jurisdiction where the call either originates or terminates and in which  
41 the service address is also located.

42 (b) Except for the defined telecommunication services in subsection  
43 (c), a sale of telecommunications services sold on a basis other than a call-

1 by-call basis, is sourced to the customer's place of primary use.

2 (c) The sale of the following telecommunication services shall be  
3 sourced to each level of taxing jurisdiction as follows: (1) A sale of mobile  
4 communications services other than air-to-ground radiotelephone service  
5 and prepaid calling service, is sourced to the customer's place of primary  
6 use as required by the mobile telecommunications sourcing act;

7 (2) a sale of post-paid calling service is sourced to the origination  
8 point of the telecommunications signal as first identified by either the  
9 seller's telecommunications system, or information received by the seller  
10 from its service provider, where the system used to transport such signals  
11 is not that of the seller; and

12 (3) a sale of prepaid calling service is sourced in accordance with  
13 section 16 and amendments thereto, except that in the case of a sale of  
14 mobile telecommunications service that is a prepaid telecommunications  
15 service, the rule provided in subsection (a)(5) of section 16 and amend-  
16 ments thereto shall include as an option the location associate with the  
17 mobile telephone number.

18 (d) A sale of a private communication service is sourced as follows:  
19 (1) Service for a separate charge related to a customer channel termina-  
20 tion point is sourced to each level of jurisdiction in which such customer  
21 channel termination point is located;

22 (2) service where all customer termination points are located entirely  
23 within one jurisdiction or levels of jurisdiction is sourced in such juris-  
24 diction in which the customer channel termination points are located;

25 (3) service for segments of a channel between two customer channel  
26 termination points located in different jurisdictions and which segment  
27 of channel are separately charged is sourced 50% in each level of juris-  
28 diction in which the customer channel termination points are located; and

29 (4) service for segments of a channel located in more than one juris-  
30 diction or levels of jurisdiction and which segments are not separately  
31 billed is sourced in each jurisdiction based on the percentage determined  
32 by dividing the number of customer channel termination points in such  
33 jurisdiction by the total number of customer channel termination points.

34 (e) As used in this section: (1) "Air-to-ground radiotelephone service"  
35 means a radio service, as that term is defined in 47 CFR 22.99, in which  
36 common carriers are authorized to offer and provide radio telecommu-  
37 nications service for hire to subscribers in aircraft;

38 (2) "call-by-call basis" means any method of charging for telecom-  
39 munications services where the price is measured by individual calls;

40 (3) "communications channel" means a physical or virtual path of  
41 communications over which signals are transmitted between or among  
42 customer channel termination points;

43 (4) "customer" means the person or entity that contracts with the

1 seller of telecommunications services. If the end user of telecommuni-  
2 cations services is not the contracting party, the end user of the telecom-  
3 munications service is the customer of the telecommunication service,  
4 but this sentence only applies for the purpose of sourcing sales of tele-  
5 communications services under this section. Customer does not include  
6 a reseller of telecommunications service or for mobile telecommunica-  
7 tions service of a serving carrier under an agreement to serve the cus-  
8 tomer outside the home service provider's licensed service area;

9 (5) "customer channel termination point" means the location where  
10 the customer either inputs or receives the communication;

11 (6) "end user" means the person who utilizes the telecommunication  
12 service. In the case of an entity, end user means the individual who utilizes  
13 the services on behalf of the entity;

14 (7) "home service provider" means the same as that term in defined  
15 in section 124(5) of Public Law 106-252 (mobile telecommunications  
16 sourcing act);

17 (8) "mobile telecommunications service" means the same as that  
18 term is defined in section 124(5) of Public Law 106-252 (mobile telecom-  
19 munications sourcing act);

20 (9) "place of primary use" means the street address representative of  
21 where the customer's use of the telecommunications service primarily  
22 occurs, which must be the residential street address or the primary busi-  
23 ness street address of the customer. In the case of mobile telecommu-  
24 nications services, place of primary use must be within the licensed serv-  
25 ice area of the home service provider;

26 (10) "post-paid calling service" means the telecommunications serv-  
27 ice obtained by making a payment on a call-by-call basis either through  
28 the use of a credit card or payment mechanism such as a bank card, travel  
29 card, credit card or debit card, or by charge made to which a telephone  
30 number which is not associated with the origination or termination of the  
31 telecommunications service. A post-paid calling service includes a tele-  
32 communications service that would be a prepaid calling service except it  
33 is not exclusively a telecommunication service;

34 (11) "prepaid calling service" means the right to access exclusively  
35 telecommunications services, which must be paid for in advance and  
36 which enables the origination of calls using an access number or author-  
37 ization code, whether manually or electronically dialed, and that is sold  
38 in predetermined units or dollars of which the number declines with use  
39 in a known amount;

