## SENATE BILL No. 68

AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; [concerning distinctive license plates;] providing for the helping schools license plate; [providing for the drive for the cure license plate;] [providing for the Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, license plate;] [providing for the masonic lodge license plate;] amending K.S.A. 81,141 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
New Section 1. (a) Any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one helping schools license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and the presentation of the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).
(b) The state board of education may authorize the use of the logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any royalty payment received pursuant to this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the helping schools license plate program fund. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to the state board of education for the use of such logo. Upon annual application and payment to the board in an amount of $\$ 50$ [ $\$ 30$ ] as a logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued, the board shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement, which shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration.
(c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may
make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plates shall provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b). Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director. The school district to receive the royalty payment shall be designated by the applicant on such forms.
(d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be transferable to any other person.
(e) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant provides the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b). If such logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of registration, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's residence.
(f) The state board of education shall:
(1) Pay [pay] the initial cost of silk-screening for license plates authorized by this section; and
(2) provide to all eounty treasurers a toll-free telephone number where applieants ean call the state beard of edtueation for information eoneerning the applieation process or the status of their lieense plate applieatiom.
(g) The state board of education, with the approval of the director of vehicles and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.

New Sec. 2. (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury, the helping schools license plate program fund. All moneys credited to the helping schools license plate fund, except for an amount for reasonable costs to administer the helping schools license plate program provide under section 1 , and amendments thereto, shall be allocated and distributed annually on or after July 1 of each year to the school districts designated by the applicants under section 1 , and amendments thereto. Such money allocated and distributed to the school districts shall be used for the purchase of classroom supplies and equipment in grades K through 12 of the public schools of the school district. No moneys shall be distributed under the provisions of this section until the provisions of subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-1,141, and amendments thereto, have been satisfied. All expenditures from the helping schools license plate program fund
shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts, upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state board of education or the state board's designee.
(b) Moneys allocated and distributed under subsection (a), shall be deemed a donation under K.S.A. 72-8210, and amendments thereto.
[New Sec. 3. (a) On and after January 1, 2004, any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight of $\mathbf{2 0 , 0 0 0}$ pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one drive for the cure license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and the presentation of the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).
[(b) The secretary of health and environment may authorize the use of the logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any royalty payment received pursuant to this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the breast and cervical cancer treatment program fund. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to the secretary for the use of such logo. Upon annual application and payment to the secretary in an amount of $\$ 50$ as a logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued, the secretary shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement, which shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration.
[(c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plates shall provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b). Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.
[(d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be transferable to any other person.
[(e) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made
annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant provides the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b). If such logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of registration, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8143 , and amendments thereto, and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's residence.
[(f) The secretary of health and environment shall:
[(1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening for license plates authorized by this section; and
[(2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number where applicants can call the secretary of health and environment for information concerning the application process or the status of their license plate application.
[(g) The secretary of health and environment, with the approval of the director of vehicles and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.]
[New Sec. 4. (a) On and after January 1, 2004, any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight of $\mathbf{2 0 , 0 0 0}$ pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and the presentation of the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).
[(b) The Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, may authorize the use of their logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any royalty payment received pursuant to this section shall be paid to the Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, and shall be used to support the Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, endowment fund. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to the Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, for the use of such logo. Upon annual application and payment to the Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, in an amount of $\mathbf{\$ 1 0}$ as a logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued, the Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further
charge, a logo use authorization statement, which shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration.
[(c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plates shall provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b). Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.
[(d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be transferable to any other person.
[(e) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant provides the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b). If such logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of registration, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8143 , and amendments thereto, and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's residence.
[(f) The Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, shall:
[(1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening for license plates authorized by this section; and
[(2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number where applicants can call the Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, for information concerning the application process or the status of their license plate application.
[(g) The Topeka Lutheran school of Topeka, Kansas, with the approval of the director of vehicles and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.]
[New Sec. 5. (a) On and after January 1, 2004, any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight of $\mathbf{2 0 , 0 0 0}$ pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one masonic lodge license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper registration and payment of the
regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and the presentation of the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).
[(b) The masonic grande lodge of Kansas may authorize the use of their logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any royalty payment received pursuant to this section shall be paid to the masonic grande lodge of Kansas and shall be used to support the grande lodge of Kansas endowment fund. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to the masonic grande lodge of Kansas for the use of such logo. Upon annual application and payment to the masonic grande lodge of Kansas in an amount of $\$ 10$ as a logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued, the masonic grande lodge of Kansas shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement, which shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration.
[(c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plates shall provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b). Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.
[(d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be transferable to any other person.
[(e) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant provides the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b). If such logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of registration, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8143 , and amendments thereto, and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's residence.
[(f) The masonic grande lodge of Kansas shall:
[(1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening for license plates authorized by this section; and
[(2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number where applicants can call the masonic grande lodge of Kansas
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for information concerning the application process or the status of their license plate application.
[(g) The masonic grande lodge of Kansas, with the approval of the director of vehicles and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.]

Sec. 子. [6.] K.S.A. 8-1,141 is hereby amended to read as follows: 81,141. (a) Any new distinctive license plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1994, shall be subject to the personalized license plate fee prescribed by subsection (c) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments thereto. This section shall not apply to any distinctive license plate authorized prior to July 1, 1994.
(b) The director of vehicles shall not issue any new distinctive license plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1995, unless there is a guarantee of an initial issuance of at least 500 license plates.
(c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to distinctive license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,145, and amendments thereto.
(d) The provisions of subsection (a), shall not apply to distinctive license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,146 or 8-1,148, and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 8-1,148 section 1, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 4. [7.] K.S.A. 8-1,141 is hereby repealed.
Sec. $\overline{5 .}$ [8.] This act shall take effect and be in force from and after January $\overline{1}, 2004$, and its publication in the statute book.
