9 AN ACT concerning municipalities; pertaining to using the internet for 10 official publications; amending K.S.A. 12-1651 and K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 11 64-101 and repealing the existing sections. 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14 Section 1. K.S.A. 12-1651 is hereby amended to read as follows: 12-151651. (a) The governing body of each city of the second and third class 16 shall designate by resolution a newspaper or internet web site to be the 17official eity newspaper publication source for such city. Once designated 18the newspaper or internet web site shall be the official city newspaper 19 publication source for such city until such time as the governing body 20 designates a different newspaper or internet web site. 21 (b) The If a newspaper is selected for the official publications of cities 22 as the official publication source for a city of the second and third class such newspaper shall be one which has have the following qualifications: 2324(1) It Such newspaper must be published at least weekly 50 times 25each year and have been so published for at least one year prior to the publication of any official city publication. 26 27It Such newspaper must be entered at the post office of publi-(2)28cation as second-class mail matter. 29(3)More than 50% of the circulation of such newspaper must be sold 30 to the subscribers either on a daily, weekly, monthly or yearly basis. 31 It Such newspaper shall have general paid circulation on a daily, (4)32 weekly, monthly or yearly basis in the county and shall not be a trade, 33 religious or fraternal publication. 34 If an internet web site is selected as the official publication source (c)35 for a city of the second or third class, such internet web site shall have 36 the following qualifications: 37 Such internet web site shall not be password protected; (1)38 (2)such internet web site shall be accessible to members of the general 39 public; and no fee shall be associated with or charged for access to such in-40(3)41 ternet web site. 42 The publication of a city legal notice, advertisement, ordinance or (d)43 resolution pursuant to the provisions of this act shall comply with any

(e) For the purposes of this section, "internet" means the international
network of interconnected government, educational and commercial computer networks.

8 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 64-101 is hereby amended to read as fol-9 lows: 64-101. (a) The governing body of each city of the first class shall 10 designate by resolution a newspaper *or internet web site* to be the official 11 city newspaper *publication source for such city*. Once designated, the 12 newspaper *or internet web site* shall be the official city newspaper *pub-*13 *lication source for such city* until such time as the governing body des-14 ignates a different newspaper *or internet web site*.

No legal notice, advertisement or publication of any kind required or provided by any of the laws of the state of Kansas, to be published in a newspaper shall have any force or effect unless the same is published in a newspaper which the official publication source for such city.

19 (b) If a newspaper is selected as the official publication source for 20 such city of the first class, such newspaper shall have the following 21 qualifications:

(1) Is Such newspaper shall be published at least weekly 50 times a
year and has been so published for at least one year prior to the publication of any official city publication;

25 (2) *such newspaper* is entered at the post office as periodical class 26 mail matter;

(3) such newspaper has general paid circulation on a daily, weekly,
monthly or yearly basis in the county in which the city is located and is
not a trade, religious or fraternal publication; and

(4) is such newspaper shall be published in the county in which the
city publishing the official publication is located. If there is no newspaper
published in the county, the newspaper shall be published in Kansas and
shall have general paid circulation in the county.

(c) If an internet web site is selected as the official publication source
for a city of the first class, such internet web site shall have the following
qualifications:

37 (1) Such internet web site shall not be password protected;

38 (2) such internet web site shall be accessible to members of the general
 39 public; and

40 (3) no fee shall be associated with or charged for access to such in-41 ternet web site.

42 (d) The publication of a city legal notice, advertisement, ordinance or 43 resolution pursuant to the provisions of this act shall comply with any

statutory requirement for the official publication of such city legal notice, 1 advertisement, ordinance or resolution as may be required by law, in-2 3 cluding any requirement for the publication of such city legal notice, ad-4 vertisement, ordinance or resolution in the official city newspaper.

(b) (e) The board of county commissioners of each county shall des-56 ignate by resolution a newspaper or internet web site to be the official 7 county newspaper publication source for such county. Once designated the newspaper or internet web site shall be the official county newspaper 8 9 publication source for such county until such time as the board designates 10 a different newspaper or internet web site. The newspaper selected for the official publications of a county shall be a newspaper which 11

(f) If a newspaper is selected as the official publication source for such 12 13 county, such newspaper shall have the following qualifications:

14 (1) Is Such newspaper shall be published at least weekly 50 times 15each year and has been so published for at least one year prior to the 16 publication of any official county publication;

(2) such newspaper is entered at the post office in the county of 1718publication as periodical class mail matter, which county shall be located 19 in Kansas;

20(3)such newspaper has general paid circulation on a daily, weekly, 21 monthly or yearly basis in the county and is not a trade, religious or 22 fraternal publication; and

(4) such newspaper is published in the county publishing the official 23 24publication. If there is no newspaper published in the county, the news-25paper shall be printed in Kansas and have general paid circulation in the 26 county.

27(g) If an internet web site is selected as the official publication source 28for a county, such internet web site shall have the following qualifications: 29(1)Such internet web site shall not be password protected;

(2)

30 such internet web site shall be accessible to members of the general 31 public; and

32 no fee shall be associated with or charged for access to such in-(3)33 ternet web site.

34 (h)The publication of a county legal notice, advertisement, ordinance 35 or resolution pursuant to the provisions of this act shall comply with any 36 statutory requirement for the official publication of such county legal notice, advertisement, ordinance or resolution as may be required by law, 37

including any requirement for the publication of such county legal notice, 38

39 advertisement, ordinance or resolution in the official county newspaper.

40(e)(i) Whenever the board of education of a school district is required 41 to publish a legal notice, advertisement or other publication in a news-

42 paper having general circulation in the school district, such newspaper shall be one which: 43

1 (1) Is published at least weekly 50 times each year and has been so 2 published for at least one year prior to the publication of any school 3 district publication;

4 (2) is entered at the post office in the school district of publication 5 as periodical class mail matter;

6 (3) has general paid circulation on a daily, weekly, monthly or yearly 7 basis in the school district and is not a trade, religious or fraternal pub-8 lication; and

9 (4) is published in the school district publishing the official publica-10 tion. If there is no newspaper published in the school district, the news-11 paper shall be published in Kansas and shall have general paid circulation 12 in the school district.

13 (d) (*j*) Nothing contained in this section shall invalidate the publica-14 tion in a newspaper which has resumed publication after having sus-15pended publication all or part of the time that the United States has been engaged in war with any foreign nation and six months next following the 16 cessation of hostilities if such newspaper resumes publication in good faith 17under the same ownership as it had when it suspended publication. Noth-18 19 ing in this section shall invalidate the publication in a newspaper which 20has simply changed its name or moved its place of publication from one 21part of the county to another part, or suspended publication on account 22 of fire, flood, strikes, shortages of materials or other unavoidable accidents 23for not to exceed 10 weeks within the year last preceding the first pub-24lication of the legal notice, advertisement or publication. All legal 25publications heretofore made which otherwise would be valid, that have 26 been made in a newspaper which, on account of flood, fire, strikes, short-27 ages of materials or other unavoidable accident, has suspended publication for a period of not exceeding 10 weeks, are hereby legalized. 28

(k) For the purposes of this section, "internet" means the international
 network of interconnected government, educational and commercial com puter networks.