40 (12) "private communication service" means a telecommunication  
41 service that entitles the customer to exclusive or priority use of a com-  
42 munications channel or group of channels between or among termination  
43 points, regardless of the manner in which such channel or channels are



1 connected, and includes switching capacity, extension lines, stations and  
2 any other associated services that are provided in connection with the use  
3 of such channel or channels; and

4 (13) “service address” means: (A) The location of the telecommuni-  
5 cations equipment to which a customer’s call is charged and from which  
6 the call originates or terminates, regardless of where the call is billed or  
7 paid;

8 (B) if the location in subsection (13)(A) is not known, service address  
9 means the origination point of the signal of the telecommunications serv-  
10 ices first identified by either the seller’s telecommunications system or in  
11 information received by the seller from its service provider, where the  
12 system used to transport such signals is not that of the seller; and

13 (C) if the location in subsections (13)(A) and (13)(B) are not known,  
14 the service address means the location of the customer’s place of primary  
15 use.

16 New Sec. 20. (a) A seller is allowed a deduction from taxable sales  
17 for bad debts attributable to taxable sales of such seller that have become  
18 uncollectable. Any deduction taken that is attributed to bad debts shall  
19 not include interest.

20 (b) The amount of the bad debt deduction shall be calculated pur-  
21 suant to 26 U.S.C. § 166(b), except that such amount shall be adjusted  
22 to exclude financing charges or interest, sales or use taxes charged on the  
23 purchase price, uncollectable amounts on property that remain in the  
24 possession of the seller until the full purchase price is paid and expenses

27 which the bad debt is written off as uncollectable in the seller’s books  
28 and records and is eligible to be deducted for federal income tax purposes.  
29 For purposes of this subsection, a seller who is not required to file federal  
30 income tax returns may deduct a bad debt on a return filed for the period  
31 in which the bad debt is written off as uncollectable in the seller’s books  
32 and records and would be eligible for a bad debt deduction for federal  
33 income tax purposes if the seller was required to file a federal income tax  
34 return.

35 (d) If a deduction is taken for a bad debt and the debt is subsequently  
36 collected in whole or in part, the tax on the amount so collected must be  
37 paid and reported on the return filed for the period in which the collec-  
38 tion is made.

39 (e) When the amount of bad debt exceeds the amount of taxable sales  
40 for the period during which the bad debt is written off, a refund claim  
41 may be filed by the seller within the applicable statute of limitations for  
42 refund claim pursuant to subsection (b) of K.S.A. 79-3609 and amend-  
43 ments thereto; however, the statute of limitations shall be measured from

1 the due date of the return on which the bad debt could first be claimed.  
2 (f) Where filing responsibilities have been assumed by a certified  
3 service provider, the service provider may claim, on behalf of the seller,  
4 any bad debt allowance provided by this section. The certified service  
5 provider must credit or refund the full amount of any bad debt allowance  
6 or refund received to the seller.

7 (g) For the purposes of reporting a payment received on a previously  
8 claimed bad debt, any payments made on a debt or account must first be  
9 applied proportionally to the taxable price of the property or service and  
10 the sales tax thereon, and secondly to interest, service charges and any  
11 other charges.

12 (h) In situations where the books and records of the seller, or certified  
13 service provider on behalf of the seller, claiming the bad debt allowance  
14 support an allocation of the bad debts among the member states, such  
15 an allocation is permitted.

16 New Sec. 21. (a) The purpose of this section is to set forth this state's  
17 policy for the protection of the confidentiality rights of all participants in  
18 the system and of the privacy interests of consumers who deal with model  
19 1 sellers.

20 (b) As used in this section: (1) "Confidential taxpayer information"  
21 means all information that is protected under this state's laws, rules and  
22 regulations and privileges;

23 (2) "personally identifiable information" means information that  
24 identifies a person; and

25 (3) "anonymous data" means information that does not identify a  
26 person.

27 (c) A fundamental precept in model 1 is to preserve the privacy of  
28 consumers by protecting their anonymity. With very limited exceptions,  
29 a certified service provider (CSP) shall perform its tax calculation, remit-  
30 tance and reporting functions without retaining the personally identifiable  
31 information of consumers.

32 (d) The secretary shall provide public notification to consumers, in-  
33 cluding their exempt purchasers, of the department's practices relating  
34 to the collection, use and retention of personally identifiable information.

35 (e) When any personally identifiable information that has been col-  
36 lected and retained is no longer required to ensure the validity of ex-  
37 emptions from taxation that are claimed by reason of a consumer's status  
38 or the intended use of the goods or services purchased, such information  
39 shall no longer be retained by the department.

40 (f) When personally identifiable information regarding an individual  
41 is retained by or on behalf of the department, the secretary shall provide  
42 reasonable access by such individual to such individual's own information  
43 in the department's possession and a right to correct any inaccurately

1 recorded information.

2 (g) If anyone other than this state, or a person authorized by this  
3 state's law or the agreement, seeks to discover personally identifiable  
4 information, the secretary shall make a reasonable and timely effort to  
5 notify the individual of such request.

6 (h) This privacy policy is subject to enforcement by the attorney  
7 general.

8 New Sec. 22. (a) When the seller is computing the amount of tax  
9 owed by the purchaser and remitted to the state: (1) Tax computation  
10 must be carried to the third decimal place; and

11 (2) the tax must be rounded to a whole cent using a method that  
12 rounds up to the next cent whenever the third decimal place is greater  
13 than four.

14 (b) Sellers may elect to compute the tax due on a transaction on an  
15 item or an invoice basis. The rounding rule may be applied to the aggre-  
16 gated state and local taxes.

17 New Sec. 23. (a) The secretary shall complete a taxability matrix.  
18 This state's entries in the matrix shall be provided and maintained by the  
19 secretary in a database that is in a downloadable format.

20 (b) The secretary shall provide reasonable notice of changes in the  
21 taxability of the products or services listed in the taxability matrix.

22 (c) Sellers and certified service providers are relieved from liability  
23 to this state or any local taxing jurisdiction for having charged and col-  
24 lected the incorrect amount of state or local sales or use tax resulting from  
25 the seller or certified service providers relying on erroneous data provided  
26 by the secretary in the taxability matrix.

27 New Sec. 24. The effective date of state or local sales or use tax rate  
28 changes for services covering a period starting before and ending after  
29 the statutory effective date shall be as follows: (a) For a rate increase, the  
30 new rate shall apply to the first billing period starting on or after the  
31 effective date; and

32 (b) for a rate decrease, the new rate shall apply to bills rendered on  
33 or after the effective date.

34 New Sec. 25. (a) The secretary shall participate in an online regis-  
35 tration system that will allow sellers to register in this state and other  
36 member states.

37 (b) By registering, the seller agrees to collect and remit sales and use  
38 taxes for all taxable sales into this state as well as the other member states,  
39 including member states joining after the seller's registration. Withdrawal  
40 or revocation of this state from the agreement shall not relieve a seller of  
41 its responsibility to remit taxes previously or subsequently collected on  
42 behalf of this state.

43 (c) If the seller has a requirement to register prior to registering un-

1 der the agreement, the seller must register pursuant to K.S.A. 79-3608  
2 and amendments thereto.

3 (d) Registration with the central registration system and the collec-  
4 tion of sales and use taxes in this state shall not be used as a factor in  
5 determining whether the seller has nexus with this state for any tax at any  
6 time.

7 New Sec. 26. (a) Subject to the limitations in this section: (1) Am-  
8 nesty is granted for uncollected or unpaid sales or use tax to a seller who  
9 registers to pay or to collect and remit applicable sales or use tax on sales  
10 made to purchasers in this state in accordance with the terms of the  
11 agreement, provided that the seller was not so registered in this state in  
12 the twelve-month period preceding the effective date of this state's partic-  
13 ipation in the agreement;

14 (2) the amnesty will preclude assessment for uncollected or unpaid

25 (c) The amnesty is not available for sales or use taxes already paid or  
26 remitted to this state or to taxes collected by the seller.

27 (d) The amnesty is fully effective, absent the seller's fraud or inten-  
28 tional misrepresentation of a material fact, as long as the seller continues  
29 registration and continues payment or collection and remittance of ap-  
30 plicable sales or use taxes for a period of at least thirty-six months. The  
31 statute of limitations applicable to asserting a tax liability during this  
32 thirty-six month period is tolled.

33 (e) The amnesty is applicable only to sales or use taxes due from a  
34 seller in its capacity as a seller and not to sales or use taxes due from a  
35 seller in its capacity as a buyer.

36 (f) This provision shall become effective as of the date that this state  
37 joins and becomes a member state of the agreement.

38 New Sec. 27. When registering under the agreement, the seller may

11 rest area, dock, wharf, lake or river port, airport, railroad, light rail or  
12 other mass transit facility and ~~any similar or related project~~ or **any other**  
13 **transportation related project or** infrastructure.

14 (k) “Local sales transportation district tax” means the tax authorized  
15 by section 34, and amendments thereto.

16 (l) “To improve” means to construct, reconstruct, maintain, restore,  
17 replace, renew, repair, install, furnish, equip or extend any project.

18 New Sec. 31. (a) In addition to any other power provided by law and  
19 as a complete alternative to all other methods provided by law, the gov-  
20 erning body of any municipality may create a transportation development  
21 district as provided by this act for the purpose of financing projects. A  
22 municipality may create a district upon receipt of a petition signed by the
